A Message from Rabbi Jacob Herber

In May of 1967 the United Nations Security Council began a crucial debate related to in response to Egypt's diktat to United Nations troops that they leave the Sinai desert and its seizing of the Straits of Tiran, which exposed shipping in the Gulf of Aqaba and the Red Sea to Israel's port city of Eilat. Speaker after speaker from the Arab nations ripped into Israel for its militant approach and for the fact that it continued to exist. Israel, supported by the United States and other countries, tried to stand up to these accusations, and told the United Nations that the decision to close the Straits was a *casus belli* – a cause for war.

On June 5, 1967, Israel launched a defensive, pre-emptive strike. Over the course of six days Israel defeated the armies of Egypt, Syria, and Jordan in a remarkable military victory. For those six days world Jewry tried to follow what was happening in Israel, and Jews around the world came out in masse to both financially and politically support the country as it stood on the precipice of annihilation. When the war was over, we were exuberant. Israel had not only prevailed, but many of the holy cities, including the Old City of Jerusalem, were now in Israel's hands.

This June we'll celebrate the 55th year of the Six Day War and the reunification of Jerusalem. It's a time of celebration, commemoration, and gratitude. On Yom Yerushalayim, the Hebrew calendar date of the event, celebrated on the 28th of Iyar, this year it was on May

19th, when it's customary to recite Hallel as part of our services in recognition of this wonderful moment in history.

But we know that the Six Day War also brought significant political, social, religious, military, and cultural challenges to the State of Israel. Many of those challenges still exist and some of them have gotten worse. Currently, we're far from a peaceful resolution to the Israel-Palestinian conflict. We can only hope and pray that it may come in our lifetime. Israel continues to live in a very dangerous neighborhood, and while we're grateful and thrilled to have returned to the Old City of Jerusalem and to the cities of our ancestors' origin, the challenges of co-existence and peace are real and complex.


We need to teach our young people who weren't alive in 1967 what those days in May and June of that year were all about. We need to give them both the background and the context of the 1947–1967, years when a Palestinian state could have been established without any difficulty, and the hatred and enmity that led to those days of combat in June. At the same time, we need to be responsive to the challenges of today and its complexities. As a people imbued with the religious sensibility to be sensitive to the stranger in our midst, we continue to learn what it means to be a majority in a country, and the responsibility to protect the rights of a minority in our midst. For the first time in 2,000 years

that challenge is very real and significant.

Let's rejoice on these days of June the victory of the Six Day War, let's always recite Hallel on Yom Yerushalyim with a great sense of gratitude, and let's also offer our hopes and prayers for co-existence and peace for our

people and all nations in the region.

May that day soon come and may we be privileged to rejoice in it.

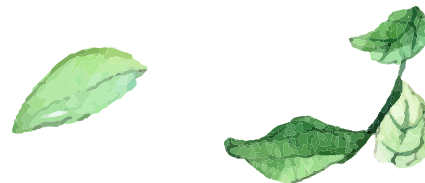

Message from the President



My name is Mickey Friedman, and I am the new President at Herzl Ner-Tamid. (I know it sounds like Michael Douglas in the American President, but there's a point here.) We've been lucky at HNT. The last few HNT leaders – Ilyse Wagner, Zane Brown, Donna Peha, Dan Mintz – have all grown up in Seattle and with HNT. They understand the richness of our history and the importance of keeping traditions while growing with the community. They have done a tremendous job in leading the synagogue with that as a guiding light. I don't come from that background so many of you don't know me or my family. I think I owe you some of my history.

I grew up in Chicago attending a “traditional” synagogue, Congregation Ezras Israel. I lived in Miami Beach (had my bar mitzvah there), New Jersey, New York, and the Bay Area where I met my lovely wife Cathy. We have two grown daughters – Shayna, who lives in Brooklyn, and Rachel, who lives in Australia and was recently married. Rachel and Shayna went to the Jewish Day School where I was on the Board/Executive Committee for ten years. So, I truly understand the value of a Jewish Education, not only for the history, Hebrew, and Chumash but for the values it reinforces. Both of my kids were Bat Mitzvahed here in Seattle at Beth Shalom.

As this is my first column, I want to contribute some insight that has value. That's worth your time to read. That makes you think ... just a little. I'd like to set the tone for how we think about HNT as we transition out of the pandemic and into our new normal. We are fortunate to have an amazing clergy, staff team and lay leaders in the Jewish & secular communities. People who you not only can enjoy at synagogue, but with whom you can share meals, stories and simchas.

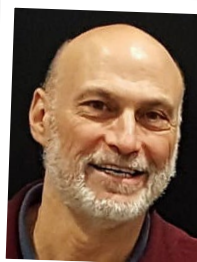

staff, and volunteers. Things we all care about but that are not always visible – such as the Associate Rabbi search, Building status, in-person v. remote activities.

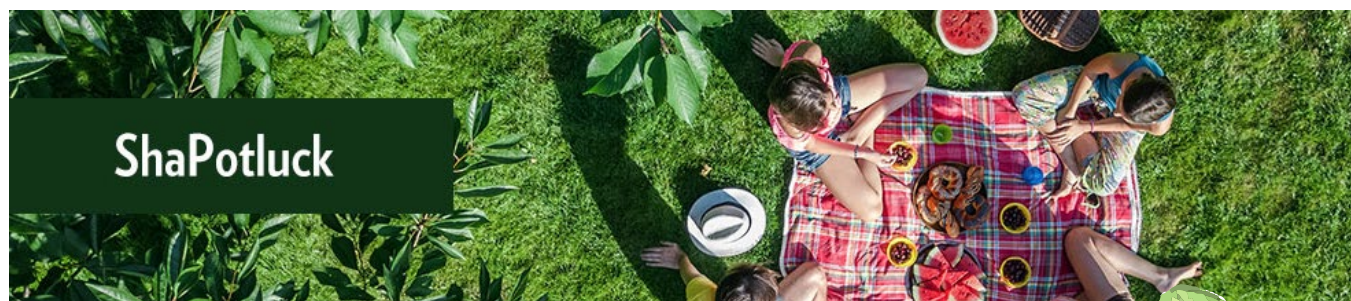
But today I'd like to leave you with one thought: This is your community ... and it's a special one. I know the more HNT becomes part of your everyday living, the richer your life will be.

A Message from Director of Education Dr. Eliyahu Krigel, CJE



A Dvar

“Rav Yosef was Sinai and Raba was one who uproots mountains.”
-Berachot 64a

The Talmud in Berachot 64a portrays the study of Torah in two distinct ways, represented by the way Rav Yosef learns and the way Rabbah learned Jewish text. These two methods of Torah study help us understand what it means to be an effective lay leader and board member. Rav Yosef was able to recall in explicit detail every rabbinic statement without any outside help. Rav Yosef was an erudite scholar who was extremely detailed orientated. He was the personification of Mount Sinai because he remembered the teachings of the tradition exactly as they were and never added anything to them.

Raba embodied the complete opposite characteristic, and he's referred to in the Talmud as an uprooter of mountains, an oker harim. Raba's creative mind was able to turn the sources in a new direction by reevaluating the texts of our tradition. Both qualities, that of Sinai and that of oker harim, have the potential to greatly contribute to preserving the tradition to the next generation. Effective board members and lay leaders like the ones we have at HNT balance the Mt. Sinai aspect of synagogue life with the oker harim drive to uproot and make this world better. Balancing the need to adjust the temperature in the sanctuary with the importance of making a minyan to say Kaddish is what our lay leaders do so eloquently. They acknowledge the importance of the perspectives of both Rav Yosef and Raba. They have all helped us

see through this challenging time of the pandemic with vision and clarity. At times they have had to bring the perspective of Rav Yosef into the process by deciding how and when to plan in-person programming in a deliberate way. They have had to serve in their leadership position in the way Raba represented as well by breaking through new boundaries. They have helped us all to think outside of the box during Covid. We are grateful for their leadership.

To be an effective board member or lay leader like the ones at HNT means to balance your restraint by seeing the big picture, articulating the vision, and implementing the plan. Successful lay leaders find balance in structure. They are able to be in the present and engage in community while also thinking of our future and how best to make an impact. The board of a synagogue helps guide the policies and direction of the community. Each board member selflessly gives of their time and their resources to help and to support. Herzl-Ner Tamid has a long tradition of active lay leadership. For over a century the board of directors at HNT has been filled with thoughtful leaders who have wholeheartedly given, and this year is no exception.

As a new board will begin the initial steps necessary to take the leadership of the synagogue to new heights this summer, we are grateful to the past synagogue board members whose terms concluded last month. Dor L'dor, from one generation to the next, the work of the

HNT board continues to make a significant difference. As our academic year concludes and we usher in a new era of board leadership, I would like to also like to give a heartfelt shout out to one very special board member: our outgoing president Ilyse Wagner. A true leader is a God wrestler who struggles with the real issues of vision, big picture, and process within an organization. For the past two years Ilyse has guided our congregation throughout the pandemic with wisdom and patience. The enduring commitment Ilyse and her family continue to make to the HNT family is so incredible. Her contributions of support and effort are immeasurable. Her mother Pauline Reiter z"l, of blessed memory, was the first female president of the congregation. Pauline took our shul into a new era. 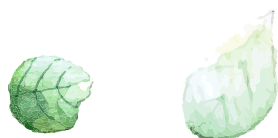

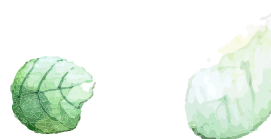
