A Message from Rabbi Jacob Herber



Rabbi Jacob Herber

On Erev Yom Kippur I shared my thoughts and vision for HNT as a welcoming and vibrant community. Our HNT Affinity Group Initiative will allow our members to gather in micro-communities that reflect different interests, needs, and life circumstances. They will reflect and celebrate the diversity of our congregation offering members the chance to strengthen and develop meaningful connections. Our Social Action Committee provides a wonderful opportunity of community for members by bringing them together to do *gemilut hasadim*, deeds of *lovingkindness*, for those outside of our congregation. There is, however, one synagogue group of volunteers that is a bit less visible and often works behind the scenes. Their efforts are, nonetheless, vital to our congregation and essential to community building. They focus their *gemilut hasadim* on the members of our synagogue family. As we emerge from the pandemic we hope to revitalize HNT's Mitzvah Corps and the noble, holy work they do. I believe the Mitzvah Corps is vital to our effort to build community at HNT, which is why I'm sharing this space with Judy Ziedman, Chair of the Mitzvah Corps, to share her important message with all of you. It's a fitting message of synagogue rededication during this season of Hanukkah:

It's time for the HNT Mitzvah Corps to re-energize

itself and offer our congregants the care and compassion for which we are known. Our goal is to recapture our sense of community by performing a variety of "mitzvot."

The projects that the Corps used to focus on have pretty much dropped out of existence due to circumstances of the past nineteen months or so. We have provided a handful of meals, cards, and phone calls when asked, but we need to do more on an ongoing basis. Let's bring back our High Holiday Outreach Goody Bag program (everyone's fave) and the challah/wine/grape juice deliveries for Shabbat. Let's make sure that we reach out to those grieving over a loved one and offer a Shiva or Shabbat meal. Perhaps we can sponsor a homeless shelter meal. And let's just take care of one another and show our HNT community that we are thinking of them and that they're not alone no matter the individual situation.

Mitzvah Corps has about fifty-five volunteers in its database; when asked for help, though, it seems that it's mostly the same core group that steps up each time. I'm encouraging more of you to sign up so that we can increase our volunteer base. Mitzvah Corps is not your typical committee; there are no meetings to attend and the volunteers can pick/choose what they




would like to participate in. The opportunities for helping are whatever you would like them to be; there is something for everyone. And I'm always open to ideas for new projects.

I would be remiss if I didn't give a heartfelt thanks to the many volunteers who have given of themselves over the years; thank you for always supporting one another. Mitzvah Corps wouldn't be Mitzvah Corps without you!

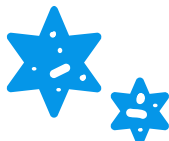

The resolve and determination of learning at FRS has been inspiring to witness. Each week on the weekends we have been able to continue with in person learning at HNT. We are grateful to the HNT reopening committee for working so diligently and thoroughly as we have begun to reopen for in person learning. There are many obvious things wrong with our world. We are living through a global pandemic, yet we continue to think of others and care for those in need. So far this year families at FRS have already organized to provide food for two meals at the Eastside Men's Shelter. Our goal at FRS is to continue to provide a meal for 100 men at the shelter. We have teamed up Congregations for the Homeless (CFH) to assist with this effort. CFH strives to mitigate the pain of homelessness by providing meals and basic needs. HNT works with CFH to provide monthly meals for their 100 guests through the colder months.

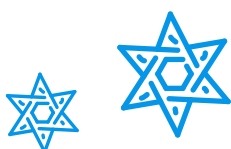

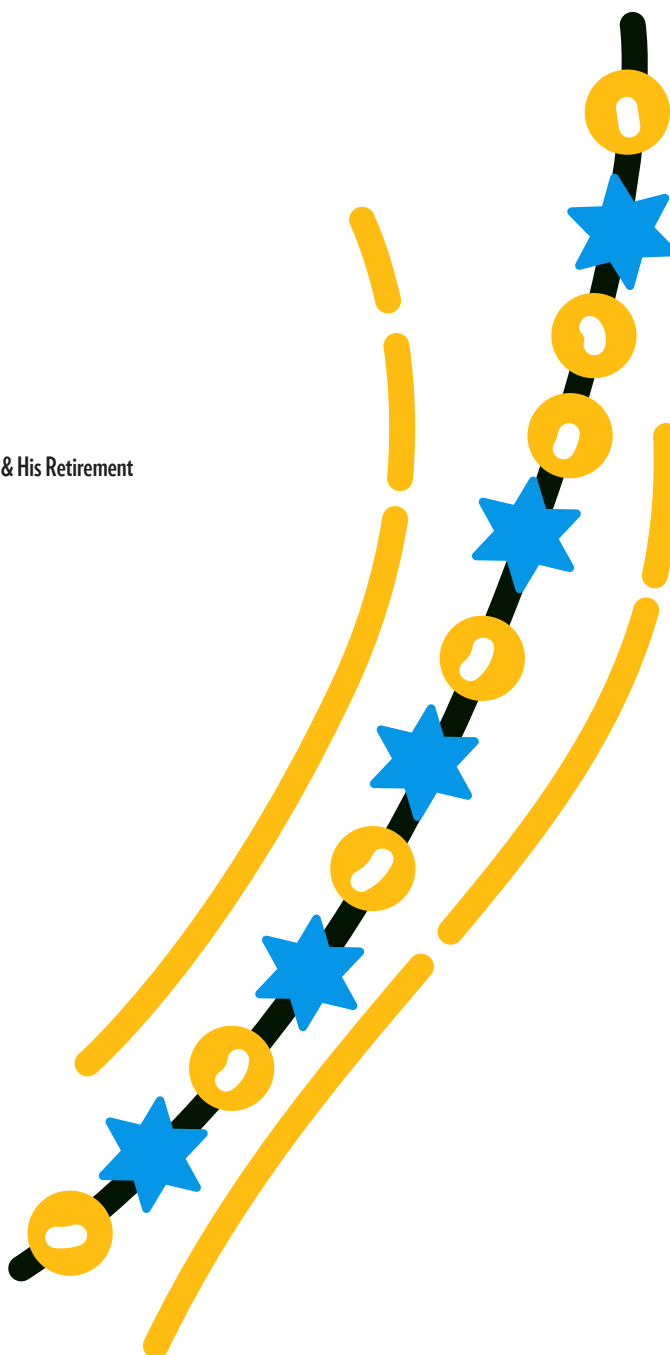
