A Message from Rabbi Jacob Herber



Rabbi Jacob Herber

s my colleague, Rabbi Alan Lucas, teaches in *The Observant Life: The Wisdom of Life for Conservative Judaism for Contemporary Jews,* "... Shavuot celebrates the 'the single greatest event' in Jewish history. Shavuot is the holiday that reminds us that faith in the truth of revelation is at the heart of all legitimate varieties of Judaism and Jewish identity."

These are concepts and ideas that are difficult for us to comprehend in our scientific age. Nevertheless, they form the foundation of the Jewish way of life and Judaism's value system. The corpus of rabbinic and medieval Jewish literature reflects many views related to revelation. No one view is totally representative of them all. These views range the Jerusalem Talmud (Hagigah 1:7) which states: "Even what an experienced student in the future is going to teach before his master already has been stated to Moses at Sinai," to Naftali Tzvi Horowitz of Ropshitz who, quoting his teacher, Rabbi Menachem Mendel of Rymanov [d. 1850] taught, "It was possible that we heard from the mouth of the Holy One, blessed by He, only the letter aleph *anokhi*," that is, the first letter of the word of the first commandment.

In between these two poles are a plethora of opinions about what occurred at Mount Sinai and the content of revelation. Based on these opinions, we can readily see that Jewish theology is varied in its opinion, and the streams of Judaism have based their understanding of Jewish law, customs, and ceremonies on this issue.

Shavuot encourages us to think about the event at Mount Sinai and to examine what effect it has in our lives. While it's difficult for many of us to adequately approach these concepts, it's important, nonetheless, that we try.


