Our Honoree: Andi Neuwirth

2020 Recipient of the Bob Zimmerman Community Leadership Award



Most of us admire someone we know a little, observe from afar, or read about in the media; but it's a rare privilege to know a person well for a very long time and still be in awe of their strength of character, unique talents and commitment to doing good in our world. Knowing Andi Neuwirth for almost 20 years has provided a huge canvas to appreciate the

many ways she has served this community, this synagogue and her friends and family in ways all too often unsung. As a colleague of Bob Zimmerman for so many years, Andi not only benefited from his leadership and inspiration, but also ascribed to his example; believing in the importance of imparting Jewish learning and values, while maximizing the potential that lies within each student in a manner that conveys warmth and affirmation. Bob Z was a teacher's teacher & so too is Andi Neuwirth.

Working with children has taken Andi from New Jersey to Montreal and Aliyah to Israel, to Washington DC and Eastern Washington, and finally to the Seattle area where she began teaching and working in the religious school office (for 15 years). While in Israel, she helped start a school in Ra'anana for disabled children that still thrives today with over 300 students and worked in the Easter Seal school in the DC area. Today Andi continues her two decade-long teaching position in our school as well as tutoring special needs children and B'nai Mitzvah students.

In 2014 Andi was recognized with the Grinspoon Award for Excellence in Teaching. However, it's Andi the friend to all that most stands out for me. Very quietly, Andi epitomizes what it means to be 'present' for people. She is equally beloved by her daughter, Tali, as she is by her three step children, Isabelle, Katie and, Jeremiah. Andi is a proud grandparent, together with her very supportive husband John, of 10 grandchildren. As a couple, John and Andi have opened their home, even when they lived in a very small apartment, to anyone in need of a seder or a Shabbat meal; no prior acquaintance needed – there is always a place at their table. Rarely have I seen an occasion when they do not contribute to a cause with incredible generosity. John and Andi seem to continuously operate in a space of humility and gratitude.

Andi has shared that one of her greatest joys is interacting with students of HER former students, a true l'dor v'dor. I'm sure that her contagious optimism, sincere interest in her students' lives, and infinite compassion will help ensure that Bob Zimmerman's z"l legacy and her own will be imprinted upon the hearts of countless children and parents as well as those of us fortunate enough to call her our friend.

On Saturday night, February 8 we will gather for Havdalah, each of us holding a candle or a spice bag, joining our collective voices in a circle of appreciation for our Jewish home, HNT, where teachers like Bob Z and Andi Neuwirth inspire the best within us and pay it forward.

Please join together in song, prayer, and celebration of our community, linked by our traditions and care for one another.

A MESSAGE FROM INTERIM RABBI, RAV BARRY LEFF



In my November HaKol article, I talked about how Cheshvan, the Hebrew month that comes right after Tishrei, which is loaded with holidays from Rosh Hashanah to Simchat Torah, is the only month on our calendar that has no Jewish holidays at all.

Which is true – yet the month of Tevet, which this year roughly corresponds to January on

the secular calendar, is almost as bereft of holidays as Cheshvan. The only holiday this month is Asara b'Tevet, the Tenth of Tevet. I suspect the chances are pretty good that most readers of the HaKol may not have ever heard of the Tenth of Tevet – it's definitely one of our lesser known holidays, one of the "minor fast days."

The Tenth of Tevet this year falls on the 7th of January. It's a day when we traditionally fast from sunrise to sunset, in commemoration of the Babylonian king Nebuchadnezzar beginning a siege of Jerusalem in 588 BCE.

Many people nowadays feel somewhat ambivalent about these minor fast days. Now that we once again have an independent

state of Israel, shouldn't we be getting over mourning those past destructions?

Different rabbis have different opinions. I follow the position of Rabbi David Golinkin, one of the leading halachic authorities for the Conservative Movement in Israel, that nowadays the minor fast days, such as the Tenth of Tevet, can be considered optional – there's no halachic obligation to fast if you don't want to. It's an acknowledgement that even if we don't yet live in the days of the Messiah, when Israel and the world are living in peace and harmony, Jerusalem is no longer in ruins, and Israel is no longer under foreign domination.

Speaking of the days of the Messiah, I'll be leading a session at Seattle Limmud (January 18-19 at Bellevue College) on "Will the Real Messiah Please Stand Up? Jesus, Bar Kochba, Shabtai Tzvi, Ben Gurion, the Rebbe, and other Jewish Views of the Messiah." I'd love to see you there!

SENIOR RABBI SEARCH IN FULL SWING!

The search had kicked into high gear with seven applications received as of mid-December, and the potential for more into January. Applicants have spanned a range of experience, geographic locations and demographics, but a common theme in initial conversations with each of them has been their excitement for HNT's future and the joy our congregation exudes through HNT's synagogue profile posting and Promotional video: h-nt.org/2019video

Resumes are each reviewed by the full search committee and a team of three has screened each candidate to get to know them better and to assess if they are a potential fit for the senior rabbi position. The next step for successful candidates is a one-hour video interview with the full search committee. Candidates present a 5 minute D'var Torah, followed by 10-12 questions that cover many aspects of the life of a Senior Rabbi, including leadership and management, pastoral skills, program development, religious practice, Israel, civil discourse and more.

The committee will complete the video interview process and recommend finalist candidate(s) for visits with the full congregation. These visits are expected to take place in January, February and possibly March. Watch your email and HaKol for more information and dates to be announced. There will be multiple opportunities to meet finalist(s) and your participation in these visits and feedback provided are critical in determining who will serve as our next Senior Rabbi. The Search Committee will make a recommendation to the board, which is followed by a congregational vote.

Did you know that 80-90% of people say it's important to talk with loved ones and put their wishes about end-of-life care in writing – yet less than 30% have actually done so? Sounds familiar? If so, this workshop is for you.

Open to the HNT, JFS, and Kavana communities, Julie Katz, RN, and Julie Kohl, MD, will create space for conversation - over dinner! - about palliative and end of life care, helping you clarify what you want at the end of life. We will then discuss advance care planning, specifically walking you

through how to complete advance directive documents that are legally valid in Washington State. You will leave with the knowledge and materials needed to name a health care power of attorney and complete an advanced directive.

A Dvar

"You know the feelings of a stranger, for you were strangers in the land of Egypt."

-Exodus 23:9

Treating someone like they are a stranger is not a good feeling. Whether you were once a new student in class, a new player on the field, or a new person joining a group, feeling like a stranger

can be awkward and unsettling. Repeated in the Torah 36 times is the reminder that we collectively were once strangers long ago. The quote from Exodus above directs us all to bring more empathy into our lives so we can positively interact with people by showing support, compassion, and understanding. One way we are emphasizing this and including everyone at FRS is a new collaboration we have formed by starting a *No Place for Hate* campaign in our school community. Public signs of hate still occur and school is an important place to clearly set forth positive expectations. At FRS we want all our students to learn to stand up tall for the stranger and those in need of support.

No Place for Hate is an initiative through the ADL that promotes understanding and community building within schools in a way that supports all students. We stand up against bullying and intolerance at FRS. As we enter a new secular year together, join us in remembering the following principles to emphasize that FRS is a place where hate has no place:

- I will seek to gain understanding of those who are different from myself
- I will speak out against prejudice and discrimination
- I will reach out to support those who are targets of hate
- I will promote respect for people & help foster a prejudice-free school
- I believe that one person can make a difference. No person can be an innocent bystander when it comes to opposing hate
- I recognize that respecting individual dignity and promoting intergroup harmony are the responsibility of all students

Matti Friedman is a Canadian-Israeli journalist, author, and contributing opinion writer for The New York Times. He is a former correspondent for The Associated Press, and his work as a reporter has taken him from Israel to Lebanon, Morocco, Moscow, the Caucasus and Washington.

Friedman's 2016 book *Pumpkinflowers: A Soldier's Story of a Forgotten War* was chosen as a New York Times notable book and as one of Amazon's 10 best books of the year. It won the 2017 Vine Award for Canadian Jewish literature and was shortlisted for the 2017 RBC Taylor Prize, the Writer's Trust Prize, and the Yitzhak Sadeh Prize for military writing (Israel). His first book, *The Aleppo Codex*, an investigation into the strange fate of an ancient Bible manuscript, won the 2014 Sami Rohr Prize and the American Library Association's Sophie Brody Medal, and was translated into seven languages. His third book, *Spies of No Country*, about four Israeli agents in the 1948 war, has received the 2018 Natan Book Award.

Friedman, born in Toronto, has lived in Israel since 1995. He currently resides in Jerusalem with his family.
