

A MESSAGE FROM RABBI ROSENBAUM



Chanukah People

There is a Talmudic argument about the proper way to light Chanukah candles. The decision was to light one candle on the first night and add a candle each night. Why?

Maalin ba'kodesh, we increase in sanctity, not decrease. Translate this into the language of Positive Psychology, and we read: "We build on our strengths. If we want to improve ourselves and the world, instead of asking what's wrong with us that needs fixing, ask: what's right with us that we can build on?"

Maybe that's why when we prepare the Chanukiyah, we put in the candles from left to right, starting with the oldest candle and building up to the newest. Each candle adds light to existing light. When we light the candles, we start with the newest candle and then go backwards. In this way, we acknowledge that the light of our own soul is rooted in the beauty created by previous souls.

Chanukah itself is a source of strength. It's a reminder to us of the courage and faith that already exists within the Jewish people. Each of us is that little jar of oil that contains within it more wisdom, love and bravery than we give ourselves credit for.

Chanukah reminds us to look around at the people around us and ask whether we have underestimated the light they contain, the way that first jar of oil was misjudged.

When we get discouraged, Chanukah comes to lift us. No matter what the circumstances of the world or our lives, don't give up! We are Chanukah people! And, we contain within us the miracle of a light that outperforms all expectations.

Janine, David, Miri, Daniella, Shani and I wish all of our friends at HNT a Chanukah of light and joy.

Friends often compare her to the Energizer Bunny, because when it comes to

doing things for others, Audrey Covner just keeps going and going and going...

Since coming to the Northwest in 2001, Audrey has been generous – with both her time and money – to Herzl-Ner Tamid and other non-profit groups in our community. Audrey served as HNT's President from 2010 - 2012. As president, Audrey always tried to ensure that the voices of all congregants were heard. During her stints on the bima, Audrey presented what you might call a "relaxed" demeanor: smiling and waving to congregants, shaking hands and welcoming everyone, and we certainly never had problems hearing her announce the Torah portions from the pulpit.

A number of years ago, Audrey created the first Legacy Brunch, an HNT fundraiser designed to foster a warm community atmosphere. While she clearly understands the need to raise funds to maintain HNT's operations, Audrey strongly believes these annual events should also serve as a solidifying force for our congregants to connect with each other and see how much good work HNT does all year long. Community is important to Audrey, her spouse, Dianne Dougherty, and their two kids, Claire and Michaela. Both daughters worked in the HNT religious school, served as Torah tutors, and often read Torah and Haftorah for services. Michaela continues her involvement serving as HNT's USY advisor.

Audrey spends a lot of time at HNT. She's a regular at services, including morning minyan. She fondly remembers that her childhood synagogue felt like a "home" and she hopes her children and other young people will feel that way about HNT. Audrey believes a synagogue is not only a place for prayer, but a place for community, mitzvot, socializing, and finding ways to incorporate Jewish values into our lives.

While much of what Audrey does for HNT is done behind the scenes, such as leading the team creating a strategic plan for our future and fundraising, her focus is always aimed at ensuring HNT continues to be a strong congregation that will be there for her kids and kids of the next generation.

Audrey was born in Brooklyn, NY, but moved to California when she was very young. Audrey lived in Israel for a year in the 1970s working as a nurse in Hadassah Hospital in Jerusalem. Following her return to California, she worked as a nurse while attending law school at night. Using both her nursing and law degrees, Audrey has worked to support her many non-profit volunteer activities.

Active in the gay rights and AIDS/HIV rights movements for more than 15 years, Audrey assisted in writing and lobbying for many antidiscrimination laws, ultimately being awarded recognition by the ACLU of California for her efforts. Audrey also created and served as the lead attorney for a pro bono legal panel providing free legal services to people with AIDS/HIV.

Speaking to HNT's 7th graders recently, Audrey shared her passion for tzedakah. She explained how she and Dianne both grew up in loving families who did not enjoy economic stability. With this in mind, they have always striven to ensure their children understand that everyone is not as fortunate as they are and we all need to give back in this world.

Giving to others has been a strong value in their household. One example: their tradition for Chanukah is four nights of giving and four nights of getting – ensuring that half the nights are celebrated by donating to others.

Audrey and Dianne have been together since 1984 and were married by Rabbi Rosenbaum in 2013, after the state of Washington legalized gay marriage. While being a non-traditional family has not always been easy in many Jewish environments, Audrey and Dianne feel so blessed to be part of the HNT community where they have always felt welcome and connected.

Once again this year, Audrey and Dianne are providing financial support to the Legacy Brunch by helping to underwrite the event with an extremely generous donation. Please join us in honoring Audrey and sharing the community that makes HNT so special on Sunday, February 11.

Refugee Families - Setting Up Households for New Refugee Families

The impact of our extended HNT family continues to grow as we have reached outward and inward to provide 20 complete households for refugee families coming to our area - DOUBLE our initial goal! Our volunteer leaders, HNT staff and JFS counterparts have been overwhelmed by the response. We look forward to thanking everyone involved when we have a full listing printed in the January HaKol.

Leschi Elementary School - Helping At-Risk Children

The staff and community at Leschi Elementary continue to be blown away by our community's generosity and willingness to pitch in wherever help is needed. Thanks to a generous donation from Ricki & Neal Gafter, we will be providing fresh fruit for all children needing a snack for the next 2+ years. This is a need not regularly met by school lunch programs.

Thanks to another generous donation from Susan & Lonnie Edelheit, we are providing incentives for good attendance amongst students in need for whom getting to school on time is a challenge. These problems often stem from homelessness, so students must use unreliable transportation or travel greater distances to get to school. This program was piloted last year and cut the number of absences/tardies in half for affected students, ensuring that they made it to core subjects like math and reading in the morning.

A MESSAGE FROM DIRECTOR OF EDUCATION, DR. ELIYAHU KRIGEL, CJE



LISTENING TO ANOTHER HELPS US TELL OUR OWN STORY

"Ben Zoma said, who is wise? He or she who learns from all people. As it is said, from all my teachers have I received understanding." -Avot 4:1

When we take Ben Zoma's message quoted above to heart, we have the opportunity to learn from everyone we encounter. This sentiment rings true for the stories and narratives our teens are being exposed to on a profound level in the new Los Angeles class and trip series at HNT.

We crafted this innovative class and trip for teens based on American Jewish celebrity and Jewish identity formation as we recognize the importance and the need for our teens to regularly convene together to learn, bond, and grow.

Understanding and exploring how we tell our own story in the media out in public as well as individually or in private setting is a major component of the class. Each session of learning highlights a special guest presenter who tells their remarkable story.

Moumin Khan was our first presenter of the semester. He is part of an organization called WASAT, which is dedicated to creating a safe space for American Muslims to gather, share stories, and learn about Islam. Kahn's presentation helped our students to hear the Muslim narrative in a transparent and unique way.

We explored the following Muslim and Jewish concepts and then unpacked their relationship and connection: Hashem and Allah, Avraham and Ibrahim, Moses and Muhammad, Tefillah and Salat, Kosher and Halal, Halakha and Sharia, and Rabbi and Imam. Alyssa Hartnig from the Jewish National Fund also presented to the group this past semester regarding the Jewish story and narrative of settling in the Land of Israel. The guest presenters in our workshop series help our students actualize Ben Zoma's teaching from Avot in a relevant way.
