uring the very challenging Covid months of last Winter, with more than one Bar/Bat Mitzvah occurring at congregants' homes during the same week, we quickly realized that the one portable Aron (Ark) we have at HNT was not enough. We were grateful that UW's Hillel allowed us to rent their Aron, but we recognized that this quick fix was unsustainable. We knew we needed a second Aron, that could be easily transported to a congregant's home.

Ilyse Wagner, our Synagogue President, suggested I ask Jerry Weiser to build it. I had heard that Jerry had a passion for and possessed great skills for woodworking, but I had no idea that he would throw himself so deeply into the project. Together we would meet over Zoom looking at catalogs featuring cabinet and storage units for a design that would fit best our needs. We would FaceTime together while he was in his woodworking shop so that he could show me the progress of his work: he showed me the raw material wood that he had just purchased, and then the sanded and stained pieces he had prepared. Jerry even built a full-size prototype to give me an idea of what the final version would look like.

When Jerry and Judy finally dropped the Aron off at the synagogue in December, I had no idea he would deliver more than a utilitarian Ark, but a work of art, an absolute masterpiece. All of us who were present, Merav, Ashley, Melanie, and I were overwhelmed and completely mesmerized by the gift Jerry created with his hands and heart. Jerry is the Betzalel of Herzl-Ner Tamid! As you peruse the accompanying photos you will see he has built the Aron with exquisite attention detail, and with such love. It will surely inspire all at HNT who use it. I only wish I could be around in 2525 when the time capsule Jerry built into Aron's bottom will be open! On behalf of our entire congregation, thank you Jerry!

Message from the President



Below is something that I shared at work in the days following the events that occurred last month in Texas...

Many of you may have read about the hostage situation that occurred at a

synagogue in Texas this past weekend. I'd like to share how this affected me. While these events were upsetting, they weren't shocking. As a Jew, there is a very direct line to 'this could have been me.' This is the reality of being Jewish in America today (although it's not unique to the US and it's not anything new). My synagogue has an armed security guard, as do most, and security is a constant topic of conversation. I know that I take a risk every time I enter the synagogue, every weekend when I attend Shabbat services, and every time my children participate in a synagogue-based activity. I am always aware of who is around me in the synagogue, and I know where all of the exits are. This is my reality, yet I keep showing up because my faith, my community, and my traditions are important to me, and I will not be driven by fear.

I look forward to celebrating with all of you at our FUNdraiser later this month where we will have a chance to enjoy an online interactive experience together while raising money to support the gap in our programming costs that isn't covered by our annual commitments. 

To solve our greatest problems, we need to change the way we think. This has happened to many of us time and time again since the Covid-19 pandemic. The students at FRS are now back in the building on the weekends which took a tremendous effort on behalf of the reopening committee and the strong lay leadership at HNT. Our teachers and teaching assistants have done a remarkable job keeping our students engaged in a meaningful way. Safety is our top priority, and we also are dedicated to teaching the next generation the sacred ways of our tradition through every obstacle we might face. To help change the narrative and the way we used to think about FRS we have had to become creative and adapt on many levels. We show our gratitude and thanks to the Jewish Federation of Greater Seattle for helping us change the way we used to think and help us to support the Shalom Project. Many thanks also to the Alfred and Tillie Shemanski Trust Fund for helping us think in a new way by enabling us to bring the Mitzvah Bus program to FRS. As we all continue to break through to new challenges which lie ahead, we look forward to the following two new programs at FRS thanks to the generosity of the Federation and the Shemanski Trust:

The Shalom Project on March 6:

Thank you to the Jewish Federation of Greater Seattle for funding the Shalom Project! The Shalom Project will provide household items to distribute to recent refugees relocating to the Pacific Northwest, while learning about why doing so is such a fundamentally Jewish thing to do. Third - fifth grade students at FRS along with students at Mercer Island Presbyterian Church (MIPC) will work together on March 6 during FRS to meet the specific needs of these families. Our goal will be to provide a peaceful landing for refugee families in need by fully embracing this important virtue. So often refugee crises feel removed and far from home. The ingenuity of the Shalom Project is that students learn about the importance of welcoming and helping the stranger and then they actually get to act out this important value by meeting the needs of each refugee family in crisis. The Shalom Project connects students at FRS with students at MIPC in a meaningful way to work together on the shared value of welcoming the stranger and supporting refugees. Since 2010, Washington state has taken in about 2,500 refugees every year according to Kara McDermott of KUOW. With the recent political withdrawal in Afghanistan, this region has welcomed even more refugees to the area. By collecting needed household items for recent refugees, FRS students will engage in providing for refugees in a direct and meaningful way. Not only will we learn about the value of welcoming and being inclusive, but we will also practice this behavior by collecting items for refugee families. Stay tuned for more information. Thanks, Jewish Federation for all the support!

The Mitzvah Bus on May 15:

Thank you to the Alfred and Tillie Shemanski Trust Fund for support the new Mitzvah Bus program at FRS! The Mitzvah Bus will be an opportunity for students to take a vehicle on the last Sunday of FRS to a location in King County with the purpose of helping those in need through social action projects that would benefit the community. At FRS we want all our students to feel closely connected to their local Jewish community. The Mitzvah Bus will offer a field trip opportunity for our students to connect in a real and tangible way with the outside community. The primary purpose of the Mitzvah Bus is to enhance the emotional and physical wellbeing of our community by physically connecting students with local social action opportunities to benefit society and contribute in a meaningful way.
