A MESSAGE FROM INTERIM RABBI, RAV BARRY LEFF



February may be in the dead of winter, but we've got a lot going on at Herzl-Ner Tamid this month.

The Havdalah Happy Hour on February 8 is an opportunity to come out on a winter's night,

socialize with your HNT community and show your support for the synagogue at the same time. It's an early program, leaving plenty of time for dinner or other plans afterward. Whether or not you can join us for Havdalah Happy Hour, I hope you'll show your support for the synagogue with a Legacy Fundraiser contribution. It takes more than membership dues alone to provide all of the programs and services we have.

We also mark the holiday of Tu b'Shvat this month. Tu b'Shvat, the 15th of the Hebrew month of Shvat, usually falls in February. It was originally nothing more than the date that marked the fiscal year for tree taxes. It has since evolved into a Jewish Arbor Day, celebrating nature, and a day for environmental awareness. Tu b'Shvat begins Sunday night, February 9.

I also celebrate an unusual and personal holiday in the month of February – a "Personal Purim." There's a tradition that if you've been rescued from a disaster you can celebrate the anniversary of your rescue with a "Personal Purim." These can be individual or communal. For example, the Jews in Frankfurt, Germany, celebrate "Frankfurter Purim" on the 20th of Adar, only six days after regular Purim. The Jews had been kicked out of the city in 1616, and on that day two years later they were allowed to return. My personal Purim commemorates the anniversary of my evacuation from Iran on February 16, 1979. Since the Purim story we tell in the book of Esther took place in Iran, I find it especially fitting to mark the occasion by eating Persian food.

We're also busy getting ready for our communal Purim celebration, coming on Monday, March 9. We have a wonderful Disney-themed celebration planned. Dr. Eliyahu and a crew of volunteers have been hard at work writing songs and a script. Watch your email for more details.

A MESSAGE FROM DIRECTOR OF EDUCATION, DR. ELIYAHU KRIGEL, CJE



A D'var

"Ben Zoma would say: Who is wise? One who learns from every person."

- Pirkei Avot, Ethics of our Ancestors, 4:1

When we view our interactions and connections with people as deriving from a positive place, we have the potential to learn from each person. This is easier said than done but is a

worthwhile approach. Ben Zoma in the quote above reminds us of this optimistic perspective. First alluded to in Psalm 119, the view point we can learn from every person we meet, even if the encounter is negative or challenging on the outside, is a lofty and idealistic vision. This year the Masa class has worked hard to practice this philosophy and approach by learning about the Jewish connection to the Civil Rights Movement of the 1960's.

Each month we have had an interactive speaker present on a variety of topics related to the civil rights movement and the connection between the Jewish community and the African American experience. Our first presenter, Dr. Mark Jones, reminded us that everyone, no matter who they are, wants to be seen, heard, and loved. Elmer Dixon, one of the original founders of the Black Panthers in Seattle, spoke passionately about his visit with activist Stokely Carmichael and the origins of the Black Panthers. Mr. Dixon's inspiring presentation reminded us that the Black is Beautiful movement encouraged the Jews to stop changing their names and hiding their Jewishness after the black community modeled pride in their heritage. Ken Shulman, the executive director of Lambert House, spoke eloquently and candidly about LGBTQ+ issues and the many ways of making a change in this world. Jerry Calhoun talked about his important work in Seattle on wrongful imprisonment and restoration of justice. He pointed out that blacks are far more likely than whites to be convicted and to receive longer prison sentences for the same crimes. Our trip this month to Selma and Orlando will retrace Dr. King's historic civil rights march and reiterate the important perspective that every human being was created Btzelem Eloheim, in the image of the Divine.

When we arrive in Atlanta on our experiential trip, we will be met by Billy Planer from Etgar 36 who will serve as our tour guide and educator. Etgar 36 is an independent, pluralistic, nonpartisan, and nonprofit Jewish educational venture. On an Etgar 36 journey, students learn about the American history that has shaped us, the issues that confronts us, and how the political process impacts us. We have certainly learned from all of our presenters in a meaningful way. Thank you to Rabbi Jay Rosenbaum and to Rabbi Sarah Rensin for joining us on this journey. A special thanks to Gwenn and Dean Polik for generously supporting this program, and all the Masa students for your thoughtfulness throughout. Post B'nai Mitzvah education is strong at HNT!




