A Message from **Rabbi Jacob Herber** Renewal and Freedom: Celebrating Passover Together

As we prepare to gather around our seder tables, we're reminded that Passover is a time of both remembrance and renewal. We recall the struggles of our ancestors, their journey from slavery to freedom, and the miracles that shaped our people's destiny. But Passover is more than just a retelling of history, it's an opportunity to reflect on the meaning of freedom in our own lives and in the world today, especially when, as of this writing, 59 hostages remain in unimaginable captivity in Gaza.

The seder itself is a powerful ritual, inviting us to engage in deep conversations, to ask questions, and to experience the story of the Exodus in a personal way. As we taste the bitter *maror*, dip parsley into salt water, taste the "Bread of Affliction," and recline with wine in hand, we're not merely recounting the past—we're reliving it. We're reminded that each generation must see itself as if it, too, were leaving Egypt.

This year, as we gather with family, friends, let's consider what it means to be truly free. How can we help those who are still struggling? How can we bring the message of redemption to those in need? How can we advocate for and help secure the freedom of Israeli hostages? And how can we renew our faith, our traditions, and our commitment to a just and compassionate world? May this Passover bring you and your loved ones joy, connection, and a renewed sense of purpose.

Weekend Topic: Authentic Connection with Ourselves and with Those We Love

How can we better understand ourselves; make ourselves known to the people we love, deepen and uplift our relationships, and heal what may be broken between us? Over this scholar-in-residence weekend, Rabbi Elana Zaiman will guide us on a journey of authentic connection with ourselves and with those we love.

Authentic Connection with Ourselves and One Another Friday, April 25 After Dinner Text Study

In our world today, we seem less able to give each other the benefit of the doubt or as our tradition puts it *dan l'kaf zechut*. We dismiss one another, judge one another, make assumptions about who the other is and how the other shows up. Can we shift these tendencies to more deeply connect with each other's humanity? We will turn to texts and stories from our tradition to offer guidance.

Saturday Morning Sermon: The Transformational Power of Forever Letters Saturday, April 26

Rabbi Zaiman will be our guide on a storytelling journey into forever letters—what they are, why write them, and how they can be powerful tools to authentically connect us with ourselves and with the people we love.

Forever Letter Text Study and Writing Workshop Sunday, April 27 • 10:00 AM - 1:00 PM

Emotional and spiritual connection is at the core of this workshop. Rabbi Zaiman facilitates a writing process and an interactive experience that encourages self-reflection, and a deepening, healing, and uplifting of our relationships. You don't have to be a writer to get something out of this workshop. You don't have to love writing. You don't even have to know to whom you will write. The only requirement: show up and be yourself. In this workshop, we will look at excerpts of letters from medieval and modern times as templates for the forever letters we will begin to write. We will talk about tone, content, and how to write to be heard. We will write to prompts to reflect on ourselves, the people we love, and our shared relationships. Feel free to bring a special notebook and pen or your laptop. Our time together will fly by. Ages 12 and up.

Bio:

Elana Zaiman loves connecting with people. In her book, The Forever Letter, she encourages us to deepen, heal, and uplift our relationships with the people who matter to us most. Elana is the first woman rabbi from a family spanning six generations of rabbis. She serves as an inspirational speaker, a scholar-in-residence, and a workshop facilitator to audiences throughout North America. She's a chaplain at a retirement community in Seattle; a certified Wise Aging instructor (IJS), and adjunct faculty at a local Seattle hospital's CPE Program. For ten years she served as the Ethics and Spirituality columnist for LivFun, a publication for Leisure Care retirement facilities in 10 states. She has also been published in The Gettysburg Review, The Sun, Post Road, American Letters & Commentary, and elsewhere. Close to her heart is the Seattle Limbe Sewing Circle, which as a co-partner, Elana helped to expand beyond the walls of the First African Methodist Episcopal Church in Seattle. The Seattle Limbe Sewing Circle is an intergenerational and interracial community which brings together Jews, Muslims, and Christians to create feminine hygiene kits for girls in Cameroon, Africa. Barnabie Point Project

The Barnabie Point Project continues to move forward with several major developments:

- 80% of the capital campaign goal has been reached. Achieving 80% of the goal at such an early stage of a capital project is very unusual, reinforcing the strong commitment from our Jewish Community. Reaching this milestone also allows us to start "digging," something we promised from the beginning of the campaign.
- 2. Camp Solomon Schechter has signed a letter of intent to rent space for its headquarters in the new building on Barnabie Point. This is a major milestone for several reasons: (a) attracting and getting that first organization to commit is usually the biggest challenge, (b) having a lead tenant makes the project real to others ... encouraging additional organizations to take that next step, and (c) finalizing that first tenant inspires HNT to get all agreements, pricing, etc. together well ahead of time. Rentals are of critical importance to HNT because they generate additional revenue that goes directly to HNT operating funds. Our team is also actively engaged with other Jewish organizations and hopes to have additional signed commitments soon.
- 3. Reenvisioned creative design translates into separate gym and sanctuary spaces. We heard from our constituents and responded; we redesigned the building to create an official gym and a dedicated chapel space. While JDS will be the primary user of the gym during the weekdays and HNT will host services in the chapel area, these are also multipurpose shared spaces which will benefit both organizations as well as some of the other tenants in the building. The chapel will have a horseshoe design around a bimah with a moveable Ark that can fit approximately 125 people and that can easily expand to 200 ... perfect for b'nai mitzvot and other events.

A big thank you to the large team of volunteers and professionals that have been and continue to be working on the many facets of this enormous effort.

A Message from Director of Education **Irit Eliav Levin**



I n just a few short days, Jews around the world will gather together to celebrate Pesach. We will tell the story of our people's Exodus from Egypt, teach the lessons behind the foods on the seder plate, and taste the *maror* to remind us of the bitterness of slavery. As we read through the Haggadah, one of the passages that always resonates with me is the story of the four children. The wise child asks to comprehend the customs and traditions of the seder. The simple child asks to understand the meaning of the rituals being observed. Then there is the child who does not yet know how to ask, but for whom telling the story is still imperative.

You may have noticed that I skipped a child. As a parent and as an educator, I struggle tremendously with the idea of a child being called "wicked." It is certainly a term I have never and would never use when talking about a child. The rabbis labeled the child thus because he chooses to separate himself from the story of the Israelites, claiming that this central narrative of our people is irrelevant and meaningless to him. The rabbis are angry at his indifference, and in their inability to comprehend his actions, they label him as wicked.

My heart goes out to this child, and to the thousands like him who are labeled as problem children because they don't understand or can't relate to the lesson being taught. It is precisely those children who need a little extra support that we are most obligated to help. At FRS, we have many children who might learn or think a little differently than their peers. We have other students who started school later and are therefore trying to catch up on Hebrew and T'filot skills. Some students are simply tired after a busy week of school, sports, and activities, and find it challenging to focus when they are in additional lessons on Sunday mornings or weekday afternoons.

Thankfully, our teachers don't respond by believing the worst about our students. Instead, they rise to the occasion. They create differentiated lesson plans, design innovative and creative games to help their kids connect. Kathy Packer, our Hebrew and T'fillah Specialist, pulls kids aside to give them additional support to ensure lessons are meeting the needs of each student. Our madrichim also work with kids one on one or in small groups, to help everyone find a path to success.

And sometimes, kids truly need to have additional one on one support to guide them in their FRS learning, as well as through the B'nai Mitzvah process. Thankfully, HNT has established the Rachel Trager Fund, designed to make individual tutoring for students possible. Students can qualify for this fund if they have an Individualized Education Plan or 504 plan at school. Several of our FRS teachers and B'nai Mitzvah tutors are then able to provide the support that the students need to set them up for success. The Rachel Trager Fund helps to offset this additional cost for families.

As you can imagine, the need for this program often easily exceeds the amount of funding available. So I am writing to ask for your support of this essential and worthwhile option for FRS families. If you want to help fulfill the mitzvah of Pesach, of ensuring that we share the story of the Israelites and of the Jewish people with future generations, then this is a powerful and meaningful way in which to do so.
