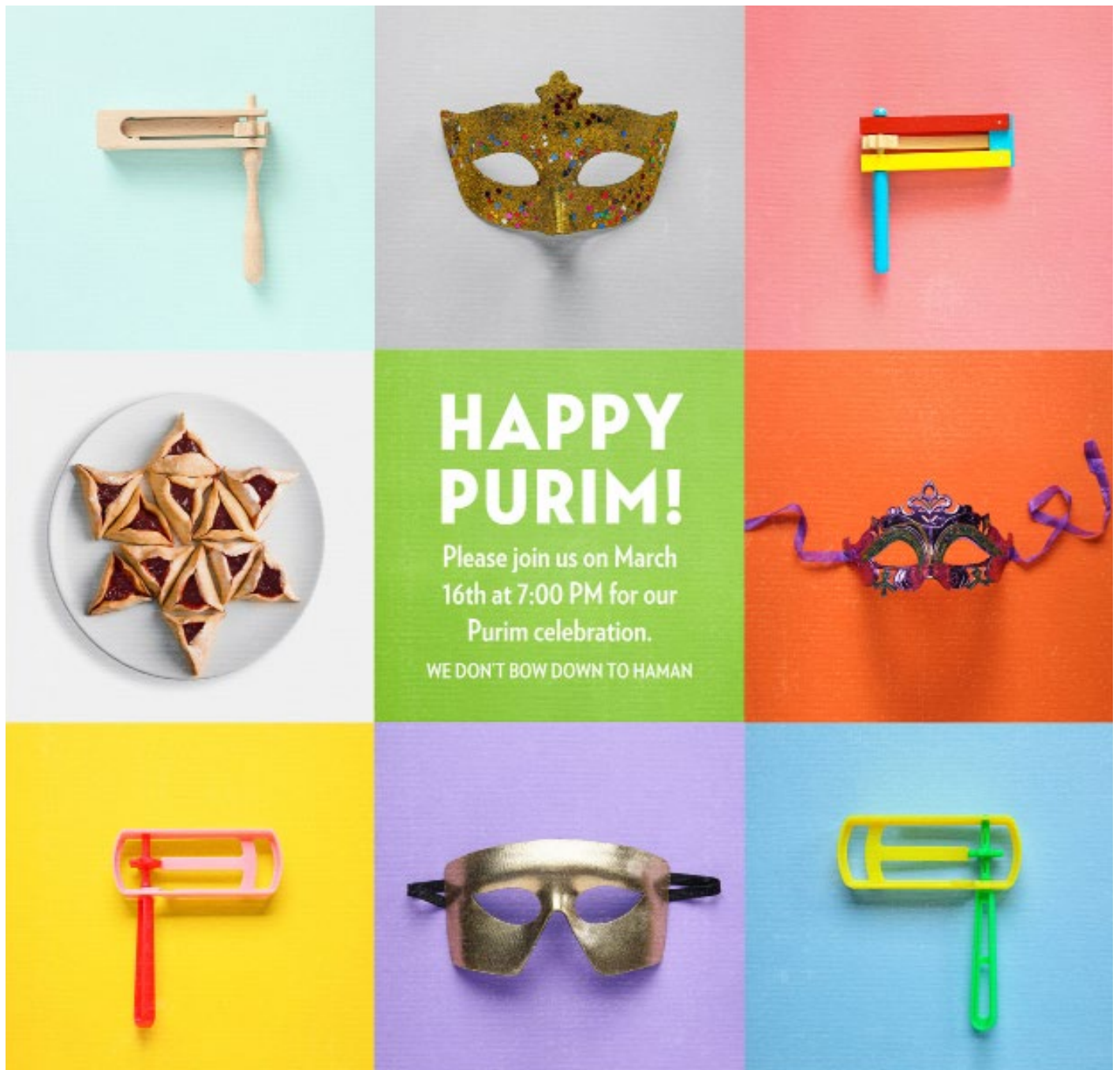
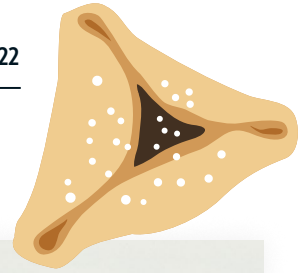

About Rabbi Jeffrey Salkin

With the regular appearance of his award-winning blog, "Martini Judaism: for those who want to be shaken and stirred," published by the Religion News Service, Jeffrey Salkin has risen to the forefront of being one of American Judaism's most prolific and most-quoted rabbis and thought leaders.

Ever since his first book, *Putting God on the Guest List: How to Reclaim The Spiritual Meaning of Your Child's Bar or Bat Mitzvah* (Jewish Lights Publishing), Rabbi Salkin has been known for his writing, teaching and activism. His books are on such subjects as making Jewish ritual meaningful; struggling with the meaning of masculinity in today's world; interpreting Israel and Zionism to Jews and non-Jews; and the task of reclaiming Judaism's central role as a takes-no-prisoners, speak-truth-to-power-and-culture religious tradition.

Because of his national reputation as an American Jewish thought leader, the Chautauqua Institution, America's iconic educational and cultural community, invited Rabbi Salkin to deliver the keynote address for its week on religion, in summer, 2020.

Rabbi Salkin's essays have appeared in the *Washington Post*, *The Huffington Post*, *Tablet*, *Mosaic*, *Forward*, and *JTA*. He has discussed the American political scene on CNN and the BBC. He has contributed articles to scholarly journals. Several of his books have won national awards.

His colleagues have described him as "courageous," "always relevant," and "one of American Judaism's true public intellectuals."

Rabbi Salkin serves as the rabbi of Temple Israel in West Palm Beach, Florida. His hobbies include playing guitar, reading voraciously, and consuming vast quantities of coffee.

Announcement:

The HaMotzi To-Go Shabbat meal program will be coming to an end after April. We will continue to offer to-go meals on holidays for the time being. This program began in April 2020 and while things may not be back to 'normal,' there are many more people comfortable eating at restaurants now and the hope of more catering opportunities on the horizon. The time has come to retire this program and look forward towards new and returning programs.

We have a lot to be proud of! For the past two years, these meals have provided many with a respite from cooking, a valued variety of cuisines, and comfort through difficult times. Over 450 families have ordered 6,800 meals, supporting our caterers with \$200,000 of business, and generously donating over \$26,000 to subsidize meals for those in need.

None of this would have been possible without our caterers, who consistently created fresh, fulsome menus, and worked tirelessly to prepare and pack endless to-go meals. I hope you will join me in extending heartfelt thanks to them, and to the volunteers who have spent countless Friday afternoons handing out meals with a friendly "Shabbat shalom!," and making deliveries from SeaTac to Sultan and everywhere in between. This labor of love (and what's a more Jewish way to show love than through food?) has been a team effort every step of the way.

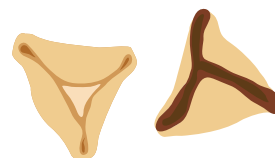

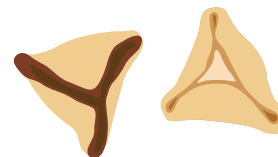
Elizabeth Gregory Home Monthly Second Sunday Lunch

Review: Two Paths to One God: Jews and Christians in Holy Difference

Fifty years ago, the Christian world revolutionized its relationship with the Jewish people by rejecting the teaching of contempt, the belief that Jews were to be blamed for the death of Jesus. This led to a dramatic decrease in Christian antisemitism. But, with antisemitism on the rise, the transformation of Jewish-Christian relations can serve as a model for all of us.

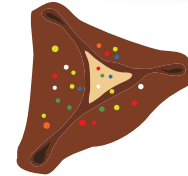

A Message from Director of Education Dr. Eliyahu Krigel, CJE



A Dvar

*"If you will it, it is no dream."
-Theodor Herzl (1860 - 1904)*



When we are successfully able to manifest our dreams, we have the potential to bring what we care most about into the world in a tangible way for all to witness and experience. Herzl's quote above speaks to this strength of will and effort. When I continued my career at HNT on June 1, 2015, one of my attempts to bring my one of my dreams to fruition was to manifest what I had been calling the Bar and Bat Mitzvah Camping Trip. I wanted to bring this informal trip to HNT because I believed in the great potential of the program to engage students on their own level. As you might already know I wrote my thesis for my Masters in Jewish Education on a program I was then calling the Bar and Bat Mitzvah Camping Trip when I was a student at the Jewish Theological Seminary. Since 2000 I have been passionate about creating a retreat experience for middle school students to capture their attention post b'nai mitzvah and engage them, so the learning is meaningful and relevant.

One of the greatest challenges we face in Jewish education is post b'nai mitzvah drop out or disengagement. To combat this trend, we created the Becoming a Leader Trip at HNT. Now in its 8th summer, the trip has become a cornerstone to our youth program. Alumni of the trip return each year because of the connections made and the values of leadership learned and acquired. This year we will spend time at Camp Solomon Schechter on their ropes
