

Pay It Forward Fund

Established in Honor of Carol Maslan z"l and Nadine Strauss

This fund is dedicated towards mitigating housing, food scarcity, and direct human need for those outside our HNT community.

It is established in memory of Carol Maslan z"l, a 25-year member of the HNT staff who exemplified, through her incalculable acts of kindness to those in distress, what it means to make a difference in a person's life. In the Jewish tradition we teach the value of mitzvah goreret mitzvah (one mitzvah leads to another mitzvah). For Carol, mitzvot were abundant and all of us were the beneficiaries of her grace. One of Carol's most enduring concerns, before her life was cut short by cancer, was her uncertainty of whether she made a difference in people's lives. This fund helps ensure that her passionate belief in helping those most vulnerable should be a core value and priority at HNT.

Upon her retirement, after 31 years of service as HNT Executive Director, Nadine Strauss shares the naming of this fund in recognition of her stewardship, mentorship and commitment to HNT's many social action/justice initiatives. Throughout Nadine's tenure she has helped to infuse social action and social justice into the very soul and culture of HNT. In a world where it can feel like our acts are just drops in an ocean, Nadine used her position at HNT to model that every action matters and in fact, what we do with our faith has the potential for changing not just ourselves but our whole community.

Nadine and Carol were co-conspirators in the art of Tikkun Olam, Repairing the World. Together they partnered in helping mobilize the HNT community to channel their faith into action, both for those who are part of the HNT community and equally for those not within the Jewish communal sphere. After all, if we truly believe that Elijah heralds the coming of a better world, one where there is enough food and a place to sleep for every human, then we must do more than just open the door for him on Passover. A redeemed world begins with righteous acts for all humans

HNT is blessed through the generosity of so many of our members with other funds such as the Mitzvah Corps and discretionary funds that help address personal hardships of our congregants. Though we can and must do more, it is already within the fabric of our HNT culture to care for our own family. In establishing this fund, we are asked to broaden our definition of family, seeing the human family as our own.

The expansive message of this new fund is that our HNT family believes that we must also provide for all people regardless of affiliation or faith identity, and for those who receive to know that when they fell on hard times, it was the Jewish community who came to support them. If there is any hope for a more peaceful world, it is through acts of generosity that transcend identity politics and hold fast to the notion that we are each B'Tzelem Elohim (made in the Divine image) and worthy of care and love.

SO LONG NADINE! Farewell Remarks from Nadine Strauss, Executive Director Reprinted from Annual Meeting May 25, 2021

(Praise and appreciation comments preceded the following remarks)

t is a rare gift in life to be able to take some measure of direct influence of one's legacy while you are still alive. No worries, I will be working around here a few more weeks and I am blessed to have my health! However, I find myself in a deeply contemplative space as I prepare to retire from my job as Executive Director. Of course, all of us in some way or another can attempt to influence the way we will be seen once we leave the spaces we occupy, and I am no different. So, I have given a lot of thought to the imprint I hope that I am leaving as I conclude this chapter of my professional time here at HNT.

I treasure and am so very grateful to the friends I have made, the teams I have worked with, both lay and professional, and am forever thankful for being able to be part of this exceptional Jewish community. No doubt, these decades long relationships will continue and flourish beyond the scope of my professional position.

In addition, I want to call out my daughters, Miriam and Julia, who literally grew up in our HNT building – patiently waiting those days and nights as I worked on this or that and as I recruited them for many tasks and jobs around here, seen and unseen, throughout the years. They learned that jobs of service are family jobs which involve a lot of compromise and sacrifice.

Each of my daughters, however, chose professions of service; Miriam is the senior rabbi, for over a decade, serving a Cincinnati congregation with a passionate social justice focus. Julia is Director of Small Business Grants and the Governor's Life Science Sector Lead for the WA Dept. of Commerce. Both of them have leant me their professional guidance, especially this last year, and rarely voiced doubt that I needed to do what I did those long days and evenings. Together with my very supportive family, the compassionate and patient ear of good friends, and the loving heart of this vibrant HNT community, I was able to stay in that office these many years looking forward to the challenges and opportunities each day had to offer.

I've worn many 'hats' over the years in this job, and doing so was possible because we all did the work as staff and communal members towards creating mutual trust and respect, nurtured through collaborative effort, guided by common purpose, and sustained with a healthy dose of humor.

After three decades at Herzl-Ner Tamid, I have been blessed with being present to the whole swath of human experiences; from birth to death and everything in between. It was my job to be somewhat invisible; to make sure that the lights were on, that the budget was balanced, and that our sanctuary was safe. In other words, to ensure that the scaffolding of our congregation was secure so that the community could do what we are supposed to do: worship, celebrate lifecycles, care for the stranger, and show up for one another. I found that I could not be separate from the work of "running the ship" and the work of being an active and engaged Jew.

In truth, the most outward expression of my Jewish identity and spiritual practice has played out in my professional experiences. And there has been

little invisible about that practice.

Beyond my relationships, the other sacred gift I have engaged in through my time at HNT is the act of connecting my faith with tangible action in the world. Be it the Ellen Yusim annual blood drive, our many needs drives, connecting with other organizations in justice issues or just doing my part to connect those less visible with needed support has enriched my life in so many ways. I have never felt more Jewish or more engaged with my community than when I am working towards the mitzvah of Tikkun Olam, healing the world.

It is my sincerest hope that the enduring footprint I leave on the HNT community is one of service. We are at our best when we share our abundance with all people – both those who are part of our sacred community and those who are our fellow human travelers. It is why I'm so honored that the Carol Maslan z"I & Nadine Strauss Pay It Forward Fund has been established to mark my tenure and that of my colleague and dear friend of 25 years, Carol Maslan z"I. This fund and initiative are structured to garner financial support for all people in need, not just the ones in our closest proximity. Its design is inspired by Carol's fervent wish to make a difference in people's lives through personal connection and direct help with food and housing. The details of the inspiration and the machinations of this fund as well as grateful appreciation to those who so generously seeded it can be found on page 2.

If I have learned anything from my time as Executive Director, it is that we must rely on our community to be an exemplar of connection. It is our humility and generosity that lays the foundation for a strong spiritual life, and no one I have ever met has regretted helping others.

In this spirit, I hope you consider a gift to the Carol & Nadine Pay it Forward Fund. Not to honor me. Not even to honor Carol Maslan z"l. But rather, to honor the sacred responsibility that is the core of Jewish identity.

Our legacy is almost always about how we walk our talk. Thank you – to each of you – for giving me the opportunity and the platform for which I have attempted to walk the best part of my Jewish faith through acts of service and witness.

As our sacred texts teach:


7 ith this, the first edition of the Hakol for HNT 2021/2022 fiscal year, we can look back with satisfaction and pride on what's been a very full and fulfilling year at HNT, in spite of the many challenges we continued to face due to the Covid-19 pandemic. It's especially appropriate to do this now as we come to the end of the very long and accomplished tenure of our Executive Director, Nadine Strauss. Nadine has been an invaluable advisor to the clergy, lay leadership, and membership of our congregation. She's been a mentor and a friend to the administrative staff she has assembled over the course of her tenure. While my time working with Nadine has been relatively short, I am immensely grateful for the advice, counsel, and support she's provided me as I started my tenure as Senior Rabbi during an enormously challenging time. At HNT we see the relationship between lay and professional leaders as a sacred partnership, and no one has done more to exemplify this than Nadine. Brandon Holan • June 5





The following are the plans in place now for FRS for the coming school year only. We will continue to reevaluate and modify our program for this next academic school year especially for second semester.

Further HNT reopening plans are in the works. Expect additional details this summer. Thank you for your patience and consideration as we carefully and thoughtfully continue to work on our protocols and safety plans. The sooner you register the better so we can plan ahead for a safe, fun, fantastic year of learning together.

We have reimagined FRS to plan for a rewarding learning experience in the following way:

Pre-K - 5th Grade:

In-person* learning on Sundays 9:30 AM -12:15 PM beginning 9/12/2021.

Students will have the opportunity to:

- Lead two Zoom Noar programs
- Participate in two create-at-home shelter meals
- Engage in additional opportunities and programming as a class

*For interested families, there will be an enrollment option for your child(ren) to participate exclusively in a remote fashion. This multi-age virtual classroom will be taught by an FRS teacher during school on Sunday. If you would like to enroll in the virtual option, please fill out the regular enrollment. 3rd - 7th Grade:

Remote learning on Tuesdays 4:30 PM - 6:15 PM beginning 9/14/2021. We will reevaluate this remote option second semester.

After enrolling in FRS, an alternative option is to enroll in the Mishkan Program on a day other than Tuesday for an additional fee. Arrange for 6-8 FRS students in

one of the local area students houses or at another preapproved location for in-person learning with an FRS teacher.

6th & 7th Grade:

In-person learning on Saturdays 9:30 AM - 12:15 PM beginning 9/18/2021.

On days when there is a bar or bat mitzvah at HNT or remotely, students will only attend the service remotely with the teacher's laptop even if they are in the building and the bar or bat mitzvah is also in the building so as not to impact the guest list of the families.

8th - 12th Grade:

The Masa Program will meet once a month on Sundays from 4:30 PM -6:30 PM at HNT with the plan of taking a ten-day trip to Israel in February 2022.

We have worked hard to recreate a robust program next year while keeping the FRS tuition the same. We will continue to reevaluate and modify this program. If you start remote you can transition to in-person learning. Protocols in place include, but are not limited to, wearing masks and social distancing. HNT and FRS will share more details by June 30 regarding our safety procedures.
