A Message from Rabbi Jacob Herber

Summer is a wonderful time of year for many. Between the phenomenal summer weather we have here in the Seattle area, school vacations, and more flexible schedules, it can be a time to re-charge our batteries and renew ourselves before Fall rolls around the cycle of the year begins again. Concurrently, the Jewish calendar reminds us that we have a similar opportunity to renew ourselves from a spiritual perspective. On Shabbat, August 27th, the month of Elul will begin. We'll start the daily sounding of the shofar at morning minyan the next day as we anticipate the approach of the High Holidays, a time of renewal. These holidays represent the gateway through which we enter the year – the spiritual context through which we approach our new lease on life.

Around the middle of September, we'll gather again at Herzl-Ner Tamid, take in hand our mahzorim, and engage with the rituals of our most important holidays. The themes of these holy days speak to the very essence of Judaism and to the very nature of what it means to be human. Who are we? What's our purpose? What's the "right" way to live? How can we overcome our shortcomings? By contemplating these self-reflective questions our Sages tell us we can begin the year in the right way. True soul-searching, they teach, leads us toward a deep connection with God. And through such a connection with The Holy One, we can also come to

better understand our relationship with other human beings. The Yamim Noraim (Days of Awe) provide us with an opportunity to renew our focus on the most important matters: on God, our connection to that which is greater than us, on community, our connection to the people who live with us in the here and now. With such a focus, we can truly enter the year with the hope that we can live well and help make the world a better place.

The beauty of every Jewish holiday, including the Yamim Noraim, is that they combine and integrate these two facets of our life, the spiritual and the tangible. Through ritual, study, and prayer we internalize the values we strive to live by, we call attention to the ethics that guide our behavior, and we heighten the awareness of who we are and who we want to be. We strive for a religious practice in which spiritual endeavors lead to tangible action: performance of mitzvot – deeds that help make the world a better place for everyone.

This year, as Elul comes, I invite you to engage in this process of spiritual reflection and to develop your relationship with God and with the Jewish People. In doing so I hope you'll consider what else you can do to renew your commitment to Judaism and our mission of tikkun olam – improving the world. Whether it's reconnecting with the synagogue by returning for in-person services, if your health permits, taking advantage

of an adult education opportunity, incorporating another home ritual, or by performing acts of gemilut hasadim (deeds of loving kindness) with our Social Action Committee, now is the time to reflect and to ready ourselves to make the most of the upcoming new year.

Please note this is the same training offered in February 2022.

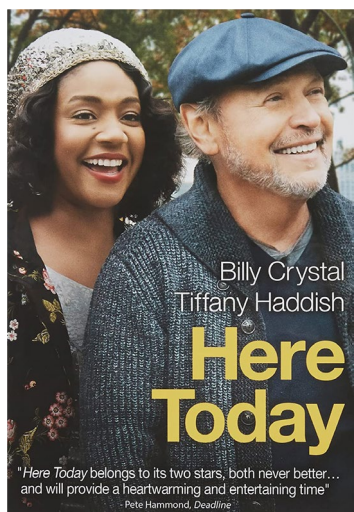

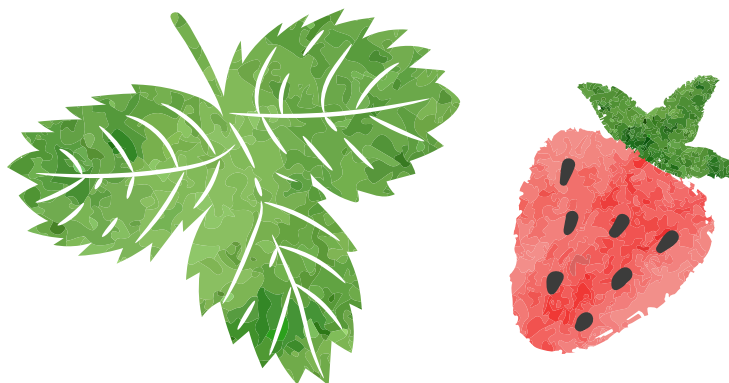

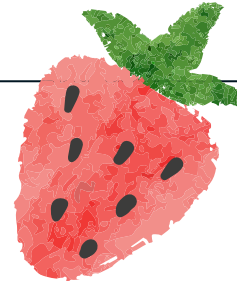
Lilly Miller • August 13

How Shabbat Saved My Brother

I am one of four brothers, number two in the pecking order. My brother Rob is the oldest and acts the part. He is not only a Type A personality, but an extreme Type A. He is very driven, competitive, impatient, and has a strong sense of responsibility. He is also a nice guy and pretty reasonable when you can get him to sit down and chat.

But the combination of hands in lots of pots and being a Type A is a recipe for disaster. He gets stressed ... very stressed. It shows at home, and it shows at work. It's easy to get on his nerves. He has high blood pressure. And he has no release; he doesn't exercise much. This paints the picture of a ticking time bomb.

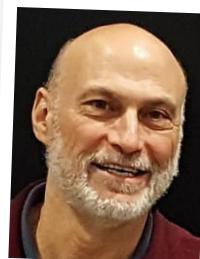
My brilliant sister-in-law (aren't they all) recognized the symptoms. Debbie encouraged hobbies, but he couldn't find the time. She encouraged relaxing dinners at home, but he couldn't find the time. They were already active in their synagogue (they don't live in Seattle). She said, "we're taking the next step – moving within walking distance of the synagogue and becoming shomer shabbas". Their last child had just gone off to college and it was time to downsize, so they could do this pretty easily. And so they did.

The transformation was amazing. No work from Friday sundown to Saturday sundown. Typically, they had friends and family over for Shabbat dinner. Then Saturday morning ... off to services. When I spoke to him, he would say he enjoyed the services, but the chatting with friends after was the best. At the Kiddush, he would often meet new people and

make new friends. And he raved about the cholent; I still don't get how he can eat that. But the best part was he stopped thinking about work and his other activities during the holiday.

Of course, it worked ... otherwise this would be a pretty worthless column. Rob became more relaxed (remember he's still a Type A so there's only so far he can go) and more pleasant to be around. His blood pressure dropped. And he says he's actually more productive at work even though he's spending less hours working. Debbie swears Shabbat saved his life.

You don't need to be a type A or a ticking time bomb to reap the benefits of Shabbat. And you don't need to become shomer shabbas either. Tiptoeing is fine. Call up a friend or two and meet for services on Saturday morning. Email another couple, meet Friday night at HNT, and have 7:30 dinner reservations at a local restaurant. Or just come and get away from it all. Pray with your community. Hear an inspiring, though-provoking sermon. Catch up with friends. Just relax and get away from the rat race. You'll feel better, you'll be happier, and you'll enjoy life more.

Elizabeth Gregory Home Monthly Second Sunday Lunch

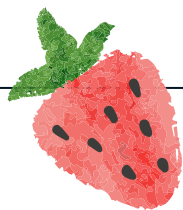

Tutoring/Coaching Opportunities at Leschi Elementary

Over the past 5 years, many of our congregants have enjoyed supporting student learning in literacy and math at Leschi Elementary School in Seattle. While the past two years have primarily been via Zoom, we are hopeful to be back in-person in October. This year we have 3 great opportunities to help students improve their learning skills. If you are interested in exploring any of the 3 choices, please contact Linda Krisher at LROK7@msn.com.

1. Work in a classroom offering student support based on needs identified by the teacher. **Commitment:** a least once a week for an hour or more. You select the subject and grade level, and we match you with a teacher.
2. **Reading Partners:** A national literacy program for students in grades K-4 performing 6 months to 2.5 years below grade level. No educational experience is necessary as all tools and planning are provided. **Commitment:** Several hours of training with access to a Mac or PC computer for online work. One-on-one work with student twice per week for an hour. There may be a once-a-week option. Meet with on-site coordinator weekly to provide notes and review planning for next session. In-person and online options may be available.
3. **NEW this year....Math Agency:** You can read more about them in this recent [Seattle Times article](#). They provide a fun and exciting small-group math program with games, competitions, and a focus on measurable impact on students. We're looking for volunteer math coaches to help support the program. The Math Agency will provide all of the training and tools you need to help make your students successful from Day 1. **Commitment:** approximately 10 hours of initial training, 1 hour/week of ongoing training, and 2-3 hours/week of student coaching. After school opportunities are available.

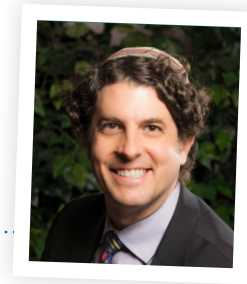

A Message from Director of Education Dr. Eliyahu Krigel, CJE



A Dvar

“Put yourselves into groups to occupy yourselves with the Torah, for the Torah can only be acquired in company.”

-Berachot 63b:12

Learning Torah is a collaborative endeavor. The reference in the Talmud above reminds us of the importance of working together when in the process of engaging with our most holy texts. We learn Torah at FRS in groups and pairs in order to sharpen our understanding of what the sources are teaching us. When we are in chavruta or pairs learning Torah, we are able to understand where the other person is coming from when we approach the learning with humility and sincerity. Thanks to the generosity of the Samis Foundation, we will now be able to collaboratively learn Torah in two ways this year through the following two programs they are now supporting:

1. **The Jewish Education Directors’ Institute: Ongoing Professional Development for Seattle Educators:** The JEDI is the collaborative group of full-time educators in Seattle, from across the state, and from all the denominations as well. Membership is complimentary. The group is facilitated by the educators present at the meeting. We meet once a month to collaborate and learn together. This group has taken on a special meaning during the pandemic by providing us with the opportunity to be together in good company and learn. New this year thanks to the Samis Foundation is that the JEDI educators will be supported in our professional development

work for the next three years. This coming up year, two cutting edge Jewish organizations will be working with the JEDI educators to occupy ourselves with learning Torah. Tzedek America (www.tzedekamerica.org) and Jewish Learning Works (<https://jewishlearning.works/>) with now be working with the JEDI group in an immersive manner starting in the fall for the duration of the academic school year. Tzedek America transforms lives, strengthens Jewish identity, and changes the world through immersive social justice-oriented experiences. They are experts in the field of informal Jewish education and have extensive background in experiential education. Jewish Learning Works elevates the field of Jewish education by nurturing educators, inspiring innovation, and building Jewish literacy. These two groups will be working with the JEDI educators on learning Torah in a collaborative fashion in order to infuse our communities with support and depth of learning based on Jewish experiential education.

2. **Kehillah Kedoshah: Middle/High School Leadership Trip from August 23-25:** Thanks to the incredible support of the Samis Foundation, we will now be able to offer this trip for the following three years. Kehillah Kedoshah: Middle/High School Leadership Trip is the new Becoming a Leader Trip at HNT open to the community. The trip is focused

on middle school students and led by high school students. We're scheduled to go [White Water River Rafting](#) on the Upper Skagit followed by spending meaningful time at [Camp Solomon Schechter](#) on the ropes course and waterfront. High school students receive 24 hours of community service for their efforts in helping to facilitate the trip. Alumni of the trip are welcome to participate. Thank you to the Samis Foundation helping to support this experiential trip. As a result of the generosity of the Samis Foundation, HNT was able to offer a very reduced price to both HNT students and students of non HNT members. Open to the community. 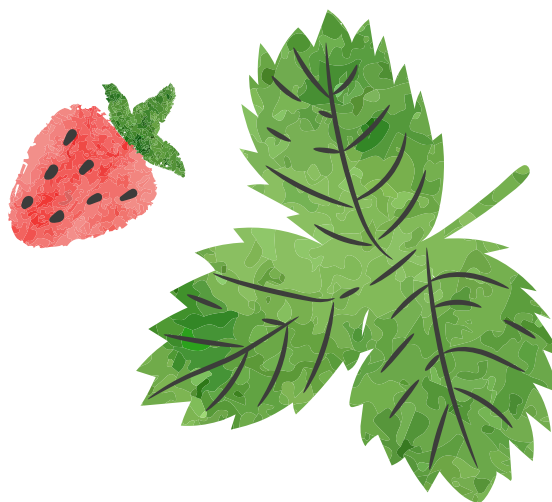

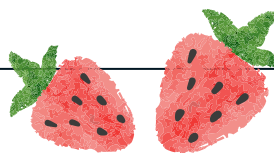
