

Shavuot is the orphan of the Jewish calendar. It's one of the least observed of the Jewish holidays. Passover and Sukkot, the other three pilgrimage festivals, have lots of rituals making them both home holidays filled with meaningful customs. Rosh Hashanah and Yom Kippur are synagogue-based. Known as the Yamim Noraim, the Days of Awe, they bring out the Jewish community en mass to worship services like no other days during the year. Hanukkah and Purim might be minor festivals, but they're infused with fun, family, and community celebrations.

Shavuot, on the other hand, pales in comparison. Aside from preparing blintzes, cheesecake, or sutlach there isn't much home observance or, for that matter, even much unique ritual at the synagogue. It's so ironic because Shavuot is the festival of revelation. Historical mention of the festival has to do with the receiving of the Torah at Mount Sinai which, according to tradition, took place on the 6th day of Sivan. But it's precisely the holiday's primarily theological focus that makes it challenging for us to wrap our heads around it. The number of people who celebrate Shavuot is rather minimal. And honestly, it's very sad.

While we might hold differing opinions about what actually happened at Sinai, it's nonetheless vital that we seriously consider the consequential memory of the outcome of that event.

Emet VeEmunah: Statement of Principles of Conservative Judaism opens with the words, "We believe in God. Indeed, Judaism cannot be detached from belief in God. Conservative Judaism affirms its belief in revelation, the uncovering of an external source of truth emanating from God." It goes on to declare that "the single greatest event in the history of God's revelation took place at Sinai, but was not limited to it... Some of us conceive of revelation as the personal encounter between God and human beings. Among them there are those who believe that this personal encounter has propositional content – that God communicated with us in actual words. For them, revelation's content is immediately normative, as defined by rabbinic interpretation.

The commandments of the Torah themselves issue directly from God. Others, however, believe that revelation consists of an ineffable human encounter with God. The experience of revelation inspires the verbal formulation by human beings of norms and ideas, continuing the historical influence of this revelational encounter. Others among us conceive of revelation as the continuing discovery, through nature and history, of truths about God and the world. These truths, although always culturally conditioned, are nevertheless seen as God's ultimate purpose for creation. Proponents of this view tend to see revelation as an ongoing process rather than as a specific event."

In his book The Observant Life: The Wisdom of Life for Conservative Judaism for Contemporary Jews Rabbi Alan Lucas writes, "These inspirational words show the way for contemporary Jews attempting to relate to Shavuot. However, revelation is defined, Shavuot celebrates the 'the single greatest event' in Jewish history. It is the holiday that reminds us that faith in the truth of revelation is at the heart of all legitimate varieties of Judaism and Jewish identity." These are terms and ideas that are difficult for us post-modern folks to comprehend. Yet, they're the foundation of the Jewish way of life and the Jewish value system. There are a plethora of views about revelation even in rabbinic and medieval Jewish literature. No one view stands out as totally representative of all of Jewish thinking on the matter. The perspectives range from a quote in the Jerusalem Talmud Hagigah 1:7 which states: "Even what an experienced student in the future is going to teach before his master already has been stated to Moses at Sinai," all the way to a statement attributed to Naftali Tzvi Horowitz of Ropshitz, quoting his teacher, Rabbi Menachem Mendel of Rymanov: "It was possible that we heard from the mouth of the Holy One, Blessed be He, only the letter aleph anokhi," that is, the first letter of the word of the first commandment.

In between these two poles we find many, different opinions as to what actually occurred at Sinai and what is the content of revelation. On the basis of these opinions, it's apparant that Jewish theology is anything but monolithic in its opinion about this issue. Shavuot calls on us to think about the event at Mount Sinai and to contemplate what effect it has in our lives. It may be difficult for many of us to adequately approach these ideas, but it's important that we try.

It's in this spirit that I hope you'll join us virtually over the holiday of Shavuot. One other tradition that does set Shavuot apart from the other hagim is, of course, the Tikkun Leil Shavuot, the practice of engaging in the Torah study on erev Shavuot (you'll find information about this month's Tikkun Leil below). I hope that you'll think about the effect that Sinai has on your life and the impact it has on your thinking about God, Torah, and the Jewish People. If we endeavor to do this, the holiday of Shavuot will be meaningful for us all.



# A Message from Director of Education Dr. Eliyahu Krigel, CJE

### **A Dvar**

"A righteous person falls down seven times and gets up."

-KING SOLOMON, PROVERBS 24:16

The challenges of the pandemic have forced all of us to pivot and persevere in this unprecedented time in new ways. We must go on because as a people we have always adapted by transforming obstacles into opportunities. A righteous person may fall but their good nature and optimistic perspective serves to support their stumble. Although

getting up might require an abundance of strength and grit, this action is well worth the struggle. As our world begins to open back up and slowly heal from Covid-19, we are excited to reimage FRS and what our future might bring.

We are reimagining FRS due to the Covid-19 pandemic for the 2021-2022 academic year at Herzl-Ner Tamid. On behalf of the FRS parent committee and the FRS reopening taskforce, we salute the FRS teachers, teaching assistants, and staff for creating a holy community online this past year. Our priority moving forward is the safety of our staff and students coupled with continuity in Jewish learning. We base our policies at FRS on core Jewish values, medical advice, and best educational practices. We continue to be guided by the following Jewish values:

- 1. Pikuah Nefesh: Saving a life takes precedence.
- 2. Ushmartem et Nafshotechem: You shall scrupulously guard your health.
- 3. Dina D'malchuta Dina: The law of the land is the law.

Although we are still in process with our plans for FRS, we are diligently preparing for all the possibilities that lie ahead. After the destruction of the 2nd Temple in 70 CE by the Romans, Jerusalem was in shambles. Rabbi Yochanan ben Zakkai was smuggled out of the city in a coffin. He was then brought to the Roman general Vespasian. Thankfully, Vespasian allowed Rabbi Yochanan to establish a rabbinic academy in Yavneh, a village located on the coast of the Mediterranean Sea in the land of Israel.
