A Message from Rabbi Jacob Herber



Rabbi Jacob Herber

According to the halakhic midrash known as the Sifra, and repeated in the Talmud, there is disagreement about the purpose of dwelling in sukkot, booths, during the Festival of Sukkot. One sage, Rabbi Eliezer, states that the sukkot the Israelites inhabited during their journey through the wilderness were actual booths. These dwellings protected them from the harsh elements of the desert, the heat during the day, and the cold at night. Rabbi Akiva, on the other hand, disagrees. He suggests the sukkot were clouds of glory. In other words, it wasn't the physical presence of the booths that protected Israelites during their desert experience, it was God's saving grace and protective spirit.

It's apparent that we need both teachings. We require the ability to protect ourselves, to make sure that we and our families are safe in a way that gives us a feeling of security. But at the very same time, we need God's protective care to live life to its fullest and to appreciate all of the gifts that are manifest in our world.

The holiday of Sukkot enables us to celebrate and perpetuate both ideas. We leave our permanent dwellings and move outside to these temporary booths to enjoy the beauty of nature. We're also cognizant of the vagaries of nature that may bring weather which

won't be conducive to our sitting in the sukkah. We need both God's protecting care and our own ability to care for ourselves to enjoy life and its gifts.

I hope you'll celebrate Sukkot with us at HNT. I also want to encourage you to build your own sukkah, to use the lulav and etrog as a symbol of the harvest season, to enjoy the many Sukkot related activities you'll find in our Frankel Religious School, in our congregation, and in our USY/Kadima communities so that the holiday of Sukkot, will truly be Zeman Simhateinu – "The time of our joy and gladness."

Wishing you and your loved ones a joyful Sukkot. May it be a time of health, peace, security, and contentment for all.

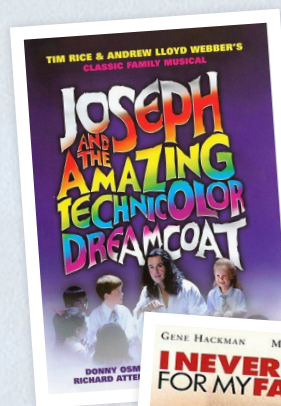

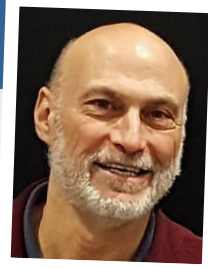
