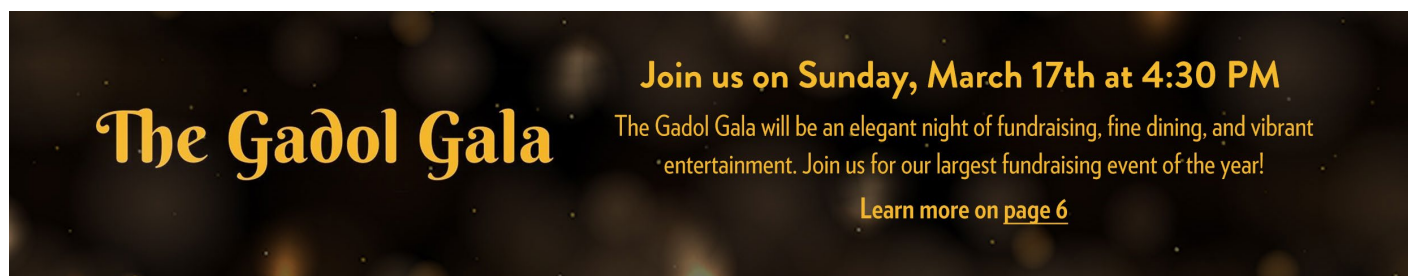




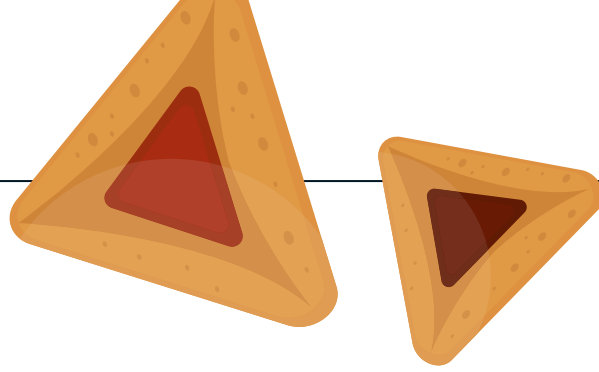

# A Message from Rabbi Jacob Herber



Jewish holidays never seem to be at the right time. For Rabbis this very true when it comes to Rosh Hashanah and Yom Kippur! This year, the former falls in October. Passover is also very late in April. This year there's a very good reason for the "tardiness" of the holidays. 5784 is a Jewish leap year where we have not one, but two Hebrew months of Adar. When this happens, Purim is always celebrated in the second Adar.

According to our Sages, when the month of Adar arrives, "*Mi she nikhnas Adar, marbim b'simha*," "Whoever brings in the month of Adar increases joy" (Talmud Bavli, Ta'anit 29a). Some understand this to mean that we're commanded to enter the month of Adar with extra joy. This injunction begins at Adar 1, meaning that leap years require an entire month of elevated joy. In mid-January, as the war in Israel continued a pace, my rabbinic colleagues (Rabbinical Assembly) and I met to discuss how we would bring joy for Adar and for Purim this very difficult year. The Jewish people have celebrated Purim during many times of great challenge, so we talked about what our ancestors had done at times of peril. We also turned to our Israeli colleagues for guidance to see how they were feeling and to learn how they were planning to observe the holiday. Of course, we had no idea when we convened, nor do I now as I write this message, what the situation will be in Israel in late March or how the rest of the Jewish world will encounter the ever-rising evil of Antisemitism. The questions remain. Will Israel still be at war? Will there still be hostages in Gaza? Will our community still be the target of bigotry and hatred? Is it possible the world will be on a path toward healing?

Purim is the quintessential holiday where we celebrate the triumph of the Jewish people over those who sought to

commit genocide against us. We theologically link Haman back to Amalek and then forward to those who have sought to destroy us in every generation. Change just one letter in the name "Haman," and you get "Hamas." This year Purim is extraordinarily difficult, even for someone like me who loves this holiday like no other. Demanding that we be joyful seems particularly tough. Nevertheless, Purim comes at the end of March, and we will celebrate, maybe in more muted ways, but we will celebrate the endurance of our people throughout our history to overcome circumstances. I don't read *Megillat Esther* as an historical account. Instead, I see it as a paradigmatic and hopeful story about a time when the Jewish People triumphed over those who sought, and still seek, to destroy us.

Purim is a win over Haman and all forces that wanted to wipe our people out. A problem is that in the Purim story we celebrate victory after the threat is over. Now, we're literally living that threat. It feels conflicted, complicated, and unsettling to celebrate while that threat continues. And yet throughout Jewish history, our people celebrate Purim and look to a time when our People will be safe.

One of the most powerful moments in the Purim narrative occurs when Esther invites all of the people to fast and to pray with her before she goes to King Ahasverosh to seek their deliverance. It was a time of great uncertainty about the Jewish People's future. Queen Esther calls her people to come together – as a community – for prayer and fasting. It's this part of the story of when Esther reminds us that there is strength in coming together, especially at times of uncertainty.

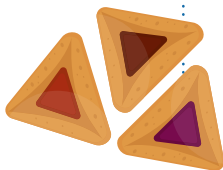

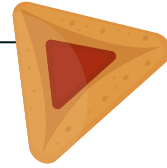

# Message From the President

## There Are Good People Out There

**I**t's been very challenging at HNT since the High Holidays. The war in Israel. Vandalism at our safe place. So, it's great when you get truly uplifted. I heard a heartwarming, feel good story that did just that for me ... and I think you'll appreciate it.

Ilene Sloan, the Board's Executive VP, was spending her Sunday, like most days over the last few months, working on the Gadol Gala. Ilene, like the Gala co-chairs Kara Schultz, Kathy Packer, Sarah Hasson, the staff, and many others, have been putting in ridiculous hours to ensure the success of the Gala. This Sunday was family day. Ilene received the gracious support from her husband Garrett and daughter Gemma who accompanied her on the day's escapades.

The first stop was the Dollar Tree in Issaquah to pick up 30 vases ... all they had in inventory. This was the second Dollar Tree visited as Ilene and Garrett cleaned out all available vases at the previous one. These vases are part of the beautiful decoration plan for the Gala. Like most aspects of the Gala, the volunteer team is being creative and working hard on keeping costs down so a high percentage of money received goes directly to HNT's operations and targeted projects.

Ilene, Garrett, and Gemma filled up multiple shopping carts and got in line to check out. In front of Garrett were two charming elderly ladies.

One turned to Garrett and said, "What are all those vases for?"

Garrett replied, "a synagogue fundraiser."

The woman looks totally dejected. She says, "I'm not Jewish, but I just thought that was awful. Is the synagogue still damaged?"

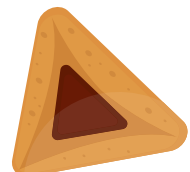
Ilene says, "There's still more cleanup and repair work to do but we're getting there."

They never match up without a lot of work, and we really need membership support, financial and otherwise, to make this happen.

Free during the day? Join us for good conversation, tasty lunch, and a Jewish-themed film!

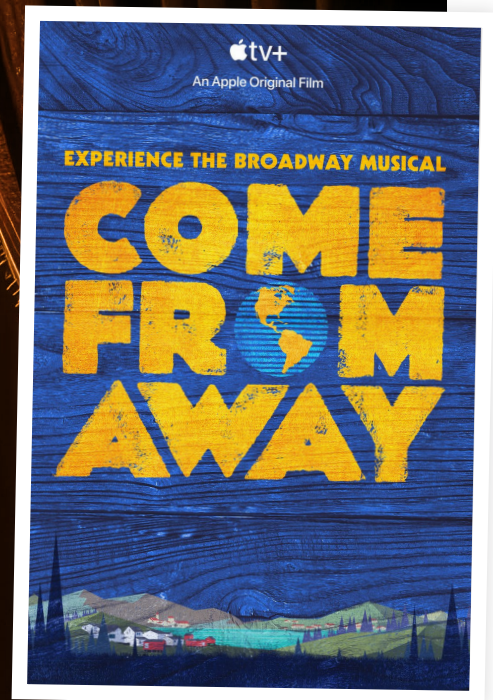

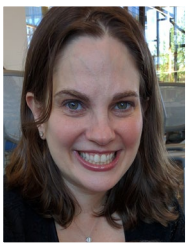

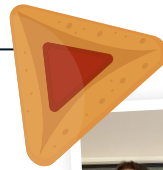

## A Message from Interim Head of School Irit Eliav Levin



In the last few weeks, my family has lost two incredible people who were very important to me. I hope you'll forgive the indulgence as I take this opportunity to share with you a little about their stories. As you'll see, they were both individuals who very much modeled the values that we hope to teach here in the Frankel Religious School.

The first person was my husband's grandmother, Amalia "Lica" Ella Rosenzweig. Lica was a survivor of a concentration camp in Transnistria (as was her husband). Her family lost everything in the war. After liberation, she carried her mother on her back for miles to help get her to safety. She came to America from Romania with her three children, including my mother-in-law, Susie. Despite everything that she had been through, or perhaps because of it, Lica always treated others with kindness, found incredible joy in cooking and caring for others, and always chose to be positive and optimistic in her approach to the world. Even at 96 years of age, she happily greeted her great-grandchildren (including my own three kids) with a giant smile and her favorite term of endearment, "sunshine mine." As we grapple today with a new rise of antisemitism, I try to remember her example of still seeking the best in others and in hoping for a brighter future.

For the second person, you'll need a bit of a back story. My parents immigrated to the United States from Israel with me when I was only three months old. After a short stint in New York, they soon made their way to South Florida. Within a few years, my parents had befriended four other families, also all immigrants to this country. We came from Israel, Argentina, Uruguay, Cuba, Romania, South Africa... our families were literally spread around the world. So these five families (which we affectionately refer to as "The Mafia") became a family of our own. For my entire childhood, every birthday party, every Sunday barbecue, and of course, every Jewish holiday was spent with these families. We took annual trips to Disney,

spent hours in each other's swimming pools, and the kids created talent shows to entertain our parents. Each family had three kids, and because most of my actual cousins lived far away, these people were closer to me than even my own family. When my parents made the difficult decision to move to Seattle because of my father's job, the hardest part was leaving this group behind. But distance hasn't changed the relationships and we all regularly talk, text, visit, and dance at weddings together.

One of the fathers in our five families group was named Trevor Swerdlow. Like many Jewish boys from South Africa, he grew up to be a doctor. Though he was highly respected and accomplished in his field, he was exceedingly humble and modest. His greatest joy was in raising his three sons, exceeded only later in life when he became a grandfather (Papu) to three beautiful children. Trevor could be called upon night and day for medical advice, for support, or simply to be a person who would listen. He had a passion for life and travel, a strong commitment to education, and a deep connection to Israel and the Jewish people. He was a mensch, in every sense of the word. He is the first loss in our little group and one we all profoundly feel.

I share all of this with you because I believe that teachers must model the values and ideas we hope to teach. I want you to know a bit about some of the people who shaped me so you know the kinds of values I want to share with the children here at HNT. I will do my best to ensure that their memories are always a blessing. And I hope I can pass some of their kindness, wisdom, and love on to the children in our community.

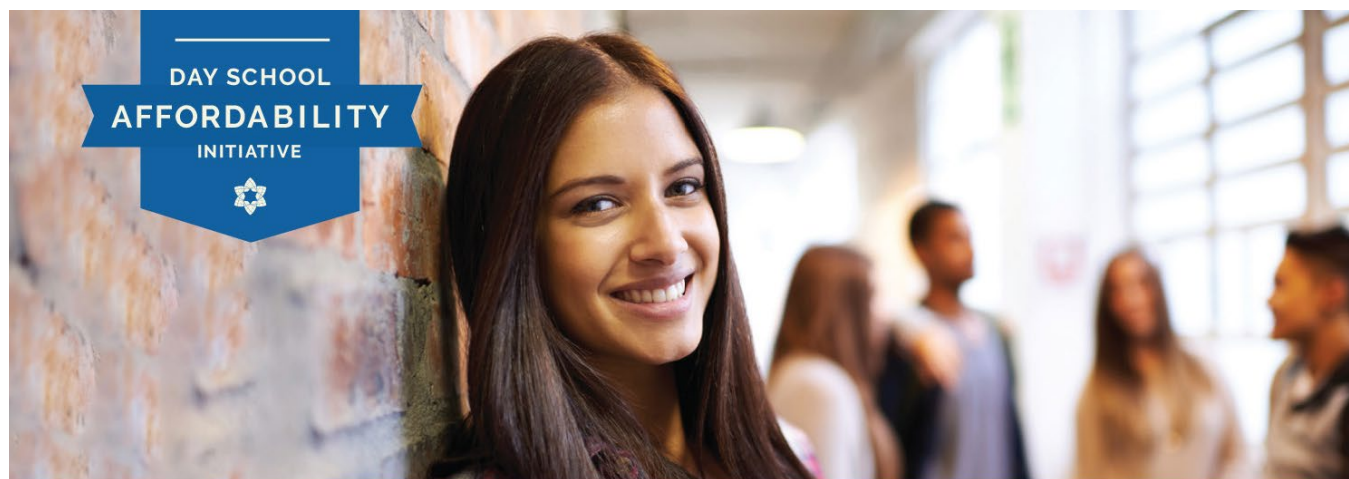

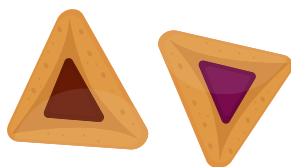




## Holocaust Traveling Suitcase Exhibit in the Feinberg Social Hall

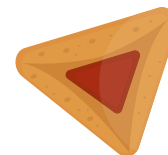
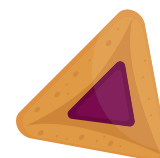

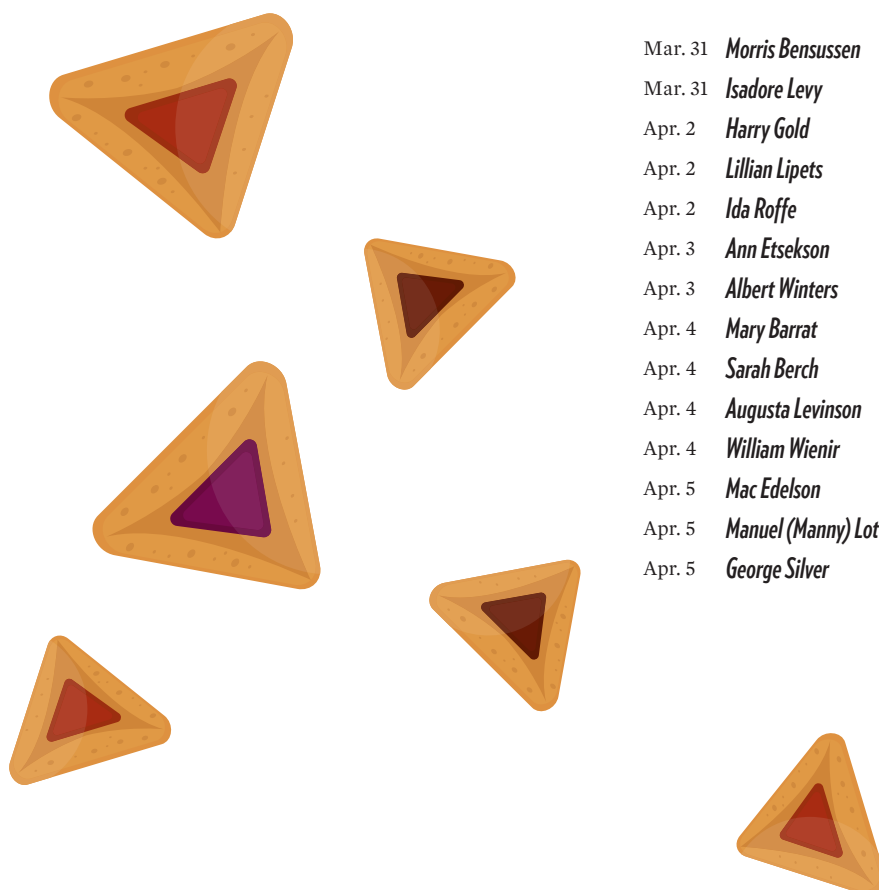
