A Message from Rabbi Jacob Herber



In today's contemporary society many will ask, "What or how do you feel?" Rarely are we asked, "What do you think?" So, I pose this question to you: What do you believe?

Words like "belief and faith" are generally viewed with suspicion. Many think these words smack of blind trust and naiveté. After all, faith is understood to be the essential and indispensable core value of Christianity, not Judaism. But the fact remains, we do have normative beliefs for which we have no reason to deny. Our beliefs don't have to be blind. They can be both meaningful and rational. Rabbi Abba Hillel Silver, one of America's great rabbis wrote the following essay on his beliefs as a Jew. He famously wrote these words, initially, for a sermon he delivered on February 1, 1920. I have a feeling you'll find them as meaningful and compelling as I do:

"I believe in myself. I believe in the dignity and the nobility of the soul, which God has implanted within me. Even as I believe in myself, I believe in my fellow men, for they are like unto me in gifts and capacities. I believe in work. I believe in the adventure of life. I believe in saving my soul from wealth and from poverty, and from all the physical circumstances of life. They must not touch my soul. I believe in never growing old. I believe in never growing surfeited with life, in never drinking too greedily and hastily of the cup of life. I believe in

disciplining myself to hunger for things. I believe that I owe a debt to my God and my fellowmen for the soul, which God has given me and for the education which society has afforded me. I believe in service, first as a payment of a just debt, and secondly, as the only avenue by which men and women can ever find or ever have found real soul contentment and happiness. I do not believe in being ordinary and average and commonplace. The one ambition of my mortal days would be to break through all the confining circumstances of my world to rise above the dead level of mediocrity, and to raise others; to lead, even as I first am content to follow, to be a pathfinder, to blaze a trail through life..."

Despite all of the gratuitous hatred, all of the brutality, all of the lies, all of the antisemitism that we have witnessed and suffered here, in Israel, and in other parts of the world, I still believe in the goodness of people and in the triumph of truth and righteousness over selfishness and deceit. As Dr. Martin Luther King, Jr., whose birthday we celebrated last month, once said, "I believe that the ark of history bends toward Justice." It can be hard to hold on those concepts, especially during difficult times like the one in which we're living, but it's imperative if we hope to hold on and overcome.

Celebrating The Remarkable Contributions of Linda and Efrem Krisher: The 2024 Bob Zimmerman Community Leadership Award Recipients

In the vibrant tapestry of Herzl-Ner Tamid and the broader Jewish community, Linda and Efrem Krisher stand as pillars of unwavering commitment and leadership. Linda, a Seattle native, has been a member of HNT since the tender age of six, growing up in its halls having attended religious school through her high school years and celebrating her Bat Mitzvah, forging a profound connection to her Jewish roots. Linda and Efrem met at Hillel in Seattle, got married at HNT, and, except for seven years in upstate New York, have been steadfast members of HNT. She and Efrem, celebrating their 50th milestone anniversary, recently chose to commemorate this joyous occasion with their HNT family during a beautiful kiddush luncheon.

Synagogue life has always been central to Linda and Efrem's way of life, transcending geographical boundaries. Together, Linda and Efrem share a common refrain - "HNT is our community and what keeps us connected." And, family is the cornerstone of their values, deeply intertwined with their Jewish identity. With three children and four grandchildren, their grandchildren mark the fifth generation at HNT.

Linda, as a young mom, was involved in the Sisterhood, Torah Fund, and served on the education committee at HNT. Serving on the Board of Directors for six years, Linda has also been a key figure behind various initiatives, including her role as B'nai Mitzvah scheduler and her significant contributions to the Social Action Committee. Linda is the driving force behind HNT's work with Leschi Elementary School serving as the liaison, coordinating tutors, obtaining grant money for Leschi's students in need, and organizing both winter coat drives and backpack supply drives.

She also established the weekly Needle Arts Affinity Group at HNT, volunteers on the Reengagement Task Force's Membership Working Group, and helped to start the Pray, Eat, and Play Club. Linda is a member of the Women's League Book Club and has also co-chaired HNT's Rivkin SummeRun team.

Outside the synagogue, Linda's impact extends into the broader community. With a master's degree in special education, she served as the Director of the Learning Resource Center at the Jewish Day School as well as serving in other administrative and teaching capacities for an impressive 19 years. She worked as a preschool

teacher at the SJCC when her children were young and spent a few years subbing shortly after retiring. Linda is a member of the Holocaust Center and the City of Hope as well as a lifelong member of Hadassah, currently serving as editor of the monthly newsletter.

Efrem's journey is equally profound. From his teenage years involved in synagogue life in New York to being president of the Jewish Society at New York Maritime College, Efrem's commitment to Jewish life and leadership has been steadfast. His active duty service as a Commissioned Officer for NOAA led to global connections, marveling at the interconnectedness of shared Jewish experiences even miles away from home.

Efrem has been on both the HNT board and the Executive Committee, and serves on numerous committees such as Ritual, Legal and Governance, and Security and Safety. He is an integral part of the Minyanaires, is a Mashgiach, and has been a vital part of services for many years having taken on responsibilities such as reading Torah, Haftarah, and davening for HNT. Efrem is one of our wonderful lay leaders who has stepped up to fill the void left by our beloved Cantor Kurland z"l, never turning down the opportunity to help lead Shabbat services. Efrem was President of the HNT Men's Club, and is a student in HNT's modern Hebrew class.

Together, Linda and Efrem's community impact extends to contributing to Teen Feed, men's shelter meals, refugee family projects, and serving as greeters for Shabbat. As part of a long-standing Havurah at HNT, Linda and Efrem, along with cherished friends, have gathered monthly to study, share meals, and build lasting bonds.

Their narrative transcends decades, and in their leadership and dedication, Linda and Efrem Krisher embody the timeless spirit of Jewish continuity and community. 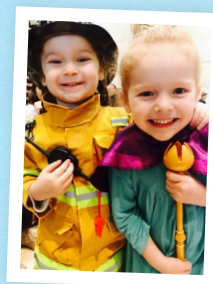
There will also be an option to reciprocate gifts-to ensure that you send Michloah Manot to anyone who sent to you, even if you forgot them on your list.

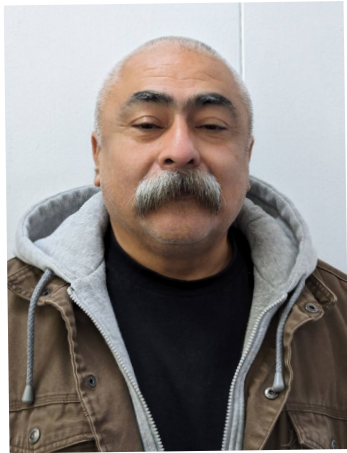

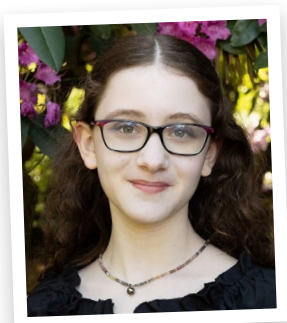

Message From the President

What is the Bob Zimmerman Community Leadership Award?

It has been a number of years since Bob Zimmerman z”l passed. Those of us who remember him know what a fixture he was at HNT and how he truly personified the values we try to emulate at HNT. His impact was so great that we created and named the annual Community Leadership Award after him. But over time, it’s easy to forget what Bob and the award represent. So, I want to take a few minutes to describe for you its importance and why I feel so good about this year’s recipients of the award – Efrem and Linda Krisher.

Let me take you back a month or so to Saturday, December 23rd. I walked into the synagogue expecting a low turnout. After all, it was winter break. Many families were fleeing out of town and snowbirds had already made their way to Palm Springs and other warm climates.

Surprisingly, the seats were filling up, and the air buzzed with excitement. It dawned on me – it was the Krishers’ 50th anniversary, drawing Shabbat regulars, family, and friends to celebrate this milestone. And a celebration it was! Linda and Efrem took center stage on the bimah, weaving tales of their journey from how they first met to their marriage officiated by Rabbi Pomerantz and Cantor Frankel z”l to how their children – Rivka, Josh, and Miriam – grew up within the HNT community. Then Efrem regaled us with beautiful torah and haftarah readings. The celebration continued with a delightful kiddush, a fitting tribute sponsored by the Krishers.

Several people came up to me afterward expressing not just how nice the service was, but how special it was for us, as a community, to share such a beautiful simcha together.

Fast forward a few weeks. The idea of honoring the Krishers with the Bob Zimmerman Community Leadership Award surfaced, and it felt exactly right. Thinking about the award ... it reminds all of us what it takes to build and sustain what we value in a caring community. It is a statement of our values honoring the past as well as recognizing what we wish for in the future. Bob embodied what we value today and hope to pass on to future generations. This award now found new ambassadors in Efrem and Linda.

Their journey at HNT goes beyond spiritual nourishment; it’s a deep-rooted connection that spans five decades. Both have been active Board members. Linda has been active in the Sisterhood and Social Action Committee, coordinated tutoring at Leschi Elementary, co-chaired our team for the Rivkin SummeRun for Ovarian Cancer Research, started the needle art affinity group

that meets weekly, started the Pray, Eat, and Play (PEP) club for after Shabbat Services, been part of an HNT Havurah for years, and been a member of the Women’s League Book Club.

Efrem has been very active in the lay leadership of the synagogue. Besides being on the Board and Executive Committee, Efrem has served on the Legal & Governance, Security & Safety, Endowment, and Ritual Committees. He is an active member of the morning minyan and regularly reads Torah and haftarah during services. He is also a trained Mashgiach helping us out in the kitchen when needed. And that just touches the surface.

As you can see, Linda and Efrem are not passive members; they demonstrate active leadership. Never part of the problem; always part of the solution. And that is why we wish to honor Efrem and Linda as they truly represent those values.

But there was still the ask. As a humble couple, would they be willing to accept this very public honor?

I had to connect with both of them and really preferred to speak with them in person. That Thursday morning, I was meeting with Merav to discuss the usual 50 or so topics. I mentioned to Merav that we were hoping to honor the Krishers with the Bob Zimmerman Community Leadership Award. Merav told me: “There is no need to give them a call. It’s a Thursday. Linda is down in the boardroom with the other knitters & crocheters, and Efrem is in the kitchen as the supervising Mashgiach.” Not surprisingly, they were both at the synagogue just doing what they do. And it was such a pleasure asking them ... they were so humble and truly honored.

The Gadol Gala on March 17th promises a night of fun, entertainment, and auctions. More importantly, it’s an opportunity to honor the Krishers as this year’s recipients of the Bob Zimmerman Community Leadership Award. Join us in celebrating their values, and if you can’t attend, consider donating in their honor.

Congratulations to Linda and Efrem – the heart and soul of HNT. I look forward to seeing you all at the Gadol Gala, where we can collectively applaud their incredible journey.

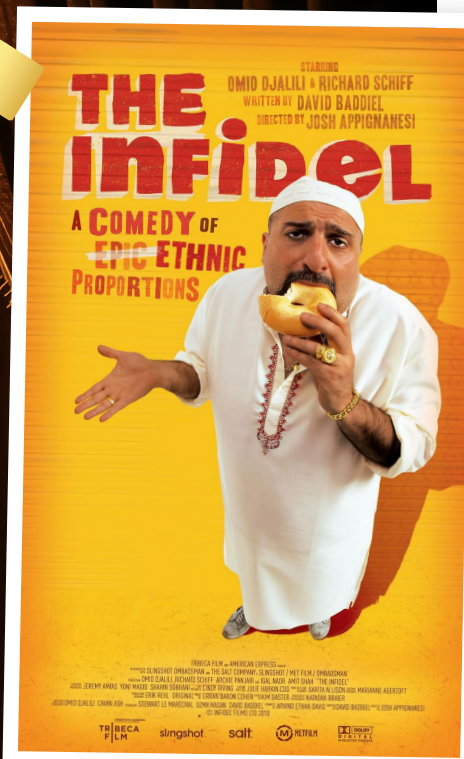
HNT's in-house caterer, Lirit Maslan Ziv of Purple Beet Catering, will prepare the meal for this special program.

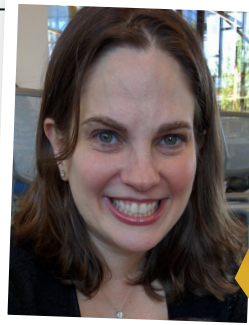
A Message from Interim Head of School Irit Eliav Levin

The Power of a Name

Over the last few weeks, several of our Frankel Religious School classes have been doing projects to help students learn more about their names, both English and Hebrew. It is incredible to watch the faces of the students light up as they share about the great-grandparent or other family member for whom they were named. I love hearing the stories of how parents chose the names that they did, the love and thought and care that went into the decision.

In traditional Ashkenazi fashion, my children are each named for a great-grandparent (and one great-uncle) who passed away. (Sephardim traditionally name their children after relatives who are still alive.) As my husband and I thought about the names we were choosing, we reflected on the values and characteristics of our loved ones that we hoped we would pass on to our children. My grandfather, Aaron, was a man who was known for his incredible kindness (even if that kindness didn't exactly make him the savviest business owner.) My husband's grandfather, Sumner, had a great sense of humor and a strong commitment to take care of his family. My grandmother, Maria, who despite her very non-Jewish name (interesting story for another time), had a deep love of Israel and the Jewish people. These were the types of values we wanted our children to hold dear.

Thinking about names has also led me to reflect on the name of our sacred community and the lessons I think



previous generations of HNT members would want us to uphold and fulfill. Theodor Herzl was, of course, the founder of modern Zionism. One of his most famous quotes is "If you will it, it is no dream." His dream of a modern state of Israel has been fulfilled, in a way that probably exceeds his wildest expectations. And though both Israel and the Jewish people as a whole are struggling with immense pain, sadness, and fear right now, his legacy reminds us that the dream of a peaceful land and time must continue to be a goal that we work towards together.

The *Ner Tamid*, the eternal flame, reminds us that God is always nearby. We are each made *B'tzelem Elohim*, in the Divine image. As the Torah commands us, we have built a sanctuary that God may dwell among us. And we are continuing to build, with exciting plans rapidly coming to life to make our dream of a new building on Barnabee Point a reality and new ideas and programs coming to life all the time.

Our names help us carry the dreams and values of our ancestors into the future. But they require us all to contribute our own vision, dedication, and hard work to make them happen. Let's work together to continue to make HNT a place where dreams come true.

On Dec. 24th and 25th many dozens of us came together to provide festive meals for the men at the PorchLight men's shelter (formerly Congregations for the Homeless). Generous donations, including the *HNT Pay It Forward Fund* also provided much needed commercial-sized kitchen equipment and winter clothing.

But, really why do these meals? It's just a meal here and there and the needle that measures systemic poverty and homelessness entrenched by untreated mental illness, opioid addiction and underemployment does not move with our home-made delicacies.
