A Message from Rabbi Jacob Herber



ratitude," Cicero once wrote, "is not only the Greatest of virtues, but the parent of all the others." This statement actually reflects a very Jewish sentiment. Gratitude is a core value of our tradition. Another core value, of course, is faith in God and that God is our creator. The natural endowments and blessings we received at birth aren't merely credited to us, but to the One who creates all. The gift of our intelligence is not just our doing. The physical prowess we may have been born with, endowed by another source. Our creativity, a blessing we received. We can choose to cultivate our gifts, or ignore them. We can use them for good, or for evil. Therein lies the measurement for a life well lived. But the existence of so many blessings in our lives can't be credited to us. This should all lead us to appreciation - to a sense of gratitude for our lives.

In his magnum opus, God in Search of Man, Rabbi Abraham Joshua Heschel argues that the principal characteristic of religious life is a sense of wonder. This perspective toward the world seeks to cultivate a way of seeing and relating to all of creation. It's wonder that broadens our awareness to include concerns beyond our selves. It pushes us to be attentive to the still, small voice of God asking us to enter into partnership for the betterment of the world. Wonder keeps alive our awareness of what Heschel refers to as "the great fellowship of all beings." Religious wonder asks that we

attempt to identify the blessings present in our own lives, despite the very real and difficult personal challenges that we all face in our world today. There is a direct relationship between the acknowledgment of God, the wonder of the created world, and the concept of gratitude.

So, gratitude is partially defined as the ability to say thank you to God and to others. It implicitly signifies our recognition that we're not at the center of the universe. It implies that we depend on each other and need each other's help, deepening our connections. Gratitude leads to humility, to compassion and to kindness. It leads to a sense of fulfillment, peace and happiness. As Cicero claimed, it is the parent of all virtues. A little thankfulness can, indeed, go a long way.

Gratitude also stands at the center of our great texts, like the Torah. Parashat Ki Tavo, for example, begins with the ceremony of the first fruits, which was to occur after the Israelites entered the land. As the Torah prescribes every Israelite farmer, upon presenting their first fruits, would recite a brief summary of the sacred history: focusing on the descent of the patriarchal family to Egypt, the suffering they endured there, the exodus of the nation, and their arrival into the land God gave them. The great Medieval scholar, Nahmanides, teaches that the farmer is giving gratitude to God with the

specific fruit he brings, acknowledging at that moment that God has blessed us not only with the fruit we are about to eat, but also the fulfillment of the promise that we will inherit the land of Israel. Gratitude is crystallized by the concrete offering of the fruit.

Our whole system of blessings is set up in similar fashion. We say a blessing in appreciation for all of the food we eat, fragrant smells we encounter, wondrous sights we see, wise people we meet. The list goes on. The pages of our prayer book are filled with praises, with thanks to God. "Tov Lehodot Lashem", the Psalmist says, "It is a privilege (good) to thank God." Because - even in the face of deeply challenging times – there is still For so much for which to be thankful! As Thanksgiving approaches

and Hanukkah, after that, when we sit with our loved ones to eat or to exchange gifts, let's take a little time, or maybe a lot, to thank God for what we have and to thank each other for being in our lives. Let's release all of the wonderful blessings a little gratitude can inspire. Happy Thanksgiving!

Regarding On-Site Bar/Bat Mitzvah Shabbat Morning Services

Dear Friends.

When the Coronavirus pandemic hit our community and nation in March with the first community spread in Kirkland our state and local governments responded by issuing stay-at-home orders. Businesses, offices, schools, and religious institutions were closed in order to prevent the spread of the virus and to protect the lives and health of Washingtonians. Our congregation supported these efforts because pikuah nefesh, saving human life is Judaism's highest mitzvah.

While the physical doors of our building closed, we remained open to you, providing you and your loved ones with care, concern, support, and moving our educational and religious services online to Zoom. We then made another major pivot when we livestreamed our High Holy Day services using a one-way broadcast platform. At every step, we have endeavored to keep you informed of our plans. That's why we are writing to you now. We want you to know that beginning in November we will be offering families the option to hold their Shabbat morning Bar or Bat Mitzvah on-site, in our sanctuary. With the the onset of inclement weather we recognize that holding their simhah at home becomes less of a viable option for our families. Livestreaming the service on the new platform in our sanctuary will also provide us with a more stable and higher quality broadcast. Families will also have the option to stream their Bar or Bat Mitzvah from the sanctuary as well as from their homes via Zoom. Regardless of their choice, our Friday night Kabbalat Shabbat services will continue to be broadcast on Zoom.

We also want to reiterate that the health and safety of our membership, clergy, staff, and guests remains paramount. Our re-opening for B'nei and B'not Mitzvah is and will continue to be guided by the State of Washington and King County's COVID-19 rules and regulations for religious institutions, and protocols adopted by our congregation's Board of Directors. Those attending services will be restricted to the Bar/Bat Mitzvah family and a very limited number of their guests. On-site services will not be open to the congregation at large. We will require wellness checks, the wearing of masks, and social distancing throughout the sanctuary, including on the bimah. We also want to assure you that the sanctuary and other areas of the building visited by those in attendance will be thoroughly cleaned and sanitized after each use.

No one yet knows when the pandemic will subside or when a vaccine will be available. And with COVID-19 infection rates on the rise, and medical experts warning of a substantial third wave there is a real possibility that Washington's Phase 2 re-opening will be rolled back or that new, restrictive rules will be issued, forcing us to put on hold or to suspend our onsite option for B'nei and B'not Mitzvah. Our commitment to being responsible stakeholders of our community, to doing our part to fight against the spread of the Coronavirus, and to protecting our congregation remains our highest priority. And, like you, we yearn for the day when we can again worship together, joyously and safely. We hope that day will come soon!

A Dvar

"More than the Jews have kept Shabbat, Shabbat has kept the Jews."

-Rabbi Jonathan Sachs

A s we all continue to live through these extraordinarily challenging and uncertain times due to Covid-19, the rhythm of Shabbat is an opportunity to anchor your experience each week in a peaceful place. Shabbat is a chance to press the pause button and slow down. While we continue to either work from home or manage our children and families at home, Shabbat offers a unique space to relate to time in a different way on a consistent basis. Repetition is critical to maintain Shabbat observance.

The quote above from Ahad Ha'am emphasizes the unifying purpose of Shabbat. Ahad Ha'am was the pen name of Asher Ginsberg (1856-1927). Ginsberg used the name Ahad Ha'am, or one of the people, from Genesis 26:10 to relate to all people. He was raised in a Hasidic family and was strongly influenced by modern philosophy and science. Known as a pivotal Zionist writer and leader, Ahad Ha'am is asserting the viewpoint in the quote above that Shabbat has kept the Jews together by focusing on the aspect of Shabbat that is bigger than any one person or family. Shabbat has kept the Jews because it's our way of taking care of ourselves and our community. When we put intention into the experience, Shabbat helps to provide perspective to our week.

Regardless of your observance level, there are many ways to bring Shabbat into your home each week. No judgement and start wherever you are ready. Begin small and stay consistent. Baby steps. Here are ten ideas to try at home with your kids:

- 1. Light candles and recite the Shabbat blessings.
- 2. Make challah at home.
- 3. Dress up in costumes and have a theme night.
- 4. Eat delicious food you wouldn't normally eat.
- 5. Play board games or work on a puzzle together.



- 6. Take a family walk or hike.
- 7. Create your own Shabbat experience.
