A Message from Guest Writer Linda Krisher

There is Hope in Meaningful Relationships

How often does one hear of a synagogue joining forces with an elementary school that has a predominately Black population? Now entering our fourth year, HNT can be very proud of the relationship that has been formed with the Leschi school community in Seattle.

Recent events of violence and unrest following the death of George Floyd only heightened our need to reach out to Leschi staff and families in hopes of lending additional support and unity. My personal communication with two staff members whom I have collaborated with these past three years, both from the Black community, has been extremely heartwarming. While expressing our shared grief and concern for their well-being, they both responded with sincere gratitude, knowing we cared so deeply.

As Rabbi Rosenbaum shared in his response to George Floyd's death, it is up to us to begin to "close the social and emotional distance between the Black and Jewish communities on a person to person basis." While HNT has played a significant role in providing financial assistance along with our fall backpack

and clothing drives, what has made the largest impact is the volunteering of nearly 30 tutors over the course of our involvement with the school. Our volunteers have created

positive relationships with the teachers they work with. They find the interaction with students to be rewarding and have expressed how privileged they feel to work with the students and staff at Leschi. Making the teachers' lives a little easier has also been a source of satisfaction. Now with the school being

closed due to COVID-19, many of our tutors have raised concerns about how the academic needs of the students will be met and how we can help. Yes, there is work to

be done and we will be ready when the school reopens.

The words Black Lives Matter are prominently written on the wall when entering the halls of Leschi. As I look forward to returning to the school, I know those words will carry new meaning to me and the relationships I hold with this school I call "home." May HNT and Leschi continue to work in harmony, knowing that even in this microcosm, we are doing our part person to person.

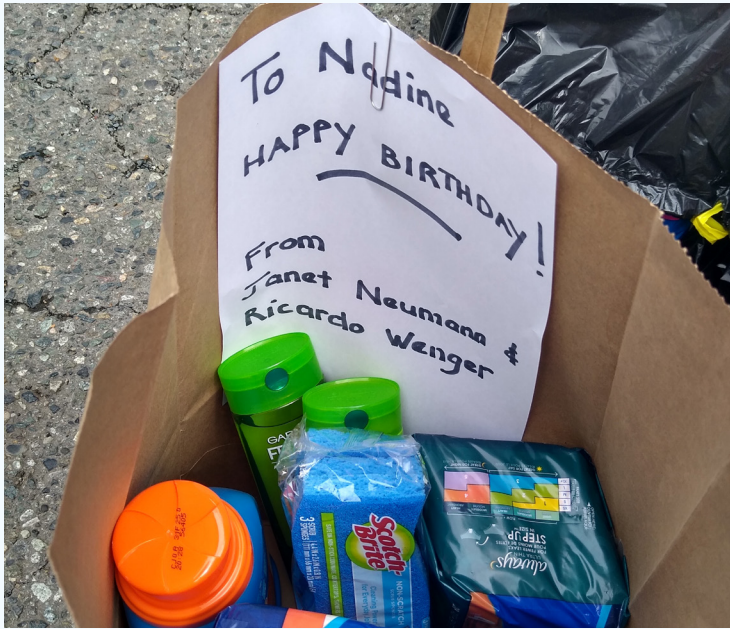
