A Message from Rabbi Jacob Herber

Purim has to be one of my favorite holidays. It's got everything: a text with an extraordinary story, and costumes and fun for every age! Unfortunately, because of the Coronavirus pandemic this year we won't be able gather in person to celebrate. Like last year, our Purim service will be streamed online. Tailored for an online audience it will, nonetheless, be filled the Megillah reading, great songs, and great schpiel. I promise!

What I'd like to focus on for the moment, however, are two facets of Purim that often get lost or forgotten in all of the holiday's merriment. One of them is giving mishloa<u>h</u> manot, gifts to others, in celebration of deliverance from near annihilation. I really hope you'll participate in HNT's Mishlaoch Manot Fundraiser. The other is fulfilling the commandment of Matanot Laevyonim – giving gifts to the poor. It's a central component of Purim, and the holiday can't be celebrated completely without fulfilling it. A core value of Judaism is ensuring that we think of those in need, particularly at the times of our greatest joy. It's why we break a glass at the end of a wedding ceremony. At a time of great joy, we make it a point to help those who don't have the same resources that we have. We take the time to act on behalf of those who may not be able to celebrate like we can.

Actually, the mitzvah of Matanot Laevyonim transforms Purim into a holiday that teaches us how to live life in general. On the one hand, we learn from our traditions that we must celebrate with great joy whenever we can. If anything, this pandemic has taught us that life is too short and that it shouldn't be taken for granted. We should celebrate the goodness in our world and the successes with which we've been blessed. On the other hand, Purim teaches

us that it's our responsibility to provide for everyone's happiness, not just our own. So I hope you'll use Purim as a time to rededicate yourself to acts of loving-kindness. I hope you'll participate in HNT's Small Acts of Kindness Challenge 248. You may know that from (secular) New Year's Day (January 1) to Jewish New Year's Eve (Erev Rosh Hashanah - September 6) there are 248 days. There are also 248 positive mitzvot (commandments) out of the 613 enumerated in the Torah. On this special Day of Service, each of us can be challenged to do at least one act of kindness or service for another. You can log your act of kindness here so we can print them and inspire others to act too. I hope you'll get involved with and support the work of our Social Action Committee. And I also hope that you'll give generously to the many organizations in our community, from Jewish Family Service, jfsseattle.org, to Mazon: A Jewish Response to Hunger, mazon.org. who are helping those in need. Remember, we can't be truly happy unless we do our best to spread joy to the entire community!

honored to venture with 15 brave students to New York City to learn about the Jewish immigrant experience. The next year we traveled to Los Angeles to learn how Jews tell our story. The second year we enhanced the program by adding a day each month devoted to our course of study to help complement and enrich the overall learning experience. The third year of the program I led the students on a journey to Washington, D.C. and Philadelphia where we learned how to lobby for causes near and dear to our hearts. Last year I traveled with the students to Selma and Orlando to learn more about the Jewish contribution to the Civil Rights Movement of the 1960s with Etgar 36. The success of the Masa program has been achieved thanks to the incredible generosity of Gwenn and Dean Polik in honor of Valerie Polack z"l.

In the Masa program we don't tell our students what to think. The program is focused on providing students with tools used to deepen Jewish identity linked to Jewish values. Spielberg's quote above emphasis the importance of advocating for Israel in a passionate and knowledgeable way. This past year we have been virtual with the Masa program. 20 students at HNT have engaged monthly in classes through Tzedek America aimed at social justice issues from a variety of perspectives. We are pleased to announce next year the Masa program will be headed to Israel. Please see details and more information below:

The Gwenn and Dean Polik and Valerie Polack z"l Israel Class and Trip: Understanding, Advocating, and Connecting to Israel

Who: Calling all 8-12th graders from HNT and beyond! The Masa program at HNT will be venturing to Israel next year. Space is limited to 20 students, first come first serve. Join us for a trip of a lifetime!

When: Tuesday evenings from 6:30-8:30pm starting in the Fall of 2021: 9/14, 10/12, 11/9, 12/7, 1/11, 3/8, 4/12, and 5/10 + a trip to and from Israel with Ramah from February 17-28, 2022!

What: On the trip students will have the opportunity to travel with the Ramah Israel Institute. Among many other things, we will celebrate Kabbalat Shabbat in the Old City of Jerusalem, tour Yad Vashem, visit the Machnaeh Yehuda Shuk, explore the Davidson Center Archeological Park and the Southern Wall excavations, ride camels in the desert, ascend Masada, relax at the Ein Gedi Hot Springs, tour Tzfat and meet a local glassblower, walk the old city of Jaffa, explore Tel Aviv, stay at Kibbutz Ma'agan, and so much more!

• Due to the incredible generosity of Gwenn and Dean Polik, we can provide this program for \$2200 to HNT member students who sign up before February 26, 2021 (\$2700 for non-members who sign up by February 26, 2021).

- After February 26, the cost will be \$2500 for members and the cost for non-HNT members will be \$3000.
- Limited need-based assistance may be available for students of HNT members due to a financial hardship.
- Registration in the Masa program at HNT includes: 8 class sessions (dinner and guest speaker included), air transportation to and from Israel, lodging, and the entire program for the 10-day trip. Only students who attend the classes can travel on the trip.
- No refunds will be provided for this trip due to cancellation except if HNT or Ramah cancels the trip or if we are unable to fill your spot. Our effort to complete the registration 11 months prior to the trip is driven by airline ticket prices. If the trip is postponed, we will work with you on rescheduling as appropriate.
- Special presenters on various dynamic aspects of Israeli society and culture will join us during our monthly sessions to help enrich our curriculum, prepare for the trip, and then reflect on our experience.
- We are hopeful that by September 2021 in person gatherings for school will be permitted. In the event that we will have to meet virtually, the program will still continue remotely. If we are virtual, there will not be dinner provided but we will continue to meet with special guests and will engage with our programming on Zoom.
- All students must have a valid Passport to participate on the trip. All expiration dates for Passports must be 6 months prior to the time of travel to Israel.
