Some Food for Thought for Thanksgiving

here's no doubt that November is one of the most travelled months of the year. In fact, more Americans fly for Thanksgiving than any other holiday. Did you know that nine out of ten Thanksgiving holiday travelers (that's about 91%) drive to get where they're going? I bet you didn't know that when it comes to those traveling between 50 and 99 miles (44% of personal vehicle trips), more people travel on Thursday than on Wednesday, and more return on Saturday than on Sunday. For those traveling at least 100 miles (56% of all personal vehicle trips), trips are spread almost equally throughout the Wednesday-through-Sunday travel period. If you're going to travel by air, the heavy travel day is Wednesday, not Thursday.

And when it comes to air travel, there's a serious battle being waged between the airlines. Some airlines charge their coach passengers for each checked bag. Others let you check a bag for free. Still other carriers even charge you to bring a carryon on board the plane. With all these new fees, more people are opting to pack more lightly and stow their bags in overhead compartments. This has created tension and competition, the likes of which can be quite disconcerting. Some of you know that I've had some of the worst experiences lately when it comes to flying, whether it's my fair share of missed connecting flights or lost/delayed baggage.

Which has got me thinking. Have you ever noticed that some people do in fact, bring along a great deal of psychological baggage when they visit their families for the holidays? And, unfortunately, they pay a heavy price, not imposed by the airlines, but by their hearts. Others bring the same amount of baggage, but don't have to pay the fine at all.

We all shlep around baggage. If you get to a certain age, you really can't help it. We carry throughout life our disappointments, our anger, our frustrations and our sadness. Much of that presents itself during holiday times. Unsurprisingly, this leads to a lot of stress.

So here are a few things to remember for your holiday gatherings: 1) Try to be grateful for your blessings. It's so much easier to focus on your losses, try not to. Think about what you've got, not what you've lost. 2) Behave yourself. Just because you feel antagonistic toward a member of your family, doesn't mean you have to express it. Sometimes, it's best to be magnanimous and let the hurt roll off your back. 3) Remember that you're only there for a while. Family gatherings often trigger our painful baggage, but we don't have to unpack it in public. We can wait for a more opportune time, say with your spouse, your rabbi, or your therapist. 4) True refinement, like true and good manners in the deepest sense, begins in the home and with the members of your own family. 5) Remember that our behavior in front of our children today, will return to us when our kids and grandkids visit us down the road.

Here's a final piece of advice for your holiday: travel light. Go with a joyous heart. You'll be surprised how the power of optimism, laughter, and hope transform a family gathering. Our attitudes - or how we carry our baggage - can make the trip so much more meaningful and enjoyable.



Our Search for a Senior Rabbi Is Underway!

Our search for a Senior Rabbi is underway! We had a wonderfully robust response to our request, and we want to extend a thank you to everyone who expressed interest in serving on the search committee. We worked hard at putting together a team that represents our diverse congregation to evaluate and choose our next spiritual leader.

The Search Committee co-chairs are **Robbie and Bonnie Cape**. The search committee members are: **Miri Cypers, Zach Duitch, Marc Gonchar, Esti Karson- Livne, Rivka Klaff, Jason Kravitz, Dean Polik, Iris Schwartz and Jaime Slutzky**.

The Search Committee provides an avenue to the Rabbinical candidates. But we are relying on all congregants to participate and provide input throughout the process.

The process and timeline for a rabbi search is as follows:

- Now: Submit our placement application to the Rabbinical Assembly so that rabbinic candidates can begin to apply.
- November: Gather feedback from the community to help us evaluate the rabbis who do express interest in HNT. Proactively seek candidates who may be a good fit for HNT.
- December to January: Receive and review applications from rabbis, conduct interviews.
- 4. February: Choose finalists for in-person interviews with the community.
- 5. February to May: Bring candidates here for inperson, weekend-long "interviews". This is when you will be able to meet our finalists.
- 6. May (or sooner): Make a decision, extend an offer, and negotiate a contract.

In order to gather feedback from the congregation, the

committee is holding two listening sessions next week. These sessions will be "open mics" of sorts, giving members an opportunity to share their thoughts about our next rabbi with the committee.

Monday, November 4, 7:00 PM to 8:30 PM at HNT Wednesday, November 6, 7:00 PM to 8:30 PM at HNT Sunday, November 17, 10:30 AM to 12:00 PM at HNT

Depending on the response to these sessions, we will schedule additional listening sessions. The committee will also be sending out a "request for input" to the congregation in November enabling you to respond in writing if you prefer. We want to give everyone the opportunity to share their thoughts, whether they prefer to do that in writing or verbally at the listening sessions.

This is a critical time for HNT and a tremendous opportunity for all to participate and help to form our future. With Cantor Batchelor's arrival this month, Irit Eliav Levin as our permanent Director of Education, the recent staff additions of Nison Simontov as Executive Director and Cora Miller as Director of Community Engagement, as well as the Barnabie Point Initiative, choosing the new Rabbi is the next and absolutely critical piece in building our future.

Thank you for helping to make our future a bright one.



Barnabie Point Initiative Update

The Barnabie Point (BP) Initiative is in full "do" mode. There are currently six Barnabie Point related committees with over 20 HNT volunteer members staffing these committees. The Steering, Legal, and Fundraising Committees have been working non-stop for the past year. As work transitions into the actual site prep and final approvals, the Building, Finance, and Marketing Committees are also ramping up. Any major decisions have been and will continue to be presented to and approved by the HNT Board.

The Barnabie Point Project Team is committed to keeping the membership abreast of developments and progress. To this goal, two major actions are taking place:

1. The Team held two Town Hall Meetings for HNT membership, on Oct. 22nd and 27th. Presenters included Donna Peha, HNT President; Sarah Castoriano, JDS President; Audrey Covner, Barnabie Point Project Chair; Sonny Putter, HNT Rep on BP Steering Committee; Anjali Grant, Project Architect; and Julie Ellenhorn, BP Marketing Committee and Q&A facilitator. Topics ranged from HNT and JDS visions and how the project is a critical component of those visions to project benefits, building design concepts, future timelines, and everyday project impacts during construction and after completion. Town Halls will continue to be held to keep people informed and provide a forum to ask questions in an interactive environment.

2. BP on HNT website. A dedicated spot on the HNT website will be available for viewing by mid-November. The site section will include: summary information on the project, regular updates, visuals, recordings of town hall sessions, a FAQ section, and whatever else is needed to keep all informed.


For members who missed the Town Hall sessions, you will be able to access a recording and the slideshow in the BP section of the HNT website when the site goes live.

A Message from Director of Education Irit Eliav Levin

Teach them again and again to your children."

One of the core beliefs that has kept Judaism alive for thousands of years is the central idea that we must always continue to teach the next generation about Torah, T'filah (prayer), holidays, and a multitude of other beautiful values and traditions. This, of course, is the primary objective of our Frankel Religious School. And while, traditionally, we tend to think about these words as pertaining to adults teaching children - l'dor v'dor - from generation to generation, a whole new kind of magic ensues when the teachers are actually also children themselves.

One of the hidden gems in our community that you might not know much about is our incredible FRS Madrichim (teen teacher assistants) program. We currently have seventeen middle and high school students, ranging from seventh to twelfth graders who spend every Saturday or Sunday morning working with our students. Our madrichim help students with art projects, guide them as they practice their Hebrew reading skills, supervise games at recess, provide support in the school office, and so, so much more. They are role models that our younger children look up to and they provide incredible energy and enthusiasm

to our program. Our madrichim work tirelessly to make sure our students have the best possible experience at FRS. They take their responsibilities here incredibly seriously.

Additionally, once a month they participate in a leadership class, led by our HNTeens advisor, Josh Kittay. He provides concrete tools to help them become better educators and future leaders of the Jewish community.

Our school is so much stronger because of these incredible tweens and teens. Their smiles and enthusiasm are a huge part of why kids love coming to FRS. They also provide invaluable support to our teachers, helping them to do a better job for our students. Thank you to our wonderful madrichim for all you do! We are so grateful that you choose to spend some of your busy weekends each week at FRS!


