## A Message from Rabbi Bria Cahana

Where do you find joy? This is the question that animates the month of Adar, the month we find ourselves halfway through. The Talmud famously teaches, “When the month of Adar begins, one increases rejoicing” (Ta’anit 29a), *marbin b’simcha*. This reminds us that simcha requires effort. But what exactly is simcha, and why does it require an entire month of devotion? Communal Jewish life holds the whole gamut of human experience. Yet Adar asks us to lean consciously toward light. As a former congregant and artist, Dr. Louis Touyz, would often say, “In Judaism, we need to cultivate more joy and less oy!”

Today, happiness is its own field of study. Positive psychology fills university classrooms, self-help books overflow the shelves (and kindles!), and we benefit from comforts, longevity, and opportunities that previous generations could scarcely imagine. And yet, if we are honest, we know how quickly “that feeling we associate with joy” can fade when it rests only on consumption or achievement. Long before modern research, our tradition offered textured descriptions of joy that point toward something more enduring.

Hebrew holds many words for joy, revealing its depth and variety. There is *sasson*, an exuberant joy; *gilah*, gladness; *rina*, the sound of song; *ditzah*, a leaping happiness; *alitzah*, jubilation, among others (Pesikta D’Rav Kahana 20:4). Rabbi Jonathan Sacks z”l explained that *simcha* cannot be easily translated, because it describes a joy rooted in relationship. It comes alive most fully in community, in shared celebration, in giving and receiving in ways that deepen connection long after the moment itself has passed. When what we have becomes something we offer, the joy attached to it extends beyond a single experience and becomes woven into our relationships. We can feel the difference between enjoying a favorite meal alone and preparing that same meal to delight others, watching the table fill with conversation and warmth. The warmth and connection that linger — that is the texture of simcha Rabbi Sacks was pointing us toward.

This helps explain why the joy of Adar stretches across the weeks. Simcha of this kind grows through regular participation and generosity. On Purim, every mitzvah reinforces the communal nature of celebration. We gather to hear the Megillah and enjoy the Purim Shpiel. We sit down to a festive meal together. We exchange *mishloach manot* and extend generosity through *matanot la’evyonim*. The day is shaped so that joy moves between us, strengthening our bonds. Purim is in the middle of the month so that we build up to that kind of spirit and carry it beyond the holiday itself.

Pirkei Avot (4:1) adds another dimension to simcha: “Who is wealthy? One who is happy with their portion.” These teachings guide us toward a simcha of gratitude and generosity. When we learn to notice our blessings, we begin to live with a sense of abundance, and from that awareness sharing flows more naturally.

As we continue through Adar, and journey through March, toward the redemptive horizon of Pesach, let the work of this month be to practice both movements of simcha each day: to pause each day and name something we are grateful for so we feel the abundance around us, and to let that gratitude spill over into how we show up for one another. In doing so, we cultivate a simcha that is steady and relational, one that lingers long after any single moment and strengthens our beautiful HNT community.

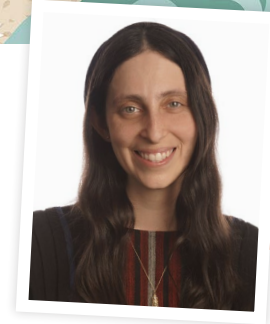
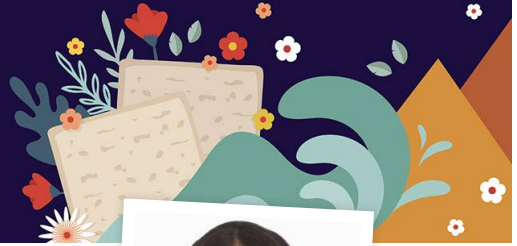

As we prepare for Passover, a lot is on our minds. One of the main laws from the Torah is not owning hametz (leavened products) during the festival. In addition to cleaning our homes and disposing of hametz when possible, Jewish law provides an interesting formal process to sell any remaining hametz for the duration of Passover. We also encourage you to review the updated Passover Guide prepared by the Rabbinical Assembly, which provides guidance for maintaining a kosher-for-Passover home in accordance with Conservative Jewish practice.

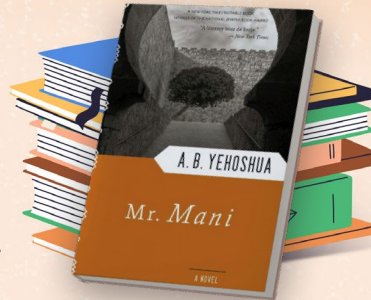

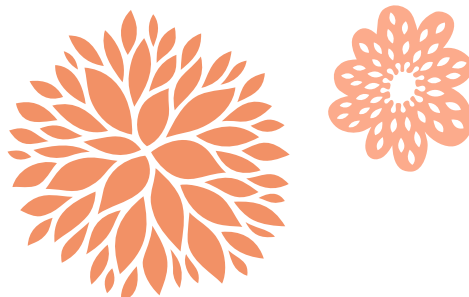

## Cantor's Playlist - March

### Four Questions, Many Melodies

Many years ago during my cantorial studies in Jerusalem, a classmate and I were invited to visit Heichal Shlomo for a tour of the Jewish Music Research Center. The center's mission was to collect the musical traditions of the various *aidot* (international Jewish communities) as they arrived in Israel and assimilated into mainstream Israeli culture. As successive waves of immigrants arrived the center recorded and documented their rich musical heritage – songs and melodies that melded Jewish traditions with the musical techniques and instrumentation of their diaspora surroundings.

But the most memorable part of our visit, was a riddle that its director posed to us. He explained that across all *aidot* there is one place in the liturgy where the traditional chant is lost immediately upon making *aliyah*. “Can you guess what it is?” We were stumped – given the huge variety of musical traditions across *aidot*, how could it be that they would all lose their melodies for the same text? “The four questions of the Pesach Haggadah!”

Of course! Since it is traditionally the youngest in the family who recites the four questions they were the ones least likely to have experienced the diaspora practice. Moreover, in 1936 a Russian *oleh* by the name of Ephraim Abileah composed an oratorio that included a setting of *Ma Nishtana* so catchy that by the mid 1940's it had become a staple of Israeli kindergarten education. So all the young children of new *olim* learned it – and you probably learned it too!

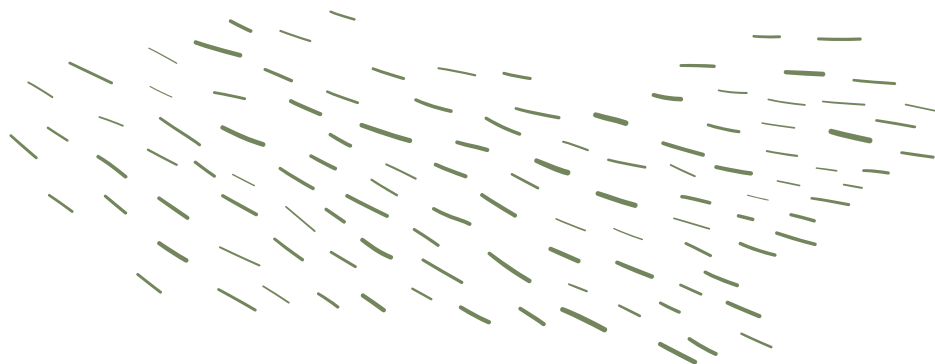

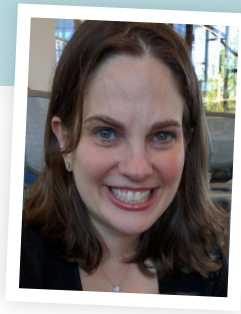

# A Message from Director of Education Irit Eliav Levin



*“The world endures only for the breath of school children”*  
- Tractate Shabbat 119a

Something magical happens when a room full of children begin learning and exploring. When we build a safe and loving space, with trusted adults to guide them, children create worlds beyond what we ever could have imagined. A great example has been happening this year in our Kitah Alef class.

Early in the year, their teacher, Morah Stephanie, helped the kids create a Mitzvah Tree. She wanted a tool for students to be able to share a special mitzvah they've fulfilled that week. They might have helped a sibling, said thank you, fed a pet, given tzedakah, or lit Shabbat candles. As they shared their mitzvot, Morah Stephanie would add a leaf, fruit, or flower to the tree, helping it grow and become more beautiful each week. The tree would provide a powerful visual reminder of all the ways that these first graders were working together towards tikkun olam, repairing the world.

Then, the students added their own special twist to the project. They decided that the tree needed animals living in it! We soon purchased a stuffed chipmunk and a squirrel. A heated debate ensued amongst the kids regarding what we should name these class stuffies. The kids eventually decided on Peanut for the chipmunk and Chicken Jockey, or CJ, for the squirrel.

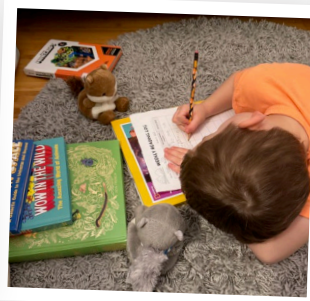
The kids now take turns taking Peanut and Chicken Jockey home each week. They share the adventures they have at each home, celebrating Shabbat, visiting

schools, and becoming a temporary part of each of their families. And the children's imaginations took over!

One student took it upon themselves to work on potty training our two furry pets. Another built an elaborate apartment for each of the pets and decided to teach them how to properly use utensils. Another student felt certain that the two stuffies would do an amazing job helping with their homework. One boy introduced the stuffies to his pets, brought them to cheer him on in his basketball game, and then fed them half a loaf of challah!

What started as one project (the Mitzvah Tree), became a cherished ritual allowing our students to bring a little of FRS home with them. It also provided a tool to help them share a little more about their home lives with their friends at HNT. And even though they are just stuffies, Peanut and Chicken Jockey have become ways for the students to understand that Judaism follows them everywhere that they go, that it is a huge part of what makes them unique. And what a joyful and fun way to get to learn that lesson! May we always be the kind of school that encourages the magic of a child's imagination!

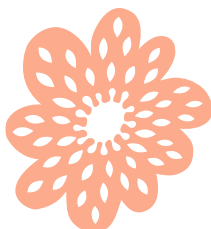

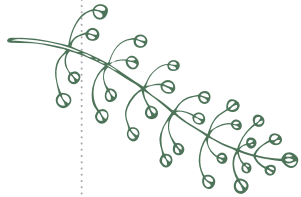
## J-Serve

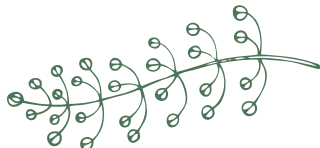
## TORAH CORPS
