assover beckons us to contemplate the existential meaning of freedom and liberation. By way of food, wine, and prayer the *Seder* takes us back to an ancient time and place. Passover, however, isn't just history. Like all our rituals, *Pesah* encourages us to think about ourselves and our own limitations.

Egypt is known in Hebrew as *Mitzrayim*. According to the Zohar, Judaism's most important mystical work, *Mitzrayim* is derived from *m'tzarim*, which means "narrow straits" (mi, "from," tzar, "narrow" or "tight"). So the Exodus celebrates our removal from the place of constricted opportunities, tight control, and narrow-mindedness, the place where movement and thought were severely limited.

All of us dwell in our own *mitzrayim*, the external or physical narrow straits of financial or health limitations or, maybe, personal tragedy and travail. Like the dual nature in virtually all of Passover's symbols, they work in two ways. They turn us into both slaves and oppressors, of ourselves and others. Passover leads us on a spiritual journey to question the values and attitudes to which we subscribe, and which hold us to those roles. Unfortunately, the more constrained we are, the more likely we are to

oppress others. The oppressed, far too often, turn into tormentors.

What constrained Pharaoh? His own ego, which led him to destroy everything he valued, his family and himself. His own officials recognized the catastrophe his attitude brought. "Let the men go," they advised him. "Don't you realize that Egypt is being destroyed?" (Exodus 10:7) The problem was his arrogance simply got in his way.

People don't like change because it's hard. Pharaoh decides to let the people go and then each time he changed his mind. After the plague passed, he withdrew his permission. We do the same. We pledge ourselves to positive change, but once the crisis has passed, we go back to same old destructive habits. Barely a week out of Egypt, and the Israelites were ready to forego freedom and return to slavery. They yearned for the comfort of a familiar evil over fear of the unknown.

Ironically slavery offers a kind of freedom that can be attractive: freedom from responsibility for ourselves and for others, freedom from having to establish goals or to think beyond the moment. It's human nature to want to stay put within the stability of the status quo.

The danger is that in those situations we often don't know that we're mired in a negative situation, and we don't realize our peril until it's too late. We delude ourselves by saying we'll look for a better job, sign up for community service, be much nicer to the people in our lives. Jacob never intended to make *Mitzrayim* his home. His sojourn there ended up having catastrophic consequences for his people. At *Pesah* we should at acknowledge inertia for what it is and not lull ourselves into complacency about our situation or that of others.

Passover, with its message of hope, reminds us that, like the ancient Israelites we can escape from our

straits. Once they tasted freedom by way of the paschal lamb, they gave up the comfort of the familiar. Without concern for supplies of food and other items necessary for a long, successful trek to freedom they left Egypt with faith because they believed a better life awaited them somewhere else. As Rabbi Nachman of Breslov once taught, when you are about to leave "mitzrayim" you should not worry about how you will manage in a new "place."

I want to wish you and your loved ones a very Happy Passover,


