A Message from Rabbi Jacob Herber

As the joy of Purim fills our homes and communities, there's an often overlooked but significant extension of the holiday, Shushan Purim, which is observed on the 15th of Adar (this year that corresponds with March 15th). While most of us celebrate Purim on the 14th of Adar, in walled cities like Jerusalem, the holiday is commemorated one day later, in accordance with the events described in *Megillat Esther*.

In the time of Esther and Mordekhai, the Jews of Persia defended themselves against their enemies on the 13th of Adar. In most places, they celebrated their victory on the following day, the 14th. But in Shushan, the capital city, the fighting continued an extra day, and the celebration was delayed until the 15th. To honor this distinction, our Sages established that Purim would be celebrated on the 15th in cities that, like Shushan, had been walled since the time of Joshua.

For most of us, Shushan Purim is a quieter day, a time to reflect on the miracles of Purim and experience a lingering sense of joy. In Jerusalem and other historically walled cities the full Purim celebration—including

the Megillah reading, festive meals, *mishloah manot*, and *matanot l'evyonim*—takes place on this day. Even outside these cities, many communities add an element of festivity, refraining from fasting or eulogies and maintaining an air of happiness.

Shushan Purim reminds us that while redemption sometimes comes swiftly, in other cases, patience and perseverance are what's required. Just as the Jews of Shushan needed an extra day before they could celebrate, we, too, may face delays on the path to personal and communal triumphs. But like in the Purim story, God's guiding hand is always present, even when hidden.

As we transition from Purim to Passover and the rest of the year, let's carry with us the joy, unity, and faith that this season inspires.

A Message From the President

Dear Friends,

With the approach of Purim and its festive celebration, I acutely feel the parallel of tragic losses in Israel and also the perseverance of the Jewish people. Purim gives us hope for the victory of the Jewish people over adversity and darkness. This powerful narrative resonates strongly with the spirit of spring, which is right around the corner. I personally cannot wait to see flowers blooming and warmer days.

Purim and the arrival of spring share common threads of survival and rejuvenation. In both, there is an unmistakable energy of beginning anew. In that spirit, I want to share a few wonderful new things happening at HNT.

After the devastating return of four dead hostages, including the young Bibas family, HNT hosted a memorial in partnership with StandWithUs NW and the Jewish Federation of Greater Seattle. The feeling in the sanctuary was sad and also warm and communal. Our Herzl-Ner Tamid leaders spoke and sang beautifully and passionately about our feeling of loss and our ability to overcome. There is power in grieving together, and there was clearly a need to mourn as a community.

Secondly, we have started a new program, Shabbat K'tan, led by Nyssa and Mike Harris. A partnership with PJ Library, Shabbat K'tan occurs monthly during Saturday morning services and is geared towards children under age five and their parents. In February, 47 people attended! It is wonderful to see this energetic group in shul and sharing the kiddush lunch.

I hope you'll join us for the Purim Schpiel on March 13, themed "The Return of the Wicked Witch of West Mercer Way." We'll have a live band, a family dinner and home-made Hamentashen. See page 5 for more details. It promises to be great fun!

With the arrival of Purim and spring, we also look ahead to an important event in our synagogue's calendar—the upcoming Gadol Gala on March 23. This special evening will not only be a fun celebration of all that we have

accomplished together, but also a critical moment to raise the necessary funds that will support the continued growth and vibrancy of our congregation.

The Gala promises to be an unforgettable night of festivities, food, and community spirit. We are deeply grateful for the dedication of all those involved in organizing this event. Rabbi Search Updates We Welcome Rabbi Joshua Ratner

The Rabbi Search Committee is pleased to share that we have a senior rabbi candidate who we are excited about, Rabbi Joshua Ratner, and we have invited him to visit us in Seattle. Rabbi Ratner will be with us March 17-20 and we hope you take advantage of the opportunity to meet him while he is here.

Rabbi Joshua Ratner is the rabbi of Or Hadash, a Conservative synagogue in Fairfield, CT. He also works as the Jewish Chaplain at Sacred Heart. Rabbi Ratner previously functioned as the director of the Jewish Community Relations Council of New Haven, as Rabbi and Jewish Educator at Yale University, and as the rabbi of Congregation Kol Ami in Cheshire, CT.

Ordained by the Jewish Theological Seminary in May 2012, he was a Joseph Neubauer Fellow and, while at JTS, also earned a Master's Degree in Midrash, a Certificate in Pastoral Care, and received training in congregation-based community organizing. Rabbi Ratner is a graduate of Columbia University

and Columbia Law School, and he worked as an attorney for five years in New York City prior to entering rabbinical school.

Rabbi Ratner has served as a board member of Hazon (now called Adamah), a national Jewish environmental organization, a board member of Ezra Academy, and is an American Jewish World Service Global Justice Fellow. He is married to Dr. Elena Ratner and they are the proud parents of Dimitri, Eli, Gabby, and Sasha.

Vote Mercaz

Voting in the next elections begins this month...

Every 5 years we have the opportunity to vote in the World Zionist Congress. Voting is a simple **online process** that **takes five minutes and five dollars**. Any American Jew (by self-identification, while not identifying as a member of another religion) over 18 can vote for MERCAZ USA in elections to the World Zionist Congress. The **voting period begins on March 10th**, and no preregistration or organizational membership of any kind beforehand is required. The five dollars is a small administrative fee covering the cost of administering the election, which also prevents voter fraud as each payment method can only vote a limited number of times.

When you vote for the Conservative/Masorti Judaism's official party, MERCAZ USA, you are voting to:

- 1. Make sure those hit hardest on October 7th get resources they need to rebuild
- 2. Protect democracy and democratic values in Israel
- 3. Secure over \$25 million in funding for Israel education at your congregation, Ramah, USY/NOAM, and more
- 4. Fight the ultra-Orthodox monopoly in Israel by funding the Masorti/Conservative Movement in Israel and preventing ultra-Orthodox extremists from erasing us.

Update on the Barnabie Point Project

As we hope most of you are aware, the Barnabie Point Project (BPP) is a joint HNT and JDS initiative that brings Jewish organizations together in an underutilized HNT space to share resources, programming, and security. In order to keep the HNT membership up to date on what is going on with the project, we sat down for an interview with Audrey Covner, Barnabie Point Project chair, to get her perspective on how things are going so far. While there is significant activity going on behind the scenes that cannot be publicly shared at this point, we wanted to at least address some of the questions we have been hearing from our members.

So, Audrey, how's the Barnabie Point project coming along overall?

Audrey: It's going really well! We're thrilled with the positive feedback we're getting from our key stakeholders and donors, from HNT members, and from the wider Jewish community. We are meeting our building and construction timelines and are on track toward achieving our goal of 80% of the needed funds raised by the time we are ready to break ground. Our efforts to reach out to local Jewish organizations about joining in as tenants in the building have generated a lot of interest! Consistent with our original goals, this building will be a space to address the needs of JDS, HNT and enhance access to sharing resources and space with other Jewish organizations.

How about the scope and timing - any changes there?

Audrey: So far, so good! No major changes to the scope or timeline. We are still expecting construction to start in October 2025 depending, of course, on the final approvals from the City of Mercer Island. We have a great working relationship with our JDS counterparts, the architect has been amazing, and our consultants have been exceptional in their understanding of what we need and helping to align costs. Most importantly, our dedicated volunteers have put in extraordinary hours of work to make this all happen.

Projected Timeline (subject to change):

- Late Summer/Early Fall 2025: Permit issued by City of Mercer Island to start construction; at least 80% of funds pledged needed for construction
- Fall 2025 Fall 2026: Building Construction
- Fall 2026: Building ready for occupancy

That's great news! Speaking of JDS, how's our relationship with them coming along?

Audrey: That's crucial, and thankfully, they've been fantastic partners. Just like any relationship, we have had our differences, but we always come together in the end to work together and do what is right for our organizations and the Jewish community. For example, as we plow through the legal agreements, there have been a few negotiations, yet none have been insurmountable as we all see the future together. In addition, the relationship of the organizations is bolstered by many synergies between how both organizations operate allowing for the sharing of critical resources, as a lot of our programming dovetails with theirs. The new classrooms will be used by JDS during the weekdays, and Frankel Religious School will use them in the evenings and on weekends.

Okay, so assuming everything stays on track and construction starts late this fall, what impact will construction have on activities at Herzl-Ner Tamid?

Audrey: We've been working closely with the contractor to figure out the best way to manage construction during High Holidays, Shabbat, and special occasions like weddings and bar/bat mitzvahs. We'll have detailed plans in place well before construction starts to make sure everything runs smoothly for HNT activities during the project.

What about parking during construction? That's always a concern.

Audrey: We have approximately 110 parking spaces which, according to our Transportation Survey, is more than enough to service the uses in the new building as each organization is on site at different times. In addition, we currently rent 50 spots during the week to the French American School of Puget Sound (FASPS). This rental is on a year-by-year basis and will be terminated and/or amended if we need to reclaim these spots for our use. We have a great working relationship with FASPS and have already notified them of the upcoming construction.

With a new building, everyone worries about costs. Will there be a new building assessment for HNT members?

Audrey: We totally understand that concern! But no, we do not expect any building assessments for HNT members based on the new construction. All the funds for the BPP are being raised through a separate capital campaign. There are also financial sustainability provisions for HNT built into the building operations that will help support building maintenance and HNT operating costs.

Thank you, Audrey, for the helpful conversation. Any last things you would like people to know?

Audrey: This process has been incredibly rewarding, although at times challenging and time-consuming, yet all of us who have been at ground zero are extremely proud of how far we have come to making this dream a reality. This is the first project in the local Jewish community to have several Jewish agencies come together to create a Jewish space to enhance all of our operations. While Barnabie Point is a small parcel, we hope it will be a first step of bringing our community together and look forward to seeing how

other developments, particularly at the SJCC, can expand and support the vision of a Jewish space in Puget Sound. Working together we are stronger, better able to fight antisemitism, and empowered to create a positive Jewish environment.


Dough: An old Jewish baker struggles to keep his business afloat until his young Muslim apprentice drops cannabis in the dough and sends sales sky high.



A Message from Director of Education Irit Eliav Levin



"When the king's order and edict was proclaimed, and when many girls were assembled in the fortress Shushan under the supervision of Hegai, Esther too was taken into the king's palace... The girl pleased him and won his favor, and he hastened to furnish her with her cosmetics and her rations, as well as with the seven maids who were due her from the king's palace; and he treated her and her maids with special kindness in the harem. Esther did not reveal her people or her kindred, for Mordechai had told her not to reveal it. Every single day Mordechai would walk about in front of the court of the harem, to learn how Esther was faring and what was happening to her."

- Megillat Esther, 2.8-11

This passage from Megillat Esther, will be read aloud by Jews around the world this Purim. The story of a young woman forced to hide her Jewish identity - and then asked to speak up and save the Jews from annihilation - feels different in today's complicated and trying times than it did even a few years ago.

But Judaism always teaches us to dive deeper into text, to look not only at the *p'shat* (the literal meaning of the text), but also to study the drash (interpretation or secret meaning of the text). In the passage above, midrash teaches us that the reason Mordechai was pacing in front of the court was because Esther was not actually his niece or cousin, but rather his wife. (The rabbis say to read the megillah as saying not bat, daughter, but rather bayit, home - a rabbinic expression meaning wife). He was heartbroken at losing his partner and wanted to find a way to be close to her and to protect her. While that interpretation changes the meaning of the story at a profound level, it also places Mordechai at the palace gate. This allowed him to hear the plot of Bigthan and Teresh and save the life of the King, setting in motion several other key aspects of the Purim story.

Similarly, it would be easy to just take at face value that

Esther was given seven maids. But the rabbis noted the significance of the number seven. Midrash teaches that the reason she had seven maids is so that she could behave differently with the seventh maid, and therefore she could observe Shabbat, without causing another maid to wonder at the change in her behavior.

When Esther feels frightened at being asked to speak on behalf of the Jews, Mordechai tells her "Who knows, perhaps you have attained to royal position for just such a crisis." (Megillat Esther 4.14) It is easy to feel overwhelmed and exhausted by the current state of the world. But if we look deeper, we can find little sparks of hope, kindness, love, and friendship everywhere we look. It is up to us not only to find them, but to create them in as many ways and places as we can. Maybe we too are who we are and where we are for a purpose that we cannot yet see. May we all find a way to use our time, strength, and resources for the purpose for which we were intended.
