A Message from Rabbi Jacob Herber

The Book of Numbers Chapter 9 contains a story about the Israelites and their journey through the wilderness of Sinai. Moses enjoins the people to offer the Pesah, the Passover sacrifice, on the 14th day of the first month of the year at twilight, in the same way they had been commanded to do in Egypt.

Bemidbar tells us: "But there were some men who were impure by reason of a corpse and could not offer the Passover sacrifice on that day." The men come before Moses and Aaron and are upset. "Impure though we are by reason of a corpse," they say, "why must we be prohibited from presenting the Lord's offering at its set time with the rest of the Israelites?" Moses is unsure how to respond to them, so he turns to God for advice.

"When any of you or of your prosperity who are defiled by a corpse or on a long journey would offer a Passover sacrifice to the Lord," God declares, "they shall offer it in the second month, on the 14th day of the month, at twilight. They shall eat it with unleavened bread and bitter herbs." This becomes the law of Pesah Sheni, the second Passover. Later in the Mishnah, the earliest anthology of the Oral Law, the definition of "distant journey" was reinterpreted liberally by the ancient Rabbis. Anyone who had any type of ritual impurity could also be included in the ceremony. While the particulars of the sacrifice and the meal would be the same as a normal Passover, the differences include the fact that it was shifted from a seven-day festival to a one-day holiday, and hametz did not have to be removed from the household. With the destruction of the Temple, and the fact that sacrifices were no longer offered, Pesah Sheni became a vestigial ritual, a symbol of past holiday celebrations. Today, we remember it because on that day Tahanun, prayers of individual penitence, aren't recited.

There is one singular theme isn't forgotten: God allows second chances. If a person, through no fault of his own, could not be present in Jerusalem to celebrate the paschal sacrifice and commemorate the Exodus from Egypt, he was granted another opportunity exactly a month later to do so. Second chances can occur and the law of Pesah Sheni teaches us that everyone deserves that second chance. This is about the power of teshuvah, the power of repentance. It enables us to make sincere amends for the mistakes we've made. If we miss the mark, we're granted a second chance. If we've gone off the moral, ethical grid, far from God or from others, we have another opportunity to get things right.

In his book, Repentance: The Meaning and Practice of Teshuvah, Dr. Louis E. Newman writes:

God's forgiveness of my transgressions is contingent on my willingness to acknowledge them, repair the damage I have done, and commit myself to avoiding those transgressions in the future; in short, divine forgiveness depends on human repentance." This is a lesson that is very important for all of us. Through repentance, I confront my own moral failings and I simultaneously affirm the possibility of overcoming them and restoring a broken relationship with God, who reaches out to penitents with love. This posits that an individual needed to feel contrite that he was unable to offer the Passover sacrifice and recognize that he wanted to make amends by being willing to expend the energy and time to celebrate the experience again. The God of Pesah Sheni is a compassionate and understanding God. But we still need to be prepared to make the first move. We have to acknowledge the realities of human life, the frailties of human behavior, and the circumstances under which we live. There are times when it's all up to us. There are also times when things are completely beyond our control. In either case, we're often given second chances to make amends and to do what's right.

As we prepare for the High Holy Days, which – believe it or not - will take place in only a few months, this is an important lesson. We can all do better. That's precisely why Rosh Hashanah and Yom Kippur occur every year. We shouldn't look for excuses not to do better or mend our relationships with both God and with other people. If we need to make amends, we should. If we're given a second chance, we should do better the next time. Hopefully, we can learn from our mistakes, from going ethically astray, by using that second opportunity to better ourselves.

This year Pesah Sheni will fall on April 26th. When it comes next year on May 15th let's think about its lessons and what it seeks to teach us about God giving us a second chance. As we prepare for the High Holy Days of 5782 let's take advantage of the possibility to do teshuvah and make ourselves and our world better. Granted that second chance, let's do better next time.

Message from Nadine Strauss, Executive Director

Dear HNT Family,

I n Jewish tradition every formal blessing must include two parts: A petichtah (an opening) and a nechemta (a closing). Even in prayer we need to say, "this is where we start" and "this is where we end."

Last year at this time no one could have predicted how much would change, and that we were at the beginning of a lethal global pandemic. We have discovered that the time spent with those we love is even more precious than we might have understood and sometimes there is no telling when something is beginning and when something will end. In this spirit, with both a joyful and a heavy heart, I have decided that this is the right time for me, and for our congregation, to leave my position as Executive Director of Herzl-Ner Tamid which I have proudly served for over 31 years at the end of June 2021.

My life has been nourished by my time in the HNT community. Here, I have made lifelong friends, have been a part of a team that has grown through collaborative communal projects, and have been inspired by the loving acts of generosity which abound in our congregation. I am grateful that you have shared your journeys with me, and please know that I never took for granted the trust you have placed in me.

The late Rabbi Lord Jonathan Sacks z"l once wrote, "Community is where we learn to speak, to share, to love, to trust, where we discover where we came from and what history we are a part. [Community] is where we acquire the art of relationships without which we cannot survive for long." Truly, this has been my experience at HNT. This is where I experienced the Seattle boom and bust, and boom again. This is where I learned that raccoons on Mercer Island are protected regardless of their menace. This is where I learned that I could serve my community during times of grief and times of joy, and that when it is my time for grief or joy, the community will be here for me.

I am particularly grateful to the many HNT colleagues, clergy, fellow staff members and lay leaders whose passion and commitment to this congregational community have served as inspiring models to me. This past year has presented some daunting challenges, but we were in it as one. Together, we found ways to cope with the unknown and find purpose in what, at times, could have felt like an abyss. I am thankful that we had each other during this time.

Thank you for welcoming me into your lives and for enriching mine, for your fortitude in ever seeking ways to build bridges, and for being my community for these many years. Truly, I feel blessed. And so, I offer this nechemta (a closing) for this moment:

May we all be blessed with vision for a better tomorrow, courage to do what is in our power to best assure it, and compassion and kindness to guide us along the way.


