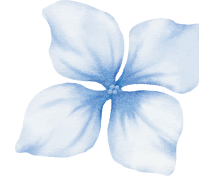

A Message from David Shujman



As we close another fiscal year at HNT, I've spent a lot of time reflecting on where we've been, where we are, and where we're headed together as a community. This year was not easy.

We made difficult decisions, experienced transition, change, uncertainty, and moments where we simply had to navigate hard things without perfect answers. We said goodbye to people we care about, welcomed new faces into leadership, and wrestled with the realities of balancing tradition, growth, financial responsibility, and the long term future of our congregation.

At the same time, I'm incredibly proud to share that we are going into the next fiscal year with a balanced budget. In today's environment, especially for synagogues and Jewish organizations across the country, that is not something we take lightly. It reflects hard work, discipline, generosity, sacrifice, and a willingness by many people behind the scenes to make difficult but necessary choices. A balanced budget is not the finish line, it is the foundation.

We still face significant challenges ahead, especially around security, rising operational costs, and ensuring that HNT remains strong not just for today, but for the next generation. Security alone has fundamentally changed what it means to operate a Jewish institution in America. The costs are real, the responsibilities are real, and the need is not optional.

At the same time, we also have something incredibly important right now, the stability and strength in our clergy leadership.

Rabbi Cahana and Cantor Batchelor continue to guide this community with thoughtfulness, compassion, vision, and authenticity. In a time when many congregations are struggling with uncertainty and transition, we are fortunate to have leaders who care deeply about our people, our traditions, and our future. Their leadership gives me tremendous confidence in where HNT is headed.

We also continue to deepen our partnership with JDS, which I believe is critical to the future of Jewish life in our region. Strong Jewish institutions do not compete with one another. They strengthen one another. That partnership, along with the continued growth and

investment required in our religious school and youth programming, is how we build the next generation of Jewish leaders, families, and engaged community members.

After years of planning, partnership, persistence, and countless hours from people across this community, we have broken ground on what I truly believe will become the Jewish hub for Greater Seattle. Not just a building project, but a statement about who we are, what we believe in, and our commitment to Jewish continuity for generations to come.

As I've mentioned in a couple of my notes, the Talmud teaches, "Kol Yisrael arevim zeh bazeh" (all of Israel is responsible for one another), that idea feels especially important right now and as we move forward together.

This cannot fall on a small group of people. The future of HNT requires all of us. It requires participation, leadership, generosity, patience, ideas, volunteerism, and buy in from people who believe this community is worth building together.

I believe our best days are still ahead of us. Waiting is a risk. Hoping someone else will step up is a risk. Assuming the future will simply take care of itself is a risk. The future of this community depends on people deciding that now is the time to act, to give, to volunteer, to lead, to show up, to help build something bigger than themselves. That is how strong Jewish communities survive and how they grow. If each one of us steps up, HNT will continue to thrive for generations to come.

On behalf of the board and leadership of HNT, thank you for your support, your trust, your patience, and your commitment to this community. Thank you for standing with us through a year that challenged us, stretched us, and ultimately strengthened us.

We have work to do, but we also have momentum, heart, strong leadership, and an extraordinary community worth fighting for.

I'm excited for the year ahead.

Brandon Holan



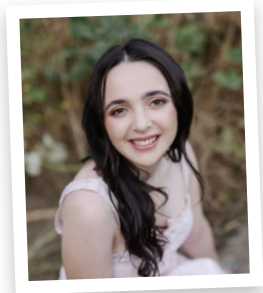

Millstone is a National Honors Program for post B'nai Mitzvah 7th and 8th graders to study the foundational ideas, great leaders, and key texts of Jewish civilization. This class meets weekly at HNT on Tuesday evenings during the school year and is taught by Jeffrey Dean. 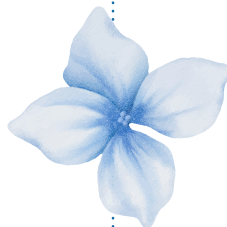

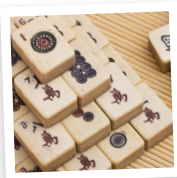

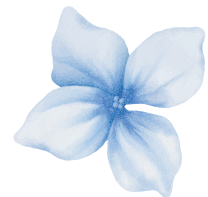

Ritual Corner: The Voices Behind Services

You know that sense of rightness during Shabbat services — that feeling lives in our siddur, our Torah, our clergy, and most of all in the voices and physical presence of the people who fill our sanctuary. The Ritual Committee works to nurture and protect that feeling.

Our committee serves as a true collaborative partner to Rabbi Cahana and Cantor Batchelor, working together to shape the texture of Jewish life at Herzl-Ner Tamid. We're the people who work through thoughtful questions: How do we make sure that a congregant marking a yahrzeit or a family milestone feels genuinely honored and welcomed to the bimah? Should we bring back a quarterly Minyanaires service to add more ruach and draw in members who don't regularly attend? How do we build and sustain a pipeline of Torah and haftarah readers so that the bimah is never empty and our tradition keeps flowing forward?

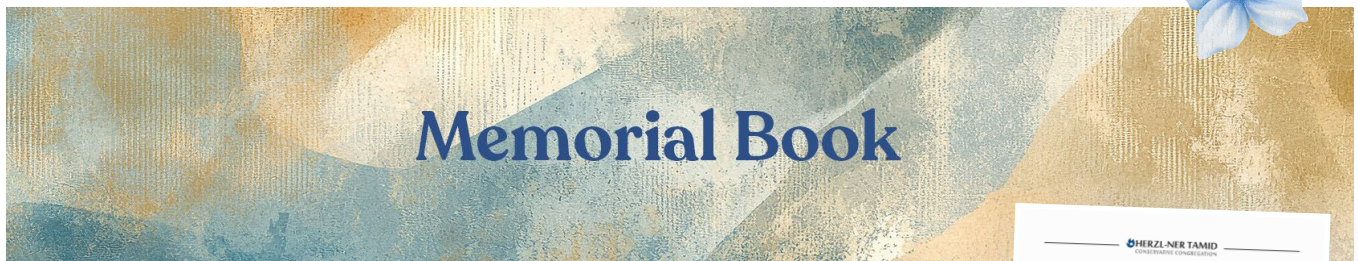
These conversations are meaningful, and they're also very manageable. The committee meets just once a month, and each meeting begins with a Halachic moment from the

Rabbi — a chance to learn together before we get to work.

Beyond the monthly meeting, you'll find yourself in conversations that are equal parts grounded in Halacha and practical. We discuss topics that have animated Jewish communities for centuries and then figure out how to make the answer work for ours specifically.

We're especially hoping to hear from members who are raising or living alongside the next generation of Jewish adults. The topics this committee discusses, what our services feel like, which traditions we preserve, how we welcome people onto the bimah, are the decisions that will shape what Jewish life looks like for the next generation of Herzl-Ner Tamid.
