A Message from Rabbi Jacob Herber



uman beings have an innate passion for knowledge. We constantly seek out wisdom and information and we use the knowledge we acquire as part of our quest for self-improvement. As a religion and culture, Judaism embraces this aspect of human nature. Jews value knowledge and encourage members of our community to engage in educational pursuits. Our tradition says in several different iterations that there are many important mitzvot, but the commandment to learn and study exceeds them all. In fact, a famous Talmudic passage finds our Sages asking what is more important, learning or action? The answer - utilizing typical rabbinic ingenuity is "learning because it leads to action." In other words, learning is a foundational value for the Jewish People. It's at the root of everything and guides the way we live in the world.

Summer is an ideal time to find opportunities to live the great Jewish value of learning. That's because the festival of Shavuot kicks off summertime with a celebration of revelation and Torah. On Shavuot, we commemorate the giving of the Torah to the Jewish People at Sinai. Traditionally, we do this by holding a *Tikkun Leil*, an allnight marathon of learning. People begin studying *erev* Shavuot and continue through the night until morning. Like many contemporary Conservative synagogues at HNT we take a more modest approach, studying for an hour or two at the onset of the holiday.

For those of who participate each year it's a very special and spiritual experience, encountering Judaism's ancient, medieval, or modern wisdom in the texts of our tradition. Seeking their relevance to our lives is a wonderful bonus. The *Tikkun Leil* on Shavuot is a great celebration of Torah, Judaism and learning. This year please join us on Tuesday evening, June 11th, at 9:00 PM. The title of my *shiur*, study session, is "The Case of Eisha ben Abuyah: Hero or Heretic, or Are There Really Good and Bad Jews."

Free during the day? Join us for good conversation, tasty lunch, and a Jewish-themed film!



Message From the President

Welcome to summer 2024 and our ongoing year of change! In an uncertain world, one of the things we can count on is Change.

I am excited and honored to serve another term as President of the Board of Herzl-Ner Tamid.

My family joined HNT in 1970. I had my Bat Mitzvah here, was married here and raised my own family in this congregation. It truly feels like my home away from home. I remember as a high school student, hanging out in the youth lounge for USY meetings and events, even sleeping in the synagogue for USY Shabbatons (it wasn't comfortable, but we didn't care because we were with our friends). I met friends as a child in the Frankel Religious School and USY that are still my best friends today. This community has given me so much that when asked to step back into leadership, I knew my answer was a YES.

Herzl-Ner Tamid is at a pivotal point in its lifetime. Our community is still recovering from a global pandemic; experiencing a war in Israel from afar accompanied by the worst rise in antisemitic sentiment and acts since the Holocaust, including vandalism of our own building.

Together, we are stronger to face these challenges. Many of us are now comfortable meeting in person. We need to gather in order to cope, support one another, and celebrate joyous occasions.

A Message from Director of Education **Irit Eliav Levin**

O n the morning of May 7, 2024, two 31-year-old Israeli reservists were killed via a drone strike. The soldiers were identified as St.-Sgt.-Maj. (Res.) Dan Kamkagi, 31, from Kfar Oranim, and St.-Sgt.-Maj. (Res.) Nahman Natan Hertz, 31, from Elazar. I saw the pictures and my heart broke for these young lives lost and the family and friends they left behind.

And then, I got a call from my father. And I learned that Dan Kamkagi was actually the grandson of my father's cousin. For reference, my father's parents each had many siblings, so my dad has A LOT of cousins. Though I've met many of them over the years, the meetings were complicated by the fact that these cousins lived all over the world.

It's possible that I met Dan at a family simcha in Israel. Since these events were often a blur of meeting relatives, I'm not sure. But my parents were at a family reunion just last year and they spent some time with his mother. My Aunt and Uncle attended his funeral. They, of course, said it was heartbreaking.

This event was a powerful reminder to me that the Jewish world and especially the Israeli world really are indelibly intertwined. The reason the entire country shuts down on Yom HaZikaron, Israel's Memorial Day, is because everyone has a neighbor, a friend, a family member who has been lost in battle. The majority of Israelis have served in the IDF and have put their own lives on the line on behalf of the state of Israel. So though my contact with Dan was limited if not nonexistent, I feel his loss. I feel the loss of Nahman and all of the other soldiers as well, though we have no known immediate connection.

It is this deep interconnectedness with the land of Israel that I want to teach to our students at FRS. Israel is a core part of our curriculum. The older grades have spent a lot of time this year addressing the war in Gaza and understanding the complicated factors that have led to this current situation. But we also want to teach that Israel is about so much more than war and terror. To help celebrate Yom Ha'Atzmaut, Israel's Independence Day, we held a Mock "Trip to Israel" on Sunday morning, May 5th. Our kids got to put notes in the Kotel, have a popsicle on the beaches of Tel Aviv, go snorkeling in Eilat, make hamsas in Tsfat, visit an Israeli restaurant for yummy Israeli snacks, shop in the shuk on Machane Yehuda, and even do some Israeli dancing led by Morah Cindy - all in the HNT social hall! We wanted them to feel the beauty and the magic that Israel has to offer, which is even more important in these challenging times.

And as we ended our program that morning by pretending to board an airplane and land back at SeaTac Airport, Josh Niehaus led us in a Ruach-filled chorus of *Am Yisrael Chai*. May the Jewish people and the Jewish state of Israel continue to live and thrive forever.




