
A Message from Rabbi Jacob Herber


I have an admission to make. I've never been a fan of communal seders. I know this might sound surprising given my passion for community building. I've spent the last seven years as a leader of the Rabbinical Assembly engaged in visioning, strategic planning, and community organizing to strengthen and support the community of Conservative rabbis and, by extension, the Conservative Movement. When I visited HNT thirteen months ago as a candidate for the position of Senior Rabbi I chose to teach a text on Shabbat afternoon about how the great Sage, Hillel, in early years, was excluded from a community of learners because I wanted to I articulate my vision of a welcoming and vibrant community. I was so excited about the prospect of serving as HNT's spiritual leader because so many HNT members are either leaders or engaged members of the greater Seattle Jewish community, and because our congregation was a key proponent of a community campus. I just loved the idea of our congregation sharing community space with other communal organizations. I'm a big Clal Yisraelnik, an enormous proponent of a united Jewish community.

So why haven't I been a big fan of communal or community seders? While the synagogue is the primary setting for Jewish religious life, it isn't the exclusive one. The home has always been a very important Jewish setting. Some of the most important rituals of Judaism are located in and are meant to be performed in the home: brit milah (bris), pidyon haben, the redemption of the first-born son, sitting shivah, and many more, including the Passover seder. On Pesah we prepare our homes for the two seders, inviting family and friends to join us at our table. The reason we don't recite Kiddush in the synagogue on erev Passover is because we assume that everyone will recite it at a seder table, either as a host or as a guest in someone's home.

This year, however, like last year, is different. In the midst of a continuing pandemic we have little choice but to limit our Passover sedarim to immediate family. It's the safe and responsible thing to do. There will be many who will have no option but to celebrate at their own seder table, and possibly doing it alone. But this year, like last year, we need each other more than ever, we need our community. So, this year I'll be leading – along with Cantor Kurland - a second night communal seder for our congregational family. It will be abbreviated; shorter than usual. Together, we'll start at the beginning of the Haggadah – reading and singing - and make our way to shulhan orekh, up to the meal. Then we'll wish each other betayavon, a good meal, and conclude our seders on our own. I'm hoping this congregational endeavor will enable us to feel less lonely and apart, and more connected to each other and to HNT. Please look for details in this HaKol about how you can RSVP for our congregational seder and how you can participate by leading a part. I'm looking forward to seeing you on my Zoom screen, Sunday night, March 28th.

Wishing you and your loved ones a very healthy and sweet Passover!

Schocken, On The Verge Of Consensus

Film Sponsored by HNT & The Schocken Family Streaming March 8-11

Before WWII, Salman Schocken was known as the king of department stores in Germany, owning 22 locations and employing 6,000 people. But the businessman and philanthropist was also a man of letters: he owned a unique

collection of 60,000 rare books in German and Hebrew, and in 1931 founded a modern publishing house committed to publishing Judaica and Jewish authors such as Franz Kafka, Martin Buber, and Elie Wiesel. A lifelong supporter of the Nobel laureate S.Y. Agnon, a central figure of modern Hebrew fiction, Schocken also bought the Haaretz newspaper and standardized Hebrew font type. Ahead of his time, Schocken was a maverick modernist in love with tradition. His secular humanist worldview embraced the belief that democracy meant cultural access and aesthetics for all. In that vein, the filmmakers and editors have done an incredible job aesthetically, transitioning from black-and-white footage with narration to colorful scenes from the present day, and they use animation to fill up the empty Schocken stores and structures once inhabited by splendid objects and people.

"Hametz" during Passover 🧅



We are commanded not to eat, see, or possess any "hametz" during Passover. Hametz, usually translated as "leaven," is technically any one of the five biblical grain species - wheat, barley, rye, spelt, or oats - that has been in contact with water for more than 18 minutes. That's why matzah is OK during Passover, but bread isn't. Alas, beer and whiskey, with rare exceptions, are made from these grains, so they are not kosher for Passover. So that we don't have hametz in our possession, we put any hametz we want to put away for Passover in a separate space, and we sell it to a non-Jew for the duration of the holiday.

Fast of the Firstborn

C ince the firstborn of the Egyptians died so that our ancestors could get free from Egypt, there is a custom that Jewish first-born children If ast as a sign gratitude that we weren't killed. The fast of the firstborn is marked starting at sunrise on the day of the seder and continues until sundown. However, if you're a firstborn you can be exempted from the requirement to fast by attending a seudat mitzvah, a "mitzvah meal." We will hold a siyyum, the completion of a tractate of learning, on that morning (Thursday, March 25th) following our streamed morning minyan. Join us for a last pre-Passover bagel and l'hayim before Passover whether you're fasting or not.

The Torah prohibits the ownership of leaven during Passover; therefore requiring the most preparation of any holiday. The Rabbinic Assembly Passover Guide is intended to help families maintain a Pesahdik home according to the principles of Conservative Judaism and its understanding of Jewish Law. With significant changes in the nature and manufacture of kitchen products and foodstuffs, new policies are required to maintain a Kosher-for-Passover kitchen. 
