
Goldie Lackman • June 3


Helen Fishman • June 17




Issac Alpert • June 24

Get to Know the HNT Clergy

Rabbi Jacob Herber - Senior Rabbi



Rabbi Jacob Herber joined HNT as Senior Rabbi in August 2020, and loves being a pulpit rabbi. He began his rabbinate as the Assistant and then Senior Rabbi of Har Zion Temple in Philadelphia. Rabbi Herber was then blessed to serve as the spiritual leader of Congregation Beth Israel Ner Tamid, Milwaukee, Wisconsin's only USCJ affiliated congregation, for 15 years. In 2018 he was invited to join the staff of The Shalom Hartman Institute, North America, where he worked on the Institute's national rabbinical programs and taught rabbis of all denominations how to teach "Hartman's Torah."

A big believer in giving back to his community, Rabbi Herber has served on the Nominations Committee of The Rabbinical Assembly and the Boards of Directors of the National Rabbinic Cabinet of State of Israel Bonds, Masorti Olami, the Milwaukee Jewish Federation, and as a member of the Clergy Auxiliary Board of the Milwaukee Jewish Free Loan Association. Currently he serves as a member of The Rabbinical Assembly's Executive Council, Strategic Plan Implementation Leadership Team, and Chair of the Commission for a Vital and Connected Rabbinate, overseeing 10 committees charged with transforming the RA into a relationship-based international organization. Rabbi Herber's work in promoting interfaith dialogue has taken him from the United States to Mexico, Germany and Poland.

Rabbi Herber received his Bachelor of Arts degree in History, cum laude, from the University of California, Davis, and his Master of Arts degree in Jewish Studies and his rabbinic ordination from The Jewish Theological Seminary. In 2010 Rabbi Herber was admitted to The Shalom Hartman Institute's highly selective and rigorous Religious Leadership Initiative (RLI) rabbinical fellowship program. He graduated in 2013 and was named a Senior Rabbinic Fellow of the Shalom Hartman Institute. Rabbi Herber received his honorary Doctorate of Divinity degree from The Jewish Theological Seminary at a Convocation on Monday, December 5, 2022.

Rabbi Herber is blessed with two children. Mychal is a graduate of Dickinson College and lives in Washington, D.C. where she works as a press officer at the Embassy of the State of Israel. Adin is currently doing real estate in Nevada.

He is a former competitive cyclist and raced for the Endeavour and ISCorp cycling teams. Today, he simply enjoys riding his bike, cross country (skate) skiing in Winter, reading books, playing his Fender Strat, and sharing his spare time with his loving dog, Reggie. A native New Yorker, Rabbi Herber is passionate about his New York Yankees, New York Rangers and is also an enormous supporter of the English Premier League's Chelsea Football Club.

Rabbi Jay Rosenbaum - Rabbi Emeritus



Rabbi Rosenbaum became HNT's Rabbi Emeritus in July 2019 after serving as HNT's spiritual leader since 2002. He has been connected to the Seattle-area for a very long time. His wife, Janine was born and raised in Seward Park. He's also an unabashed fan of the Seattle Mariners who frequently uses baseball analogies in his sermons.


Rabbi's vision for Herzl-Ner Tamid is a congregation that is vibrant, warm, welcoming and that has the ability to convey excitement about Jewish living to Jews of all ages. His innovative programming over the years has included our Rhythm & Jews musical Shabbat service, Torahthon, rock-musical Purim Shpiels from Game of Cohens to Blazing Shrudels, Sukkah Building at Home Depot, The Iron Mensch, Men Cooking for Shabbat, Lag B'Omer Bonfire, Make a Lulav Shake, and Sneak into Shul on Yom Kippur. He has led 3 HNT Israel trips and created a Muslim/Jewish dialogue group that has been going strong since 2012.

With degrees from NYU (1972), Rutgers University (1974) and Jewish Theological Seminary (1980), Rabbi Rosenbaum has more than thirty-six years of rabbinical experience. He has distinguished himself as a man of creativity, passion and compassion with innovative programming that both engages and educates.



A Message from Interim Head of School Irit Eliav Levin



Growing up in South Florida, my synagogue was my home away from home. It was where I learned, from my preschool days to the leadership training I received through my years as a Madricha (helper) in the Religious School and as Chapter President and then a Regional Board Member in USY. It was where I made friends, my Hebrew School and USY friends built memories that have lasted a lifetime (and some remain good friends to this day). The adults in the building were my role models - Hebrew School teachers who took the time to really get to know me, my youth advisor whose wise advice I still follow, and the synagogue office administrator who was like another grandmother to all of the students.

I know I am not alone in feeling this way. Synagogues have been called a Beit Midrash - a house of learning, a Beit Knesset - a house of gathering, a Beit Am - a house of the people.... For generations, Jews have walked into synagogues around the world and found a way to make it our home. In my early twenties, I visited a synagogue in Portugal for a lovely Shabbat service and dinner. Though I spoke no Portuguese and they spoke little English, I immediately felt at home with the familiar melodies and delicious food. The matchmakers in the building immediately got to work, pointing out the unmarried young men at the dinner to me and my

friend Rebecca, never mind the distance and language barriers.

If I had to sum up in one sentence why my husband and I joined Herzl-Ner Tamid, it would be simply: "We wanted our children to have a Jewish community, a place where they felt at home." That is my goal, not only for my own three children, but for the children of HNT as a whole. It is why I was honored when the board asked me to step in for this interim year, to help as we set the path for the future of the Frankel Religious School and the HNT community as a whole. Watching my children run to play with their friends at Shabbat dinner or waving happily as they walk into their Hebrew School classrooms, I know we are succeeding in many ways.

We have a tremendous community, full of dedicated staff and extraordinary volunteers who are constantly working to make our dreams for HNT a reality. I am here to listen and welcome any suggestions or feedback you have to share. Please feel free to reach out anytime. I look forward to a wonderful and exciting year ahead.
