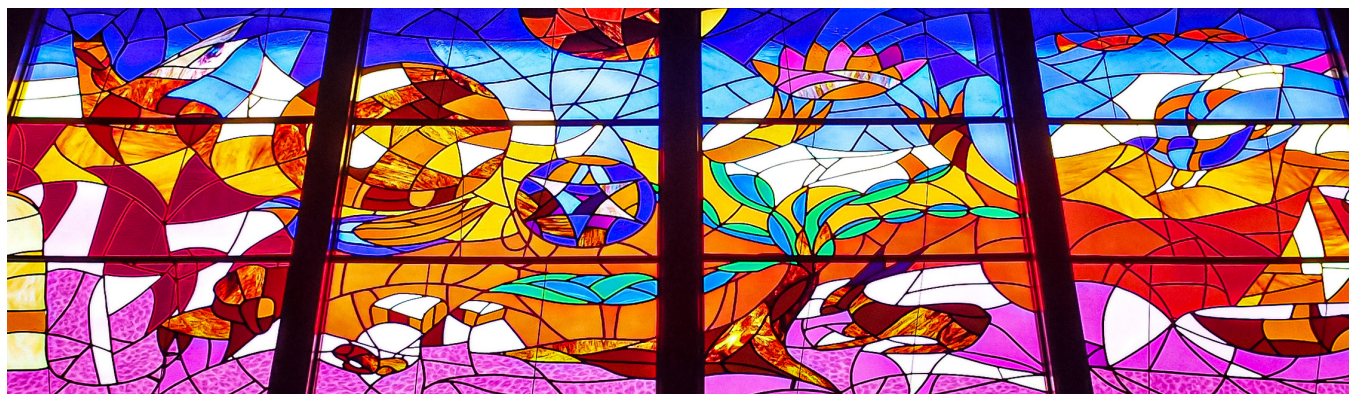

A Message from Rabbi Jacob Herber



Don't Rely on Miracles!

It's Hanukkah time! There is so much about this minor holiday that I love. Like lighting the Menorah and enjoying latkes and sufganiot. On the serious side, the story and symbols of Hanukkah truly inspire me to think about the desperate need for enlightenment in our world. And then, of course, there's the Talmudic account about the small cruse of oil that burned for eight days gets me thinking about miracles.

A miracle is an unexpected and welcome event that can't be explained by natural or scientific laws which is why it's attributed to God. Our tradition tells us that there are miracles that occur regularly and even predictably, like the birth of a baby or a breathtaking sunrise. There are also miracles that surprise us and seem to override the rules of nature, like the unexpected healing of a someone who is gravely ill. While the first type of miracle may seem routine or mundane, our tradition asks us to express gratitude regularly for such remarkable moments and to develop an appreciation for them. With equal conviction, Judaism teaches that we should never simply rely on a Divine miracle to save us or help us escape trouble or a crisis. Doing so is dangerous and foolish.

The Talmud (Tractate Pesachim 2a) makes this point explicitly: "Rav Judah said in Rav's name: One should always enter his lodgings when it is still light and leave on his journey when it is light." Another rabbinic source adds that such is the case even if one is serving as a shaliah mitzvah (someone who has embarked on doing a mitzvah): "Know that even for someone who is traveling on a matter connected with performing a mitzvah, about whom it is normally taught that they are safe from harm, it is still not advisable for them to travel at night." The message is clear. People should take steps to protect themselves and not presume that God will shield them from harm. In other words, don't rely on a miracle to keep yourself safe. Today we would say, "Wear a mask. Wash your hands. Socially distance."

The story of Hanukkah teaches the same point. The legend of the cruse of oil is charming, but the real history of Hanukkah reminds us that the Maccabees didn't wait for God to step-in and save them from oppression at the hand of the Antiohus and the Syrian-Greeks. They took matters into their own hands. Centuries later, we remember the heroism of the Maccabees, not the passivity of those who wait for a miracle to save them from destruction.

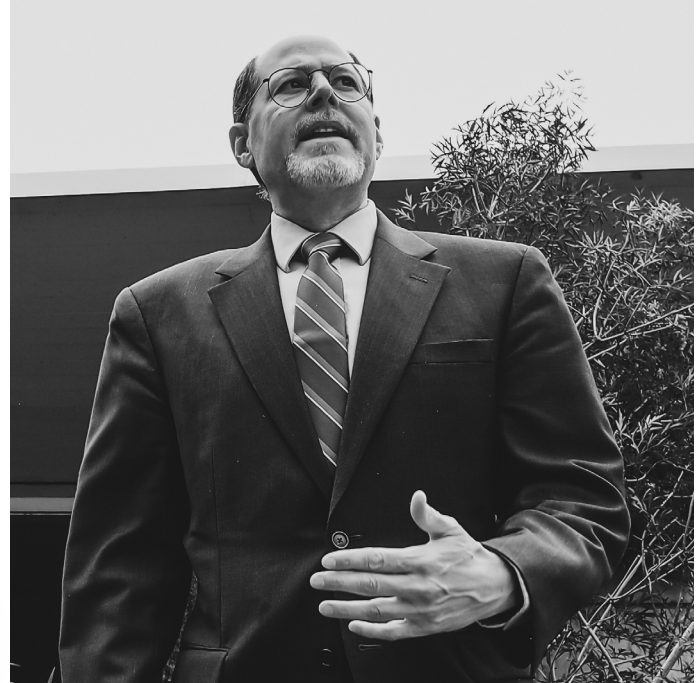


Miracles - daily miracles and unpredictable - are one of the great mysteries of life. When they happen, we should express appreciation and wonder. But the wisdom of our tradition tells us that we should never count on them to help us out of a jam and protect us from trouble. For that, we ought to rely on ourselves and one another.

A Message from Director of Education Dr. Eliyahu Krigel, CJE

A Dvar

"In Israel, a land lacking in natural resources, we have learned to appreciate our greatest national advantage: our minds. Through creativity and innovation, we transformed barren deserts into flourishing fields and pioneered new frontiers in science and technology."

—SHIMON PERES (1923–2016)

Shimon Peres was the 8th Prime Minister and the 9th President of the State of Israel. The quote above reminds us of the limitations of the land and the ingenuity of the mind. Even though natural resources are lacking in Israel, the country continues to be a place of great inspiration

and deep faith. I was fortunate enough to spend my sophomore year of college studying at the Pardes Institute of Jewish Studies in Jerusalem. I fell in love with Israel during that time. For me, the sky felt closer to the ground when I lived in Jerusalem. The holiness I felt at the Kotel or Western Wall carried over to my experience of walking the streets. The texts I was studying became part of the blueprint of my life. In high school I knew I wanted to travel to Israel for an extended period. I waited to make the journey until college because that worked best for me. For many Jewish students in North America however, studying abroad in Israel is an option even during high school. Programs such as the [Alexander Muss High School](#), [Tichon Ramah Yerushalayim \(TRY\)](#), or [USY High](#) are extremely worthwhile and incredible educational opportunities high school students can experience worthy of further consideration even in this time of the global pandemic.

While many study abroad programs have closed or severely struggled due to Covid-19, some have found creative ways to endure and persevere during this challenging time. The Alexander Muss High School in Israel has remained open and continues to be a place where students are thriving, growing, and learning in a powerful way. My daughter Kaela is there now on the program spending the first semester of her sophomore year utilizing the land of Israel and all it has to offer as her classroom. The Impact Fellowship when students bring what they have learned and gained back to Seattle when they return is an incredible opportunity many of our students like Kaela at HNT and in the greater Seattle area have engaged with in order to attend this prestigious program.

My daughter has thrived at Muss this past semester. When the students arrived in September, they quarantined for 2 weeks in small pods. Since reopening, they are considered one large group and have been able to travel and explore. It has been incredible to witness how the staff at Muss has skillfully mobilized to ensure the safety and well-being of all the students. Kaela and her peers have used Israel as their classroom. They have walked the land and breathed the same air as our ancestors. The friendships they have formed will last a lifetime. Dr. Mark Shinar and his team of talented educators have successfully formed a cohesive program in these uncertain times because of their hard work and focused determination. Their coordinated effort is a

beacon of hope when so many lights are being dimmed.

I would like to humbly encourage all rising high schoolers to be open to the possibility of considering this opportunity or a similar experience in Israel in the future for themselves. I have always encouraged my students to attend study abroad programs in Israel during their high school and their college experiences because of the unique educational and growth opportunities they provide. Even though I have always encouraged others to check out programs like Muss, TRY, or USY High, having my own child on the program has provided me and my family with memories and experiences we will cherish for a lifetime. We are so thankful Kaela and her peers have had this outstanding opportunity this past semester to study at Muss thanks to the support of the Samis Foundation, the Jewish Federation of Seattle, HNT, and JNF. 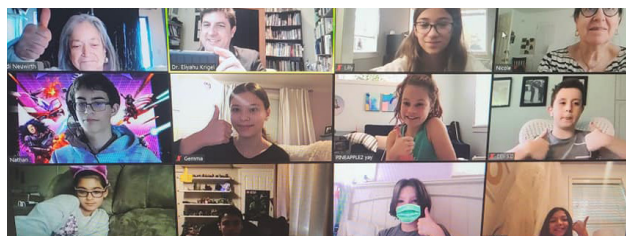
