According to Jerry Large of the Seattle Times, a new survey finds American

political values keep moving further apart.

For example:

- 61% of Republicans believe the country is successful because of its ability to adhere to long standing principles. 68% of Democrats believe the country is successful because of its ability to change.
- 71% of Democrats say the government should do more to help needy people. Only 25% of Republicans agree.
- A majority of Democrats believe that racial discrimination is the main reason black people can't get ahead. Only 14% of Republicans agree.

According to previous Pew surveys, Democrats and Republicans used to have more shared positions. Large concludes that we have to fight our way through this deep divide and relearn that compromise is more important than winning. I agree.

CAN WE TALK? AN EXPERIMENT IN CIVIL DISCOURSE

Focus: Immigration & Refugees

Our nation is deeply divided politically. Family members have stopped speaking over political differences. Our tradition offers a creative alternative path. The Jewish model of machloket l'shem shamayim/an argument for the sake of heaven is a way for people to disagree passionately in an atmosphere of mutual respect. In this series, we aim to apply this ancient Jewish method to the current American political divide. Through personal storytelling, role playing exercises, and in depth analysis of Jewish texts, we will be exploring the key Jewish and American ethical values that underlie the full range of political positions on the issues of immigration and refugees.

Among the questions we will consider:

- How do our own personal stories shape the way we see the world morally?
- When is crossing boundaries a Jewish value? What moral boundaries are sacrosanct to us? And when are boundary drawing/crossing relevant to the issues of immigrants and refugees?
- Do we see our encounter with the non-Jewish world as a source of enrichment or danger?

A MESSAGE FROM DIRECTOR OF EDUCATION, DR. ELIYAHU KRIGEL, CJE



A D'VAR

*"Inner mindfulness: how does one attain it? Any prayer for which one is not fully mindful is not considered prayer."
-Mishneh Torah, Prayer and the Priestly Blessing 4:15*

The prayers we teach at FRS are centered on the Shabbat liturgy. Our objective in teaching prayers is to help our students develop an inner mindfulness related to the specific prayer they are utilizing. The quote above from the Mishneh Torah emphasizes the critical importance of being mindful and aware of the words we recite when engaged in Jewish liturgical practices. If we are not mindful when we pray, then why pray at all? We always want our FRS students and parents to know what they are saying when in the act of prayer.

Practically speaking, we do this at FRS by teaching the meaning, history, choreography, and placement of the prayer in the overall service so our students can walk into any shul in the world and know what is occurring both on a ritual and spiritual level. If we don't know the mechanics of the prayers and the Hebrew is causing us challenges, the prayers on this Wiki site below can help support the learning process.

May the prayers we all recite with kavanah (intention) bring us to a mindful and conscious place of relationship with something more than ourselves!
