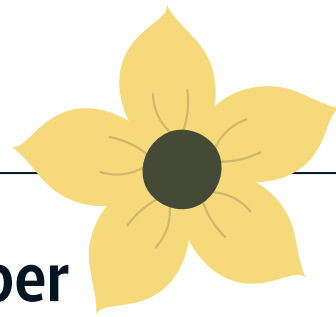

A Message from Rabbi Jacob Herber



By the time you've opened this Hakol and begun to read this column I will have landed at Ben Gurion International Airport in Tel Aviv. For the last five months I've watched many friends and colleagues travel to Israel in the wake of the barbaric Hamas attack of October 7th. It's been hard to remain behind while others have made trips to express their solidarity, to transport much needed material aid, to provide much needed human labor while reservists are deployed in Gaza and in Israel's north, and to bear witness to the atrocities that were perpetrated by Hamas terrorists and other Gazans on that horrific day. Now with Rabbi Alpert on board providing part-time, backup support while I'm away, I finally have the opportunity to do my part.

Some rabbis have made this trip on their own, some have led congregational missions, and still others have participated in organizational delegations. As a founding member of the newly established Rabbinic Advisory Board of American Friends of Magen David Adom (AFMDA) I'll be joining other rabbis and a select group of synagogue lay leaders for our first ever mission. The AFMDA Rabbinic Advisory Board has its genesis in an AIEF (American Israel Education Fund) rabbinic mission for AIPAC's top rabbis trip that I and 12 other colleagues participated in last June. Among the many fascinating and eye-opening facets of the trip was a visit to MDA's Marcus National Blood Services Center in Ramla. Considered a national strategic asset by the government, the Marcus Center is the world's first underground, anti-missile blood center. We were so impressed with what we saw and heard that when we returned from Israel several of us felt compelled to help MDA by providing our rabbinic support, so we formed the Advisory Board. Little did we know how much our help would be needed in the aftermath of October 7th.

After our first meeting, which included hearing from MDA's Director General and an MDA paramedic who shared her

harrowing story of being the first medical responder in Sderot while firefights were still raging between the IDF and Hamas terrorists, we concluded that our first official act of business had to be an MDA solidarity mission to Israel, one with the express purpose of garnering financial support for MDA in our congregations upon our return.

Our mission will be a short one, beginning on April 1st and concluding on April 4th, and it features an intense and jam-packed itinerary including visits to the communities in the South hit hardest by the attack on October 7th, to the memorial to the victims at the location of the Super Nova Rave, meetings with survivors and families of the hostages, a return to the Marcus Center, and much more.

While at the Marcus Center, I'm looking forward to delivering the cards our FRS students made for MDA's EMTs and paramedics who were often at the frontline before the IDF arrived in response to the attack. I'm also looking forward to sharing my experience with all of you when I return and have had a chance to process what I've seen and heard. I'm hoping that HNT will become a committed and enthusiastic supporter of American Friends of Magen David Adom. With the war against Hamas and a war just on the horizon with Hezbollah, Israel and Magen David Adom will need us, and we need to be there for them! 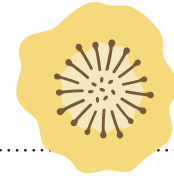

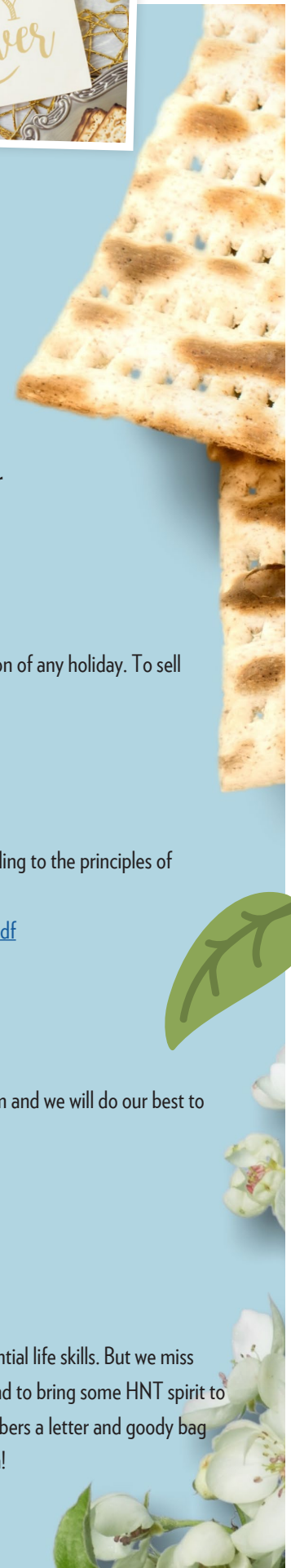

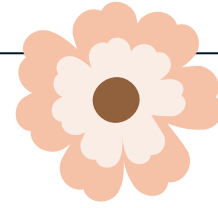
Passover College Packages

Message From the President

HNT: Your Happy Place

Today I read a column in the Seattle Times about American happiness. According to Gallup's rankings, America has fallen off the top 20 list down to 23rd in worldwide happiness. America is well behind the Scandinavian countries who top the list and behind such countries that rarely evoke images of Disneyland – Slovenia and Kuwait.

And the stats don't lie. The country doesn't seem happy. The concept of Democracy is hurting. Republicans and Democrats are not compromising. Trump supporters are fighting with Biden supporters. And we see the people of Israel struggling with similar ideals.

Climate change is also causing weather disasters in the U.S. every month. The American dream of owning a home is getting tougher for young people. Homeless are living in tents in our cities. And the cost of basic necessities seem to keep going up.

But this is a glass half full/hall empty scenario. Look at our situation another way ... we have turned the corner since COVID. We averted a recession that the experts predicted was inevitable. The stock market is at record levels. Unemployment rates are much better than expected, remaining at very healthy low levels. And people are finding time to enjoy themselves. The airports and highways were busier than ever this weekend, in part due to Spring Break but in part due to the solar eclipse. Yes, people were enthusiastically leaving work and home, some traveling thousands of miles, to see the solar eclipse.

And if you attended the Gadol Gala, you are now a glass half full person. The Gala was a success by any measure. Through the generosity of many people and the incredibly hard work by volunteers and staff, it was a financial victory. But the value was far greater than money. For the first time since the pandemic, we had almost 300 HNTers together having a great time.

Young members and not so young members. New members and old. Friends who hadn't seen each other in ages were smiling and chatting. Everyone dressed up and looked great. It was truly a party!

I think a lot of us simply became accustomed to being on our own during COVID and forgot how nice it was to be with our community, with our friends ... in our safe place away from the stresses of everyday life. I simply don't remember the last time I saw so many smiling faces.

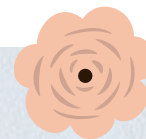
Many of our HNT community were unable to attend and didn't experience the ruach, the good feelings that permeated Meydenbauer Center. At HNT, we have many opportunities for people to get together in their individual silos – the Social Action Committee, the Day-Timers Group, the Knitting Club, the Next Chapter Group, the Frankel Religious School Community ... the list goes on. But there's something special about it not being for a special interest.

We are a Jewish organization, a synagogue. As a community, we need to make more of an effort to celebrate our holidays together, celebrate b'nai mitzvot together, and just be together at services on a Friday night or Saturday. The Gadol Gala was great. But it shouldn't be once a year that we have so many smiling faces in one place. (I would mention Yom Kippur but there are fewer smiles even though a great many people. But even at Yom Kippur where our focus is on atonement and thoughts of the next year, people fill the hallways renewing friendships and catching up on news.)

There are always going to be positives and negatives in our everyday lives. The challenge is to keep a positive attitude and work towards creating opportunities where our positive experiences far outweigh our negative ones. And HNT should be the center of our positive experiences.

Free during the day? Join us for good conversation, tasty lunch, and a Jewish-themed film!

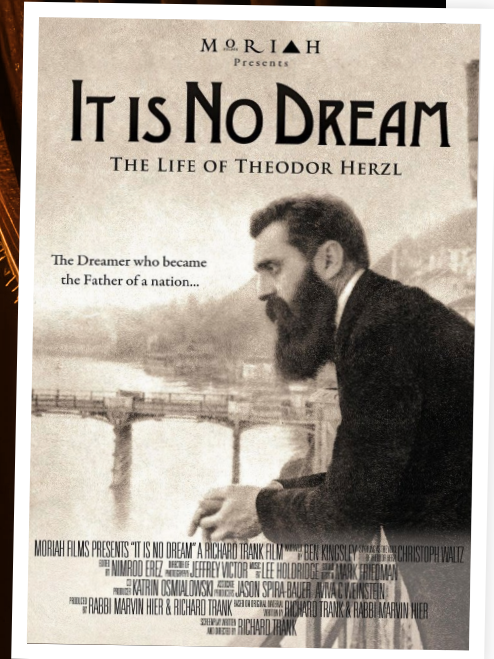

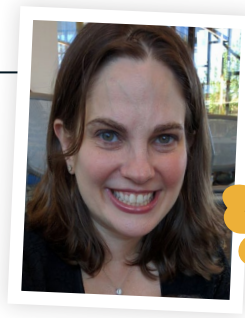

A Message from Director of Education Irit Eliav Levin



Pesach is one of my favorite holidays. To me, one of the most powerful parts of reading the Haggadah every year is the fact that it doesn't talk about what happened to them - the Israelites of long ago. Rather, everything talks about what happened to us, as if we too were there. In fact, our tradition implores us to imagine ourselves as slaves in Egypt, as Israelites crossing the desert, as watching in awe as the Sea of Reeds parted, helping us to get to safety.

This idea continues throughout our tradition. A midrash teaches that every Jew that ever lived and that ever will live were all present at Mount Sinai, when we received the Aseret Hadibrot, the Ten Commandments. This idea is used to explain that immediate connection we often feel with other Jews. We are taught that because we were all once together at Sinai, when you encounter a new Jewish person, you should not say "It's nice to meet you." Rather, you can say, "It's nice to see you again."

The idea that Judaism isn't a story about others, but rather a story we are currently living and even helping to shape is an important part of our teaching philosophy at the Frankel Religious School. We don't just learn about the mitzvot, the commandments, we live them. I'd like to share just a few recent examples with you.

Our Kindergarten students have been learning about Kashrut. Rather than merely learning some of the rules involved in keeping kosher, students had a practical introduction to what that looks like in real life. A pretend grocery store was set up in our Kindergarten classroom. Students had to study the packages to determine which foods were kosher and could be purchased, and which were not. Identifying hechshers, looking at ingredients, these are real skills that are

needed in keeping a kosher home. Then, the food used in the grocery store was donated to the JFS food bank.

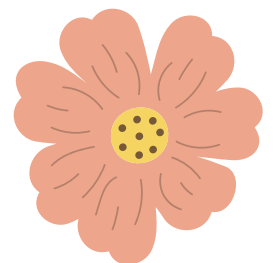
Our Dalet and Hey students have been learning about the Holocaust. Rather than simply looking at textbooks, we invited in guest speakers who shared their family's stories of survival. The kids understood the reality of what life was like during that time. They also took a field trip to the Washington State Holocaust Center for Humanity, so that they could see real photos and artifacts and hear true stories from the staff there.

Instead of simply learning about the four mitzvot of Purim, the entire Sunday FRS community studied the megillah text, had a seudah (a festive Purim meal), made mishloach manot (gift baskets) for one another, and fulfilled the mitzvah of matanot l'evyonim, making gifts for the poor. Together, we bagged 800 pounds of rice and oats to help support the JFS food bank. (Thanks to the HNT Social Action Committee and so many parent volunteers who made that project possible.)

Instead of merely learning about the mitzvah of bikkur holim (visiting the sick), our Kitah Alef (first grade) students paid a visit to the residents of Kline Galland. There, they were able to sing some songs and bring some smiles to the faces of the elderly people living there. They learned firsthand the importance of caring for and respecting our elders.

Judaism isn't something abstract that we study only in textbooks. It is a living, breathing, dynamic tradition that we are so lucky and honored to get to share with the next generation.
